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


I also want to show you a picture of the house we're building, but this is the best I can do until the next roll of film is developed.

FROM THE WALL STREET JOURNAL

Here's an article I clipped from a past WSJ entitled "Ever Lock Tour Leys In Your Car? You May Be A Candidate For Densa".

Brainy people have Mensa, a society exclusively for the very bright. But what about dense folks? Well, now there's Densa. Jack Canaan, a retired public relations man, started this local counterpart of Mensa early last year after hearing a radio interview with the president of San Diego's Mensa chapter. "What a snooty group, sitting around in hot tubs discussing their smarts while the nitwits of America suffer silently," Mr. Canaan says.

Densa is anything but sneoty. It tried elegant hors d'oeuvres at the last meeting, but members didn't know how to eat them. would cut down on the number of illegal immigrants sneaking by.

Though their ideas may be dim, some who belong to Densa also belong to Mensa. "There's a little Densa in all of us," says Mari

Anderson, a writer who belongs to both societies.

And at least one Donsa idea - the group's own organizational structure - solves some real problems. All members are presidents. Nobody takes credit for this apparent stroke of genius, however. "Everybody just voted ofr themselves." Mr. Canaan says.
