My suggestion was, and I repeat again, that I wanted to organise a small, dedicated group of people who would playtest, criticise and eventually modify new Diplomacy variants. As the nature of playtesting can be very unpredictable - the game could re-start after correcting basic flaws; etc it is preferable to run it out-of-zine. Eventually, articles could be published reporting the results of such playtesting.

Sangria Football League

The 12th and 13th match days of the championship were not exactly ecstatic. Practically all the teams have kept their position in the table. There were one or two surprises as well as the big matches. Even if the number of red and yellow cards were less (only 4 players suspended) the 'hard' game was still present and has resulted in 6 players being injured. HUFC will have to continue with 4 players less whilst DRL, LL and LRR will have 2 players less. Lets move on to the match reports.

IFK Linköping - FC Carbonnade

Contrary to what one would believe from the score (see the scores in the table further on) the match was evenly balanced from one end to the other. It was the superb performance by the visitors goalie which tipped the score in his teams favour. On a number of occasions Linköping should have claimed a point but their goalkeeper was not as good as his counterpart.

Red Storm Partizan - Dreams Never End

A small disappointment for the trainer of Dreams Never End. His players couldn't do anything against the newly trained players of his brother. The visitors tactics were well thwarted by the local players. Even if the result is logical the score was a little forced.

Les Leaders - Les Rouquins Rouges

This match progressed in a crazy, crazy rhythm. Several times the visitors were leading but shortly afterwards Les Rouquins Rouges managed to equalise. Les Leaders had practically twice as many attacking moves as their opponents but the luck of the visitors goalie and the inefficiency of the local forwards stopped Les Leaders from winning. The excellent trainer, of Les Leaders, cannot understand what has happened to his team. In actual fact his team is one of the strongest in the championship but his team does not feature in the top of the table. For the Rouquins Rouges they did well by getting a point. Contrefilet, one of the Leaders' players fell on the stairs leading to the changing rooms. His injury makes him unavailable for the next match. Another hard blow for Jean-Louis.

Headbangers United FC - JRTMUS

No second miracle for the Headbangers against JRTMUS. The score was higher - logical as a result of the number of chances. However, it has to be said, regrettably that the game by the visitors was very aggressive. They received 3 yellow cards and managed to injure one of the Headbangers forward's.

De Roude Liew - RSC Les Shooteurs

The top match against Les Shooteurs, comfortably placed at the head of the table, and Roude Liew in constant advancement held all its promise. The spectators experienced great, rediscovered football, despite the aggressivity of certain local players. It was this that provoked the turning point of the match. All had started well for the visitors who scored a goal after 15 minutes of the match by Boktu. The equalizer followed just before half-time by a miraculous shot from Müller metres. The domination by the Shooters solidified in the 70th minute by an intercepted volley 15 metres from Flashdin. Müller equalised 3 minutes later by passing through the visitors defense thanks to two very good one-two's with Block. There were only 7 minutes left when Requir accidently touched the ball with his hand in the penalty area. The referee blew for a penalty which caused great consternation of the Roude Liew supporters. Bradoneur misfooted the goalkeeper but the shot hit the post. It was during this stoppage that the incident occurred. Tourbillon was moving towards the goal after having successfully dribbled the goalkeeper when Paresseux violently mowed him down. The two players were carried of on stretchers. Bradoneur then victoriously converted the penalty and gave his team a precious victory. For the wounded Tourbillon has only light concussion but Paresseux will not be available for 2 matches. Apart from this incident it was a superb match.

Dreams Never End - IFK Linköping

A walkover for Dreams Never End against an unorganised and badly demoralised Linköping. Linköping didn't create any openings and the visitors were satisfied with the default score.

RSC Les Shooteurs - Red Storm Partizan

A top of the table second match for Les Shooteurs against Red Storm Partizan. The match progressed with a serene air and the local team assured their domination: the first half ended with the score at 5-0. Les Shooteurs relaxed a little in the second half but they were never under any threat. The final score was 8-2. The spectators enjoyed a high quality match but with no excitement.

FC Carbonnade - Les Leaders

What with Les Leaders leading 4-1 at half-time one would have thought that the match was over but nothing could have been further from the truth. In less than 20 minutes the local forwards scored 4 goals and it must be underlined that none of them resulted from free kicks. Les Leaders tried to save the situation and succeeded in the 85th minute thanks to Sado who headed the ball from a centre created by the talented Johnson. However, it wasn't over. We tati received a yellow card for a foul on Sauron (he will still be injured for the next match). In the remaining time for stoppages Crocodile passed the visitors defense to hit a lob against the unfortunate keeper Contrefilet who fetched the ball out of the back of the net for the sixth time. In a furious rage the Leaders' trainer insulted the referee in a loud voice for having allowed too much time for the stoppages. The federation have taken the following action: Les Leaders' trainer must watch the next three matches from the stands. For the trainer of FC Carbonnade, he was very pleased with his team's two consecutive victories.

Les Rouquins Rouges - Headbangers United FC

The forwards of Les Rouquins Rouges were able to consolidate their position in the goalscorer's table thanks to a day of open goals organised by the Headbangers. McKenzie, McKimon and McLyd fully enjoyed themselves in this one-way match. However, not everything ran smoothly as Trust was sent off after badly tackling Lézard (injured for one match). Donovan had even less chance as he was sandwiched by Sabbath and Osbourne. The two aggressors received yellow cards and Donovan was carried off on a stretcher (unavailable for 3 matches). The Headbangers managed to score twice by converting two stupid passes by the local defenders.

JRTMUS - De Roude Liew

Another crazy match for JRTMUS against Roude Liew. The visitors fully profited from their chances whilst JRTMUS played with their luck by botching up on innumerable occasions. As well as the total inefficiency of the local forwards, it must be emphasized the scandalous manner in which the defence practised their martial arts rather than football. Result: 4 yellow cards and as many free kicks. On the other hand, Petitpont wanted to try his hand as well but ended up being sent off. A match with an illogical score and where both teams demonstrated their violent character. A match to be forgotten as soon as possible.

I will also take the opportunity to thank those people who voted for Dipsomania which came in at 27th.

Considering it's a first time for Xavier it has been well done considering the effort that must have been put in. However, it is very easy to criticise the results, hopefully Xavier will take note and try to improve on his efforts the next time. I believe the scoring system will be changed for a preference matrix system the next time.

In Dipsomania-14, I published a 11 player variant "Peace in Our Time" by Paul Slade. There are 6 so far on the waiting list and will be arbitrated by Paul. This variant is similar to Mercator which is why I have published the following article written by Stuart Dagger. I would like to send a copy of this magazine to Stuart but I don't have his address - can anyone help out? It was previously published by Brendhan Whyte in his zine "Damn the Consequences", N.22 in December 1990.

Mercator: Hints for Beginners Part One - Strategy.

by Stuart Dagger

When you first look at the rules of Mercator your reaction is likely to be that the game seems more tactically complex than Regular Diplomacy. It is, but that is not where the main skill lies. The most successful Mercator players are those whose main strengths are in the areas of strategy, psychology and diplomacy.

For tactics a basic competence is enough. Those of you who do not already have a copy of Steve Jones's set of articles on opening strategy in Mark 14 should get a copy, even if it is not Mark 14 that you are proposing to play, as the most valuable things that he has to say apply to all the marks. When discussing the opening moves for each country, his primary concern is where such and such a line is going to leave the country two or three moves hence. And that is what I mean by strategic planning. Mercator is not a game which you can play on a "one season at a time" basis. There are several experienced, tactically first rate players who ignore this and try, and they rarely, if ever, come close to winning. The game will not go your way unless you know which way it is that you want it to go, and that necessitates a plan. The plan must be flexible, and it must be realistic, but above all it must be there.

Mercator is a faster moving and, despite its size, a shorter game than Regular. Because of this you should approach it as athletes do a middle distance track race. You don't want to be exposed in front, but you must keep up with the leaders. If you lose touch, you will find it very difficult to get back: those in front of you will be moving too quickly.

Remember also that the victory criteria at Mercator are radically different from those of Regular and most variants. There the aim is dominance over the rest combined; here it is simply aggrandizement to one of several targets, all of which, in terms of the total number of supply centres on the board, are quite low. So, when formulating your plans, remember where you want to be in the early stages and where the finishing post

is. Run the game forward in your mind and try to picture how it is likely to develop. Then figure out who you need to be talking to and about what.

Having formulated your strategic plan, you are going to need the cooperation of other players to make it work, and this is where psychology and diplomacy are important. The first is just the use of common sense to realise what it is you need to do to make people favourably disposed towards you. Begin by asking what it is about those players you are favourably disposed towards what you like. The chances are that it is the fact they communicate regularly, that they reply promptly to your letters, that they don't try to order your pieces for you, and that they are prepared to look at the position from your point of view as well as from their own. If it works for them, there is a fair chance that it will work for you. So do it. Observe too that you are more likely to do a favour for someone with whom you have been on good terms for some time than for someone whose first contact with you comes when he is in trouble. So build your diplomatic bridges early.

And that brings me to diplomacy, the necessity for which is obvious. The speed at which the game moves, together with the large number of players, means that you have to be constantly active on the diplomatic front and also that you must cast your net wide. If you don't you won't be able to keep on top of all that is going on. At Regular, detailed discussions with your favourite neighbour are often enough; not so at Mercator. It won't seem like this for the first couple of moves, as the relative abundance of neutral supply centres means that most players are looking for a quiet start; but if by the second build period you aren't conscious of working hard, you aren't doing enough. The main element in determining whose strategic plans win out, and who is on the inside when a consortium declares an alliance win, is diplomatic control, and to achieve that you need to talk, and to keep talking to a lot of people.

The point about the relative abundance of neutral supply centres and the effect of this on the first couple of seasons is important and one you need to understand if you are to get off to a solid start. At Regular, 22 units chase 12 neutrals in the opening two moves; at Definitive Mercator, it is 61 chasing 47; while at Mark 14, it is 97 chasing 80. The difference in ratios is significant: at Regular the initial neutrals are a scarce resource; at Mercator they aren't. That being so, the case for making an early decision on whom to attack is weak. Most people will be keeping their options open until after March builds, and the prudent course is for you to do the same.

To see why, consider what would happen if you were to launch an immediate assault on a neighbour. It is unlikely that you would catch him completely defenceless, and so you would need to fight for any gains that you might make. As a result, units that you could be both have been using to pick up neutrals will be otherwise engaged, and those neutrals will go unclaimed. At least, they will be unclaimed by you. The other countries in the region will not leave them on ice, waiting until you are ready; they will move in. They end up stronger, and you and your adversary weaker, than would otherwise have been the case. Then, after the March builds, when these neighbouring sharks start looking round for victims, what do they see but the two of you, weakened, committed and already bleeding?

inevitable that the first April will be a time for choosing targets, and so the aim of your opening strategy must be to reach this point not looking like a victim. To do this you must have as many units on the board as you can manage without causing alarm and without having exposed your back unnecessarily in getting them. Being too cautious on these first moves is as big an error as being too aggressive. Cover the obvious sucker punches, but otherwise go for all you can reasonably get. Rely on diplomacy to keep the peace with your neighbours and to ensure that the regional share out is acceptable to you all. Aim to go into April negotiations on as good terms as can be managed with as many of your neighbours as possible. If you allow any needle to creep in prematurely, you will be handling a very strong diplomatic card to possible hostile third parties.

Prize-Winning, Variant Competition

This is crazy of me to start yet another game in Dipsomania, which will be named after the cocktail "Za-Za", but it seemed a good idea at the time and an ideal opportunity for everyone, including myself, to have some fun with a (not too serious) new variant. All of the "active players" in Dipsomania plus a few others will have received a personal invitation in this issue to participate in this variant. If you have not received such an invitation don't worry! Perhaps I didn't think you would be interested; however, if you are write to me. This variant, which I have called "Terrestrial Chaos", has been influenced by the "Chaos" designed by Michel Feron, variant a famous Belgian hobbyist from the seventies.

My idea is to make the variant as simple as possible for you to play and for me to arbitrate and to have some fun. In other words, this variant will require a minimum of effort to participate, but of course you can always do more!

One of the problems with 'Chaos type' variants is that many players are eliminated after the first supply centre ajustments. In order to overcome this disadvantage I have created the possibility of extra starting positions whereby a few of the initial eliminated players can have another chance.

In order to add a little spice to the game 3 prizes will be awarded consisting of extra subscriptions to Dipsomania (Dips). 6 Dips will be awarded to the player, or shared equally amongst the players, who win according the criterion in the rules. In addition 4 Dips will be awarded to the player or Kibuttzer (non-playing press writers) who has written the most entertaining press and a special prize of 3 Dips will be awarded to the player whose play and conduct has impressed the GM the most. Previously eliminated players who continue to write press will remain eligible for the second prize.

The Dipsomania houserules (printed in Dipsomania-14) will be applied where possible. Standby players are welcome.

Terrestrial Chaos

by Jef Bryant.

- 0. All the rules of Classic Diplomacy (Version 1971) apply except for the modifications below.
- 1. The world has suffered from the greenhouse effect and all the oceans have dried up, which means there are no fleets in this variant. The only unit is an army which can move to any named province on the classic map, including all the sea spaces.

Dipsomania - 15

- 2. The game will be anonymous with press. No black press will be permitted although anonymous press will be allowed.
- 3. The game will start in Winter 1900 when the players press will be published (This season is perhaps the most important of the game!). Movement will start in the following season, Spring 1901.
- 4. The "Spring Raid" rule will be used: A player captures a supply centre by occupying it in a Spring OR Autumn season. Consequently, there will be two build seasons per year in Summer and Winter.
- 5. During the Summer and Winter build seasons a player may build an army in any vacant supply centre he owns.
- .6. The British system of movement will be used; i.e. conditional Summer retreats AND constructions will be sent with Spring orders and conditional Winter retreats and constructions will be sent with Autumn orders. Two sets of orders per game year.
- 7. The 'Automatic Pilot' rule will be used for units which NMR and 'Just's Right Hand' rule will be used for units which have not received a retreat order. The game report will not indicate if a player is NMR. If a player forgets to build an army, one will be automatically built in his starting home province, if possible. If occupied, any other vacant supply centre he has previously captured will be used for the construction chosen in chronological order of capture.
- 8. This variant is (c) May 1992 by Jef Bryant, and can be published only if a copy of the publication be sent to Rue Jean Pauly 121, B-4430 ANS, Belgium. Copies can be distributed freely for postal play and variant banks. Any modification of this variant is prohibited without permission of the designer.
- 9. At the start of the game every player will be designated one starting home supply centre province on a random basis by the GM. This means up to 34 players may be accommodated. Any supply centres not designated will become neutral supply centres. If this occurs the GM may re-arrange the starting supply centres of the players so that a fairer distribution of neutral centres is obtained.
- All the neutral supply centres will contain 'Lebling' units; i.e. an army in civil disorder. This army simply holds in place and cannot retreat. If a superior force is directed at such an army it is removed from the board. Other players can support a Lebling unit in place.

- 10. If a player is eliminated from the game; i.e. by having all his supply centres captured during a Summer or Winter season he may start again by asking the GM for a new starting supply centre as a new player, providing there are still neutral supply centres available.
- 11. Once the game has started, new or previously eliminated players may join in by being given, on a random basis by the GM, a supply centre that hasn't been already captured. If there are no supply centres left the GM will then choose, in a random manner, amongst the following new potential supply centres: Ireland (Ire), Iceland (Ice), Crete (Cre), Cyprus (Cyp), Sicily (Sic), Corsica (Cor), Sardinia (Sar), Switzerland (Swi) and the Caspian Sea (Cas).

Only the selected home supply centre for a new player will become a new passable space on the board, the remaining spaces staying impassable until such time when another new player requires a starting centre.

- 12. A player's country or power uses the name of the initial supply centre he starts or re-starts the game with. In order to avoid confusion on the map each power will also be designated a 2 figure number which will be also mentioned in the game report.
- 13. There are 34 centres at the start of the game with a possible maximum of 43 centres, if all the extra supply centres become activated. Victory criterion will be decided by one of the following possibilities:
 - a) A solo win can be achieved by capturing 17 centres after any Autumn or Spring season.
 - b) A 2-way win can be declared by each of the two players concerned if each has at least 13 centres after any Autumn or Spring season.
 - c) A 3-way win may be declared by each of the three players concerned if each has at least 10 centres after any Autumn or Spring season.
- If 2 players manage to capture 17 supply centres at the same time the game will continue until one has more than the other or a different criterion is reached.

Alternatively, voting for a game-end proposal is also possible after the game year 1905 according to the house rules, if none of the above criterion have been reached.

The new maritime province BUD has caused rum and Tri to become multi-coasted provinces. Please note that there are two new provinces on the board Switzerland (sui) and the Caspian Sea (CAS). The existence of CAS means that Arm and Sev are double coastal provinces.

Rule 1 states "Geophysical events are considered to take place <u>during</u> the season simultaneously with the orders." This poses a problem: Is a unit affected by a geophysical attack in its original or destination province? I have decided for simplicity that the geophysical command takes place <u>just before</u> movement. This means a unit may still escape an affected province by successfully moving away.

Press

Russia - Turkey: Next move, let me turn BLA into land (BLA=>Bla). It will destroy my fleet (your fleet can move to Con) but it will mean we will not waste time needlessly antagonising each other with our fleets. We will be able to work together more easily. You may wish to support this transformation, to ensure that it succeeds.

Russia - Austria: Because we have not been able to communicate before now, I have had to assume the worst, hence my attempted move to Galicia. If I have succeeded, my apologies - I will immediately withdraw. I have no wish to threaten your territory. Russia - Germany: We do not need to fight. I know you can stop me from going to Sweden (in many ways) but I hope you will not. If so, I will owe you a favour in future supports.

Russia - England: Hello. We will have to look out for icebergs, I have heard. Toodle pip!

Anonymous - All: With his new found geomancy the Inquisitor wreaks his anger on the dual monarchy. How dare anyone have 2 Kings, when the rest have 1. Selfish, I call it.

England - Russia: Go Joe!

GM - England: As you may have noticed I didn't publish the rest of your press as this ISN'T a black press game!

Austria - Italy: This is defensive only, don't take this to heart.

Austria - Turkey: Fancy a trip to Moscow station, if you pass GO I'll give you £200.

GM - England and Austria: Suggest you look at the rules concerning Stabilisations again. Any province which receives a STA command will negate one geophysical command ordered for the same province.
