SOME THOUGHTS ON DRAW VOTES S.E. Johnson III

I was just leafing through another Diplomacy rag when I came across a letter from a player complaining about being done out of a game because he missed a draw vote and his abstention was counted as a vote in favor of the proposal. This is a much too common story. Postal Diplomacy games frequently run a couple of years; to have that much work wiped out by a mistake is heartbreaking. I would like to suggest that responsible GMs adopt a strict set of guidelines that would curb the current widespread abuse of draw and concession votes in the hobby.

No game should end until everyone expresses that opinion in writing. A failure to vote should always be counted as a negative vote rather than a positive one. Too many players suggest too many draws hoping that the one player who would vote against the proposal will forget to vote, allowing the draw to pass.

Draw and concession proposals are used more as a form of harassment than for their correct purpose, which is to end the game. Players are forced to vote on several proposals every turn. Some players call for a concession to one player in an alliance in order to cause suspicion among the allies. This wouldn't happen if the person submitting the proposal didn't remain anonymous. Where did that stupid tradition come from? Respectable GMs require all press to be labeled so the author is identified. Why should someone calling for a vote that could end the game (which is therefore more important than press) be granted this veil of secrecy?

All persons submitting a call for a draw or concession should be required to vote in favor of it. This would greatly reduce the number of needless votes quickly, which would reduce the extra work these votes are now causing GMs and players alike.

The suggested guidelines are summarized below. I advise interested players to let their GMs know their feelings on this issue.

- No proposal shall pass unless all remaining players cast a ballot in favor of it.
- II. All persons submitting proposals to be voted on must be identified.
 III. A person submitting a proposal is considered to be voting in favor of the proposal.

((I agree strongly with your first guideline. I forgot to vote on a draw once and it cost me a chance for a good fight when my "no vote received" was counted as a "yes" and the game ended. On the other hand, I picked up a two way draw I didn't deserve because somebody forgot to vote. The reason I count an NVR as a "no" in DOGS, however, is only to protect myself: I don't want a game ending when someone forgets to vote because I don't want to be accused of conveniently losing the negative vote just to finish the game.

((The second and third guidelines are used in some zines, but I decided not to use them in DOGS. I think draw and concession proposals are part of the diplomacy of a game. For example, what better way to point out to the board the danger of a certain alliance than to propose a draw to that alliance? Of course, in that case you wouldn't want to be identified or be forced to vote "yes" to your proposal. Without the second and third guidelines we get alot of frivolous proposals in DOGS games, but I don't mind the extra work and the players are protected from forgetting to vote thanks to your first guideline.))
