John Daly (Gamemaster): 1982HB (DOGS#18) was begun on July 17,1982 and ended on November 19, 1983 with a two way draw between Blaine Fower's England and Brent Adam's France. I always find that a little disappointing, but I was glad to see so many of the countries survive to the end. Congratulations to Blaine and Brent on the draw and to Norm for doing as well as he did. Thanks to the many standbys and special thanks to Stephen Lee for his cheerful play.

Blaine Fowers (England): The draw vote came as a pleasant surprise. was anticipating a long, drawn out war with an irrepressible Austria.

This was my first game in the zine and I think my second in postal Dip. I got off to a helluva start, too. I thought I had negotiated a nice alliance with John Banke's Germany, so I made hostile moves toward France. Then Banke started waffling and the first thing I knew he was siding with Dave Marshall in France. It looked like I would be a small flash in that pan.

So I started stirring the pan furiously and Dave and John eventually agreed to a three-way. Phew! That worked pretty well. Up to that point it seemed that Austria and I would be quickly out of the game, Then Italy self-destructed in Austria's favor and Norm made gains against Turkey. Russia lost Sweden to John and I and magnanimously opened the door to St. Pete to me. I moved all the way to Moscow, then stalled. All the while Norm was growing steadily, although John was preparing an assault while France seemed to have stemmed the red tide in Italy.

At this point I faced a tough decision. I had surplus units and no place to grow. What to do? Then John resigned the hearty German position. I have such a hard time stabbing an ally. (I probably shouldn't let on that I'm such a softy, but it's true). Unfortunately for Neil Daly I didn't have any qualms about nailing a new player. My only concern was that Norm might profit from my invasion of Germany. Then I lost my other ally and spent a couple of seasons without help. Again I thought of a move on the new France, but was sure I would be spread too thin. Then Brent came on the scene and he was such a damn nice guy. Well, out went Neil, Stephen hung in and Dan remained ponderously

faithful to Norm, my many intreaties not withstanding. It was a fun game and I enjoyed playing with all of you. I partic-

ularly enjoyed Stephen's good natured play of Russia.

Do I remember you saying you won't have any more gamestarts, John? If so, that is a shame. I really enjoy the quality of your zine. If I am wrong and you are still having more, sign me up for the next one.
