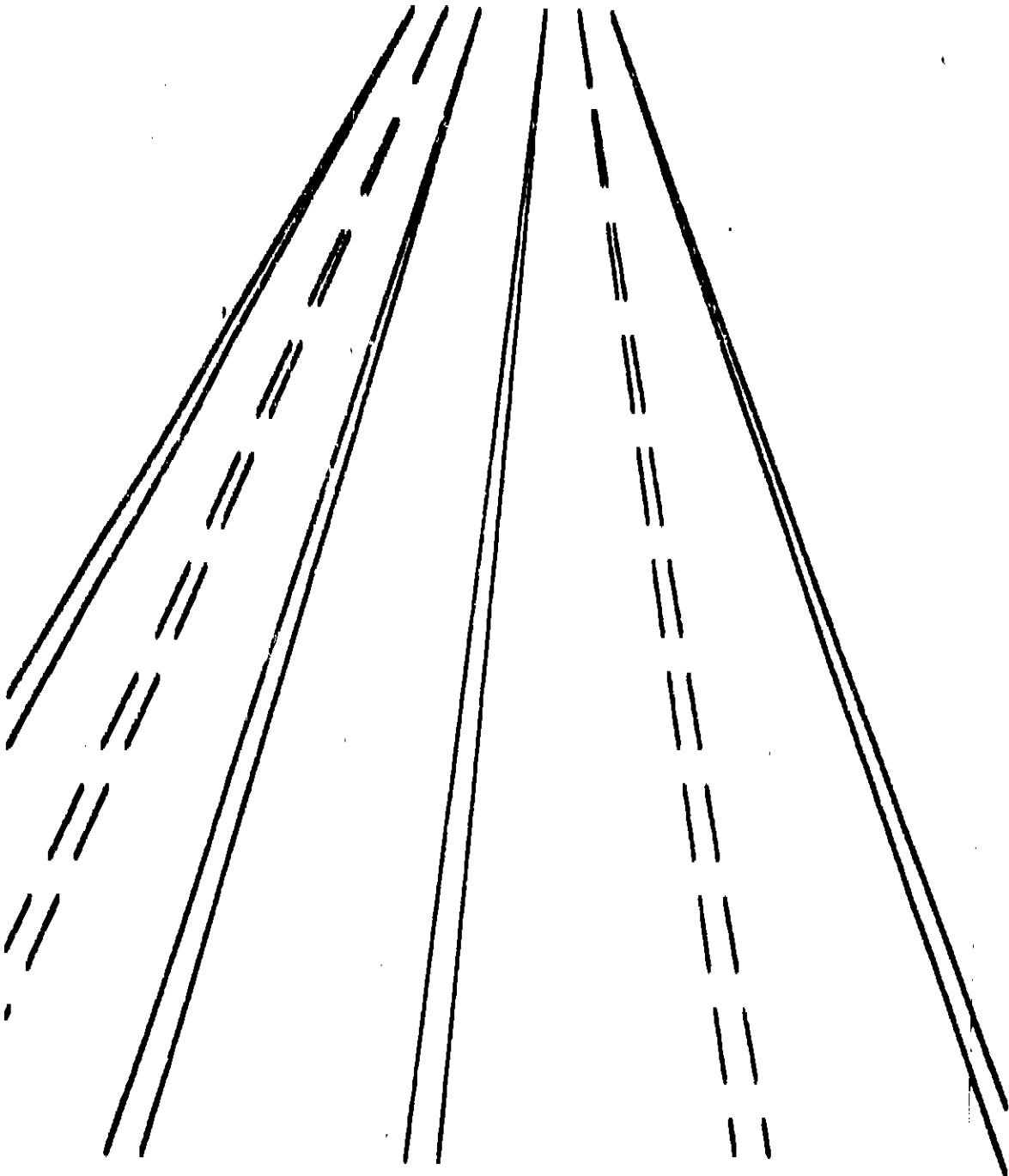

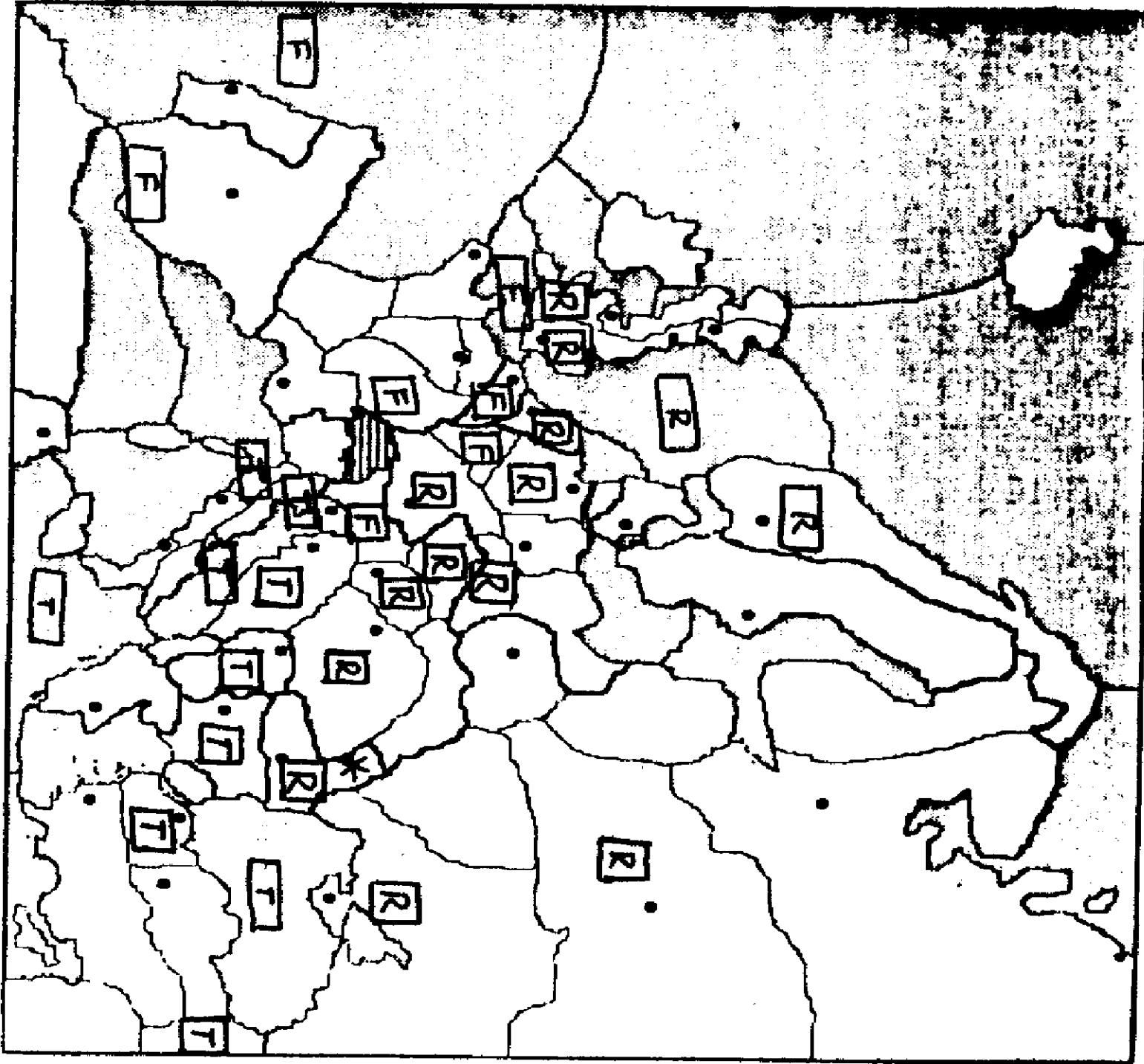

Note: France did not give a retreat order to his A Lon, so it was retreated OTB. At this point he was no longer short, so his order to remove his F SpaSC was invalid, and it remained unordered. He (presumably) meant to order A Bul S A Tyr-Mun, but he wrote Bel giving two ambiguous orders for A Bel and none for A Bur.

Note: Turkey can retreat to Galicia or OTB.
