## NEWS ITEM

VATICAN CITY, Nov 11 (REUTERS)—The Vatican, asked by Pope John Paul to rehabilitate Galileo Galilei, the Italian astronomer forced by the Inquisition in 1633 to recant his discovery that the Earth rotates around the sun, will study the case, not hold a new trial.

Monsignor Bernard Jacqueline, the French under secretary of the Secretariat for Non-Believers, told Vatican Radio the proposed study was in conformity with the Pope's wish expressed exactly a year ago that Galileo should be rehabilitated.

"It is wrong to speak of re-opening the trial of Galileo," Monsignor Jacqueline said, "The Secretariat for Non-Believers is not a tribunal, but a center for studies. In any case, Galileo can obviously not be called, so there will be no sittings, either open or secret."
