INFLUENTIAL PLAYER RANKINGS' by Dan Stafford

Yes, another new ratings system involving modified Calhamer Point Count totals. This time with two major differences:

1) The Point Counts have been converted to a decimal system which is as follows:

win = 1.0
2-way draw = .5
3-way draw = .3
4-way draw = .2
5-way draw = .1
6-way draw = .0 (but counts for tie-breakers)
7-way draw = nothing

2) The base of rated games is constantly moving. Only the last 5-6 years of games will be rated. Currently Boardman Numbered games from 1976 through 1981 (Everthings 46-52 inclusive) are rated. And as soon as 1982 games start to finish 1976 games will be dropped from the rating, giving us about 5 years worth of games rated at each update.

The biggest advantage of this system is that inactive players will not clutter up the rating for very long-approximatly 5 years after their last win or draw they will have no IPR points left. This rating indicates who the most influential players are (in terms of wins and draws) in the last 5 years.
