Steven Brooks submitted no votes. PASS? refers to further actions to be taken in an effort to determine the result of the voting conditions, ie, less than clear.

- 1 The Council revokes all acts of the IDA Council passed between 6 Dec 76 and the election of the present Couicl, exceeting temporary appointemnts ot office and such acts as it shall reaffirm.(P)
 - 2 The Council reaffirms all disbursals of funds which have already been authorized
- 3 The ballots for all referenda and elections shall be numbered in such a way as to prevent duplicate voting by any member, but prepared in shuch a way that no member can be identified by his ballot. After being counted, these ballots shall be kept on permanent file in the Hoosier Archives or some new archives we may start for the purpose.
- 4 The Council reaffirms the mandate of the Consitutional Revision Committee, consisting of John Baker, Chair; Chuck Doehrere, Laurence Gillespie, and Richard Walkerdine. The purposes of the committee shall be to propose a set of amendments to the present constitution, and to draft a constitution providing for an international federation of the present IDA member organizations. The rem of bhe committee shall expire upon the completion of its designated purposes.
- 5 Questions may be proposed by any Council member, who shall simultaneously set a voting deadline at least 21 days but no more than 35 days after the mailing of the question. The only acceptable votes on Douncil questions shall be Yess, No, Absstain. Except as otherwise provided in the constitution, passage or failure of a question shall be by simple majority vote. Tie votes shall fail.

6 Each year there shall be a DipCon and a General Meeting hat the DipCon. The procedure for choosing the site of the DipCon shall bee as follows;

Each convention committee wishing to host the DipCon shall submit a Hid to the Ombudsman no later than 30 days before the DipCon of the previous year. The Ombudsman shall then prepare a statement detailing the qualifications of each convention committee and site, which may either be mailed to members before the DipCon, or distributed there; it may either be mailed to them by special mailing or included in DR.

At the General Meeting those members present shall vote for the site of the DipCon for the following year. The convention committee recieving the largest number of

votes shall host the next DipCon.

If no more than one convention committee has submitted a bid in advance, bids may be made at the General Meeting. Otherwise only bids submitted at least 30 days in advance may be considered.

7 The IDANA recognizes the International Calhamer Awards Committee as consisting of Raymong Heuer (US) Richard Walkerdine (UK) and CallWhite (CAN) and up to three additional members as appointed by them.

8 The IDANA Council hereby recommends the following procedures in event of a postal strike: 1) Players from the affected country or countries should be given the chance to appoint their own replacements, 2) If there is insufficient warning for the strike, the Camesmaster should appoint replacements, 3) these replacements shall take control of the country for the duration of the strike. After the strike has ended the original players should be allowed to retake command of their forces. If they do not, the replacement becomes the permanent player., 4) In the event that Camesmasters are unable to follow these procedures, the game should be stopped unitl the strike has ended.

9 Ithe International Diplomacy Association (IDA) hereby changes its name to the International Diplomacy Association for Northa America (IDANA). All past documents which refer to either the International Diplomacy Association or IDA will be considered as referring to IDANA.

10 Foreign memberships to IDANA (i.e. persons living outside of North America) will be accepted but the membership dues shall be set according to whether that member shall be only a voting member or if he shall calso recieve DR. If DR or some equal publication shall be printed in another country to gain favorable postage rates the IDANA authorizes collection of funds in that country. Voting rates will be set by Council on a flat or country-by-country basis.

11 The president will be responsible for producing a COUNCIL COURIER in the first Calendar week of each month (i.e. the week containg the the 4th of the mongh). All votes will be due by the first day of that week. Council members are requested toinitiate new bills and debate during the 2nd and 3rd week of the month however they may do os at any time.

12 The Council shallask the Miller Number Custodian and the Boardman Number Dustodian if they wish any funds from IDA. If so they must supply to Council a financial statement outlingin the need for the moneys. If this statement is not forthcoming within 60 days of the passage of this bill there shall be no subsidy. Council reserves the right to make payments beginning with the passage of a subsidy or to backdate payment from the time of the last payment to these Custodians.

13 Council asks Greg Costikyan what his "Special Project" shall be, its appropriate cost and date of production.

14 Council authorizes a committee of Bab Hartwig, Greg Costikyan, and Stve Brooks to draft a set of clear rules for the 1977 election of officers. This set shall be presented to council no later than 4 august 77.

15 Failure to vote on any bill wil be counted as ABSTAIN except of those bills outlined by the Consitution for outster of a member of council. Failure to vote on these consecutive occasions will construed as resignation from Council without recourse by that Council member.

16 Council recognizes the appointment of Alan Rowland as Novice Projects director.

17 Council encourages open meetings at any and all conventions but no such meeting shall be binding in any way upon IDANA or its treasury unless 4 or more council members are present and cast 4 of more votes for any issue.

I apologize for the poor quality of this transcription, but the reduced xerox is harder to read than usual. I can't number the bills, more for lack of certainty about the passage of some of them than concern of the lack of a numbering system authorized by the Council. Hopefully we can straighten this out soon.

I would appreciate hearing from anyone who reads this far as to wheter or not they are at all interested in the procedings; or would prefer merely a listing of the words of all measures passed, with anything failing passage being consigned to a purgatory other than the pages of DR. Let me know, please?

ELECTIONS

preparation and commentary

In accord with my constitutional responsibilities; I herewith call for nominations for all IDANA offices. Please take note, there is no requirement that nominies be members of the organization. To insure wide-spread participation and extend demoractic procedures to the utmost, submit the name of anyone you feel is qualified or capable for any of the offices. It is inoly necessary to drop a note with the nominate's name and office he's being nominated for. IDANA is an equal opportunity employer.

REQUIREMENTS: FOR AND OF OFFICES

President: The President is responsible for the day-to-day functioning of the organisation and coordinates Council proceedings. The president must be of legal age in his state or provide of residence.

Treasurer: The Treasurer is responsible for the day-to-day fiscal operations of the organization and maintenance of the membership list. The Treasurer must be of legal age in his state or province of residence. Semianually, the Treasurer will submit a budget. The dates which budgets shall be submitted Shall be February 1 for the fiscal period beginning April 1, and on August 1 for the period beginning on October 1. Each item of the budget must be approved by a 5/7ths vote of the Council.

Periodicals Editor: The Periodicals Editor is responsible for the regular production of a magazine of news, Council doings, etc. titled DIPLOMACY REVIEW nad issued six times each year at intervals of between 7 and 9 weeks.

Ombudsman: The Ombudsman will mediate idsputes, receive complaints, and investigate irregularities. He may make recommendations to the parties involved to assist them. He may consult the Council on the recommendations.

Special Projects Ediotr: The Special Projects Editor is responsible for production of at least one special publication per year.

Projects Chairmen: (American/(Canadaan): The Projects Chairmen shall be elected regionally to be responsible for those projects assigned by the Council to be accomplished on a regional basis.

COMMENTARY AND PLANS

At this time, I plan to conduct the elections as follows; I will moderate my plans as henceforth described by whatever directions the Council chooses to give me; I urge the Council to adopt my ideas as follows:

With this, the Third issue of the year, I will call for Nominations for ALL Offices of the organization, and describe the regulations of the constitution. Nominations will be accepted until the Fourth issue of the year is published.

With the publication fo the Fourth issue, all nominiees will be listed, and copies sent to all nominiees as well as members. Request the Acceptances/Declinations of all those nominated for office. Acceptances/Declinations shall be accepted until the Fifth issue is published. Please do not forgo telling me if you plan to run; I would rather not have to decide you didn't want to run because I hear nothing from you. You might want to run, and thus screw yourself, so accept please; all nominies will be informed. All nominies who choose to accept will be urged to submit brief, or at least short, campaign statements (not in excess of 1page, please).

With the publication of the Fifth issue, included will be the list of candidates for all offices; the statements of all accepting and writing candidates will be the main content of the issue. The fifth issue shall further include the Ballot; which shall be so done as to be number-coded, without the knowledge of the correlation of names and code-gruops beining known to noone. Dealdine for all Ballots, which shall be sent to a

Votec Counter before the deadline set for postmark of mailing.

The Vote Counter, who shall be choosen by the Council, will wait a reasonable time to compensate for late votes, and then count the Ballots. Voting shall be by Australian ballot, and specific ristrcutions will be inclosed with the Ballot.

The results should be sent to both the President and Periodicals Editor of the old year immediately. They will be published in the Sixbh DR of the Gear. All officers will be elected as of 12:00:01 AM of the 1st of January of the new year.

MYSELF

Ido not, myself, have any intention whatsoever of running for any office. I am not available for draft, and will decline if nominated. Someone else gets to join the Council's deliberations.

However, this won't keept me out of the way henceforth; rather I intend to make my presence even flore available than it has been. What I want in life and pubblishing is not presently a part of the NADIDA. I will remain a member, but would rather not become engaged in the whole thing again, its quite pointless.
