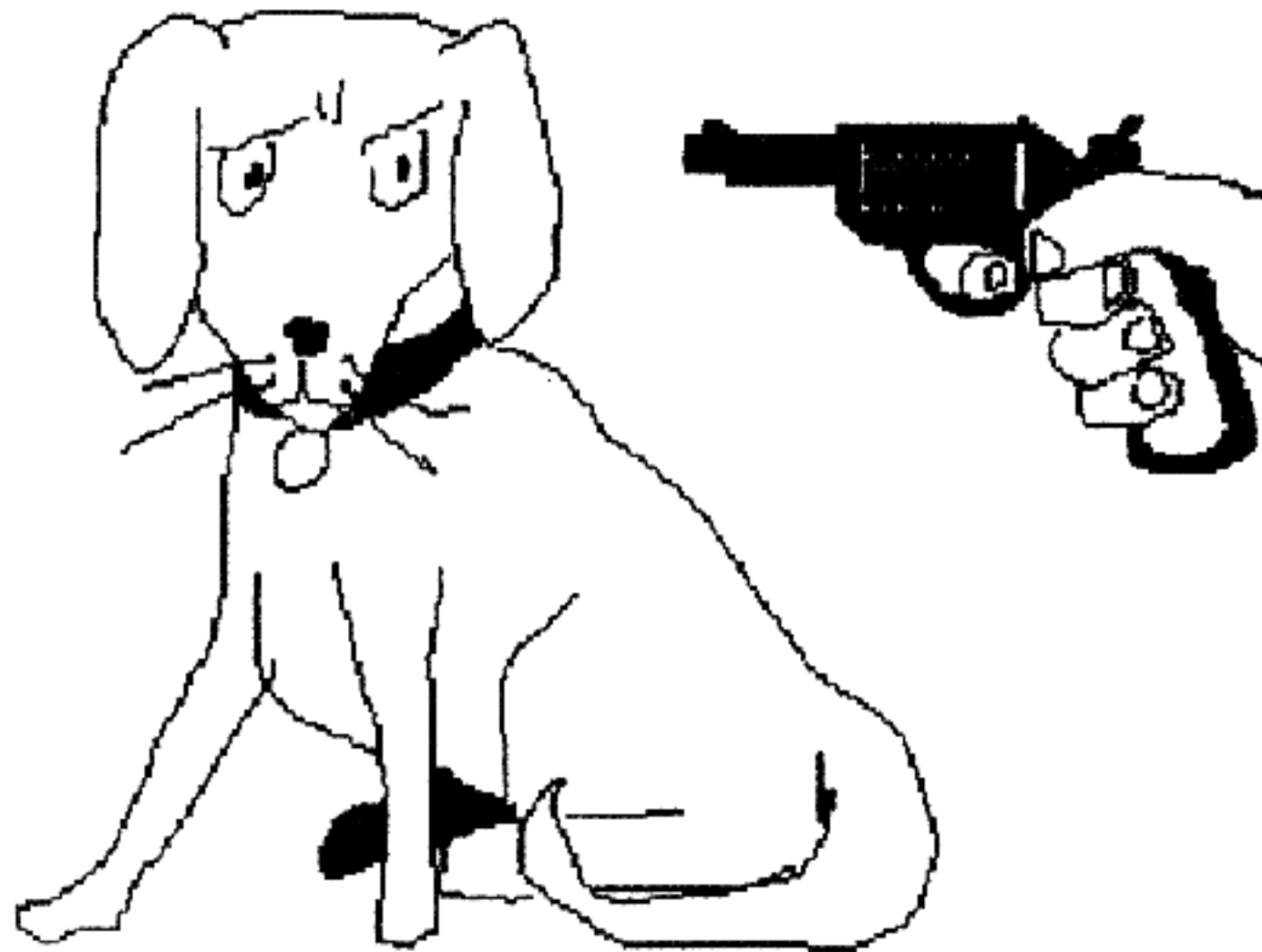

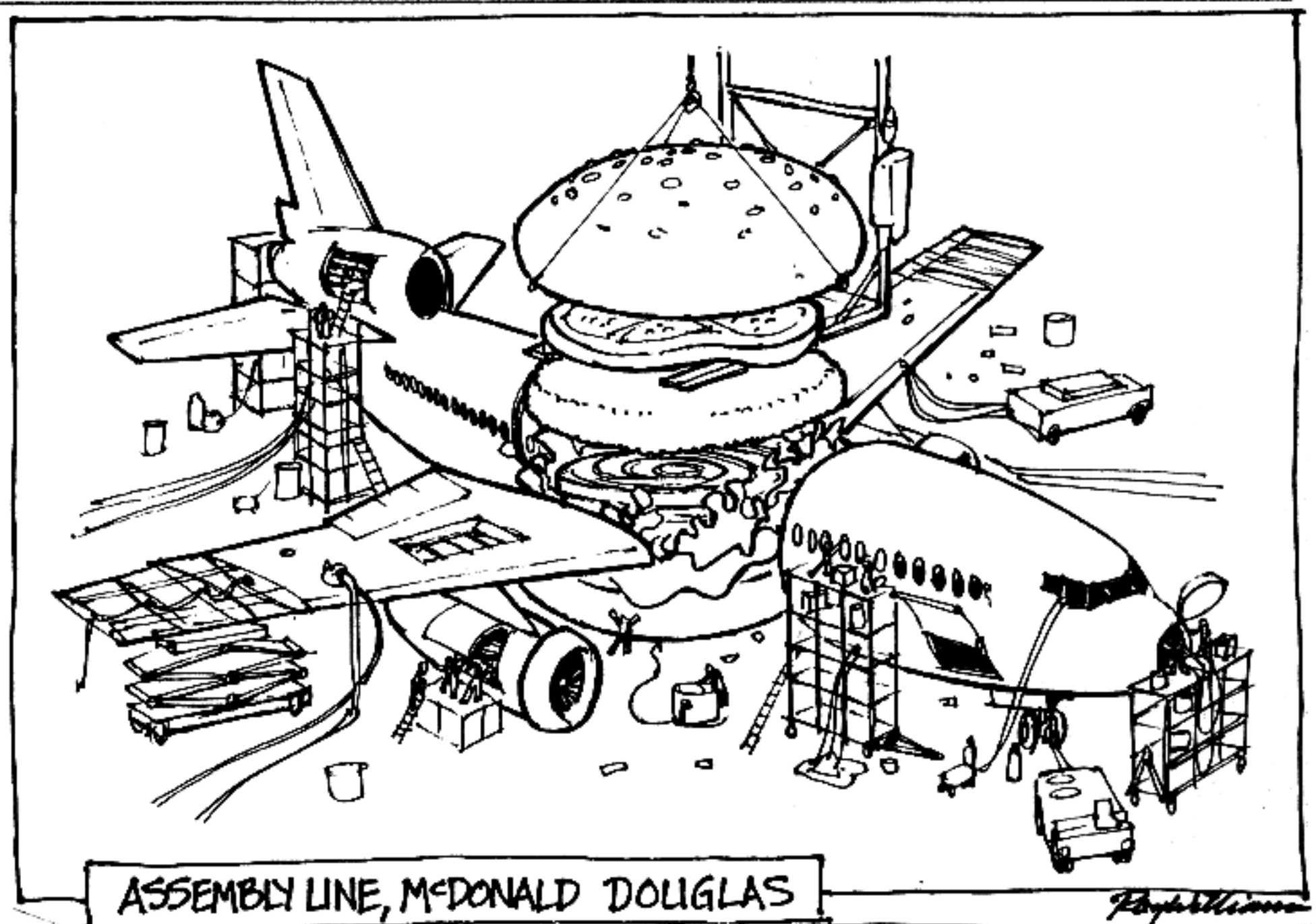

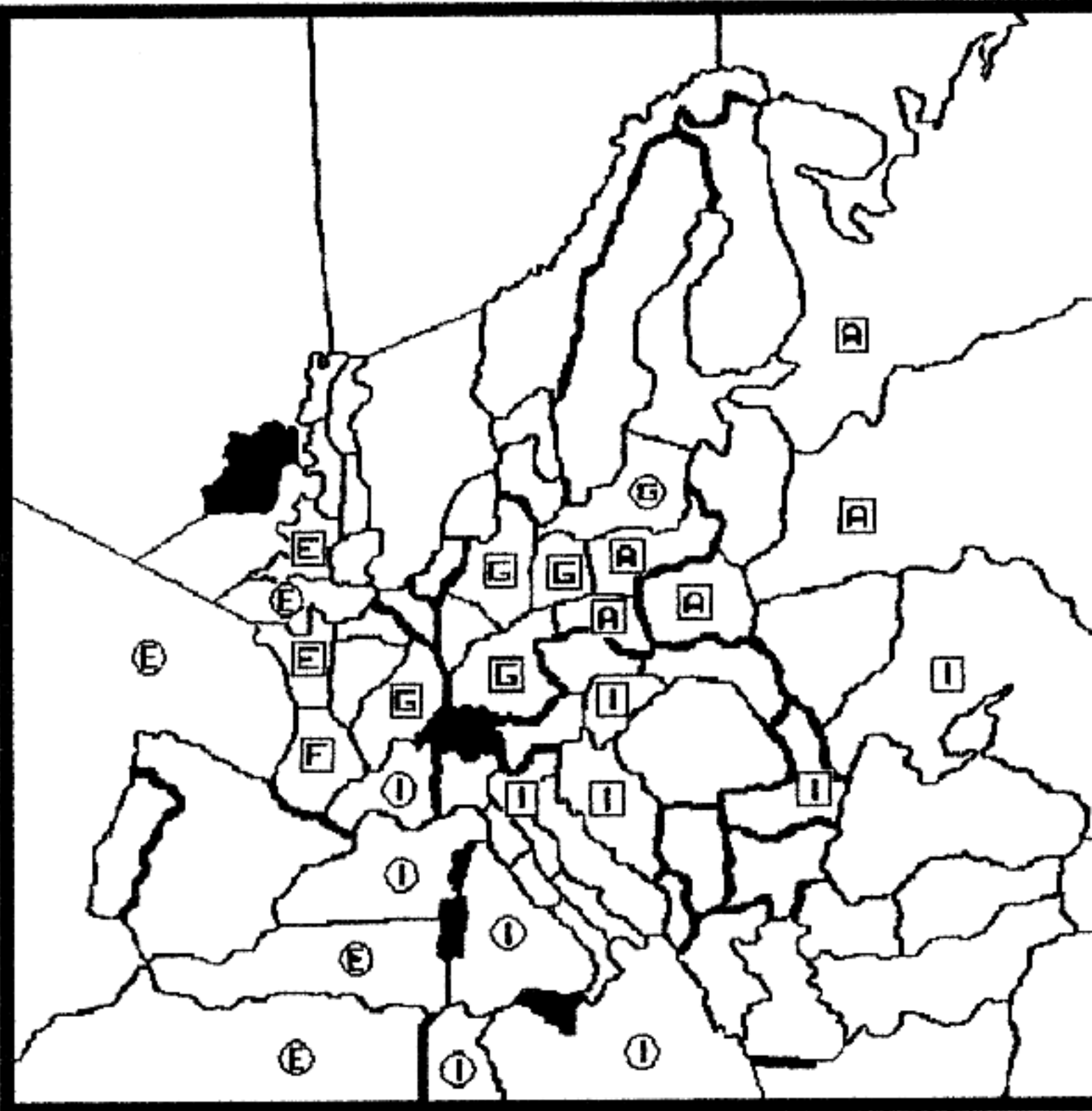
Press:

Finally, *Ed* is now ready to begin. This is a regular game of Diplomacy. The players are;

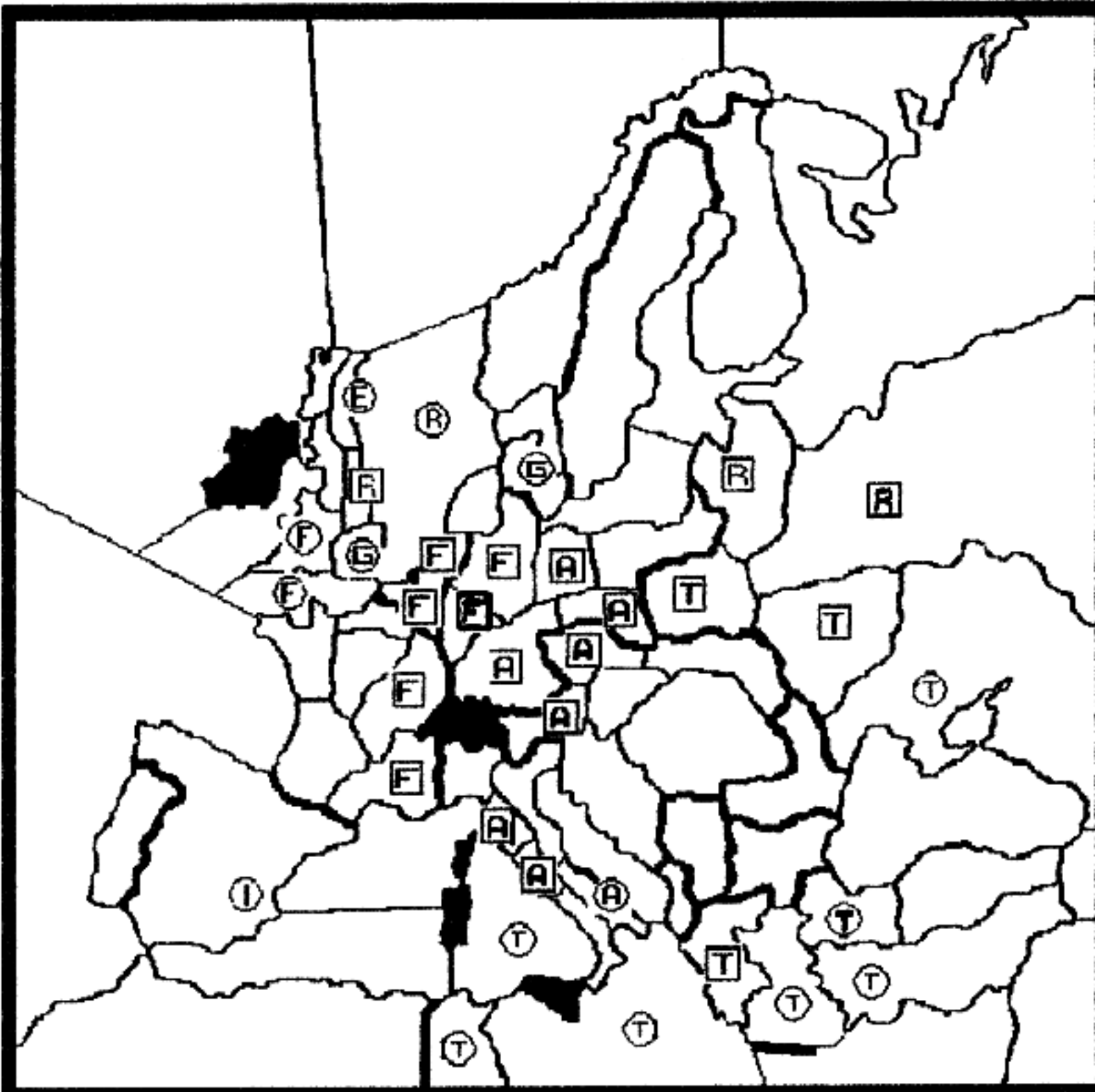

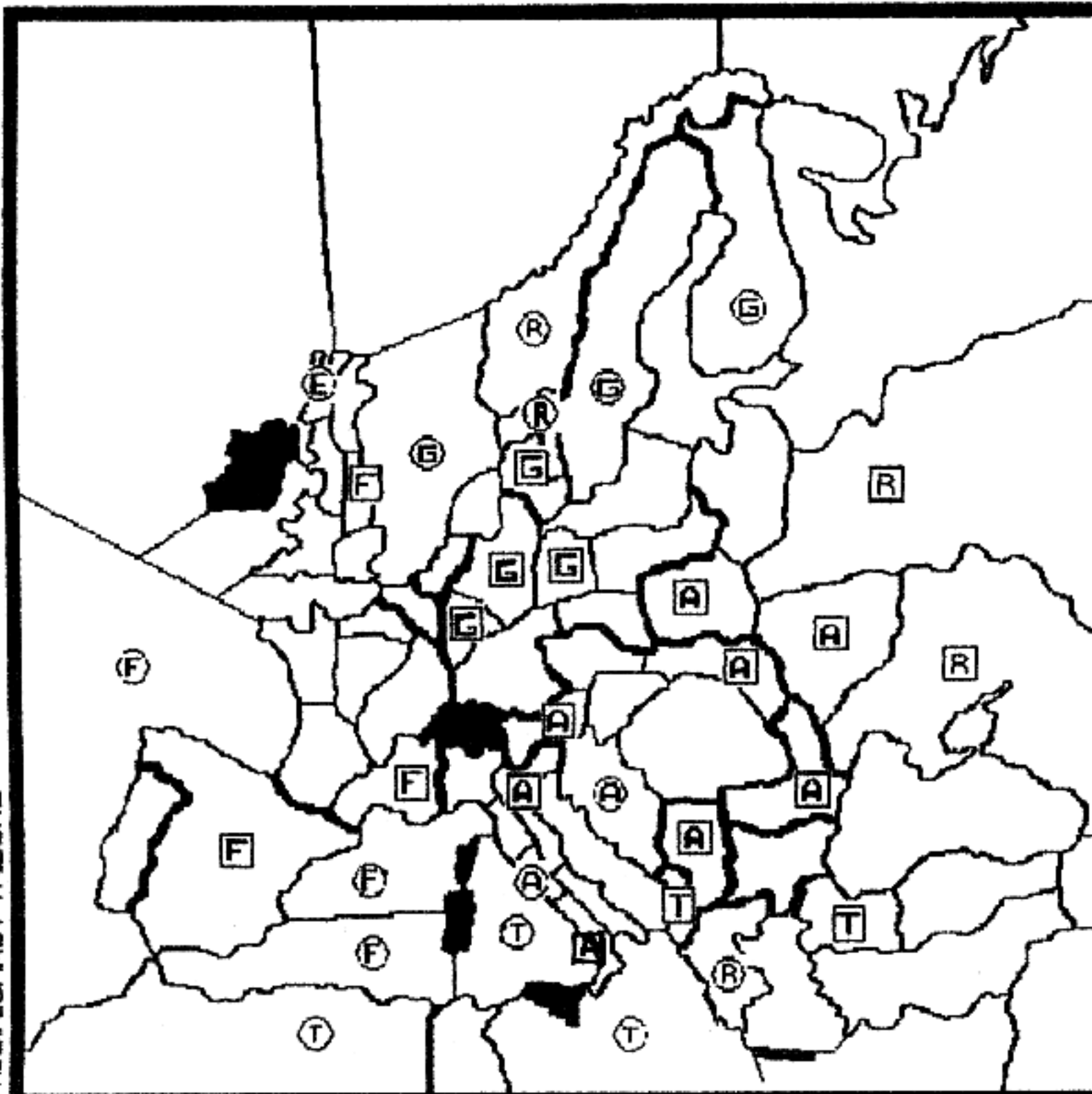

Aus: What was it my cartoon likeness said? "Uh Oh!"

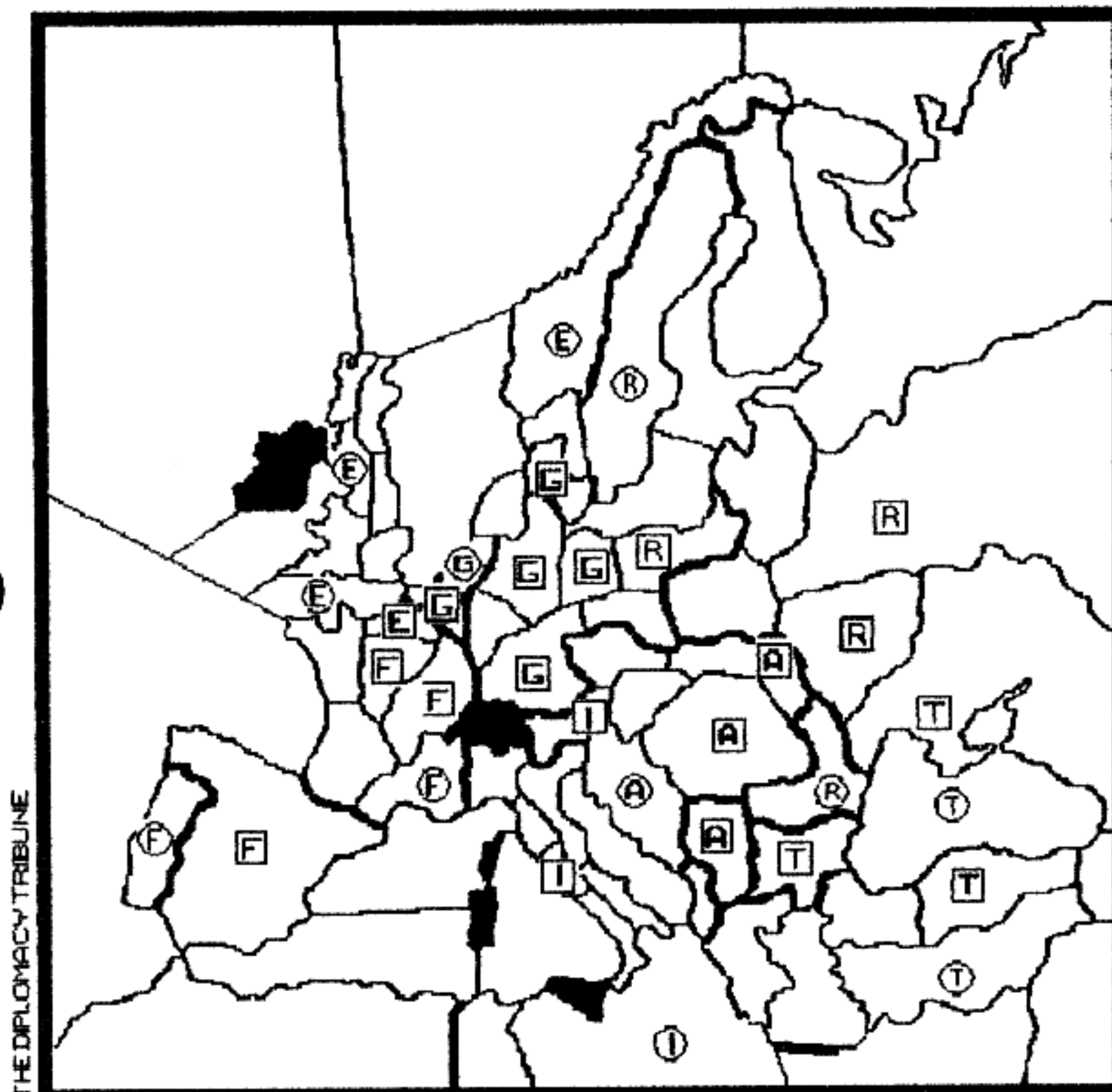

This angle sparked my interest, so, providing I didn't wind up printing an anthology of letters every month, I agreed to try it. The response was amazing-nothing. So maybe you didn't get it the first time. **Write letters and I'll print them!** Get it?

Needed are 2-4 players for a game of *Wooden Ships & Iron Men*. This will be a play-test game to work out any possible bugs in preparation for a large fleet game with 4+ players. Preferably I'd like 4 players so we can hash out methods of communication within teams. You need only have a copy of *Avalon Hill's WS&M* and a current sub to the Trib to play.
