Concessions can only be made to a country with 14 or more centers, and draws to a minimum of 22 centers between the proposed drawees. This prevents joke concessions from slipping through. Moreover, since all legal proposals are to people who have a legitimate claim to winning the game or sharing a draw, then any player who forgets to vote deserves what he gets, so NVR="yes". What do you think of it?

((A little too restrictive for my taste, especially the requirement on the draw votes. I'd rather allow any proposal to be made and considered, whatever it may be worth. (More on the next page)

((Your gamefee structure for EMBASSY ROW sounds good. Since you're a new gamemaster you might have had a tough time getting people to pay a gamefee, but free games may have attracted players who weren't serious about playing and who would later drop out. The deposit should keep away people looking for a free ride, without scaring away people who want to play. Of course, you may still try to run away with everyone's deposit money, but that's not likely now that there's nowhere in South America that's safe to hide.

((Before you start publishing, there's something you need to do: write to Kathy Byrne (the new Boardman Number Custodian) and ask her if she has a nickname for you. A nickname is good public relations. It makes you seem more human. Take me for instance. Kathy would write about me in her KATHY'S KORNER and it would always be "John Daly this" and "John Daly that."
