It's purpose is to provide you with the latest up-to-date information on DW and various affiliated projects, news about the hobby at large,

and items of particular interest to Diplomacy hobby members.

DWN is available by subscription for US\$2.00 for four issues (US\$4.00 for airmail overseas delivery), or by all-for-all exchange with other Diplomacy publications. Hobby publishers are encouraged to reprint DWN in toto in their own publications, to use it as a clipping service, or as a background source. The nominal fee for that is \$1 per year for publications with a circulation of less than 25, \$2 for those with 25-50 circulation, and \$3 for those with a circulation over 50. The charge for including a single 8½ by 11 inch flyer in the mailing will be \$10.00 per side. A sample copy of DWN is available for 2, 22¢ stamps.

News items for inclusion in DWN must be submitted by 1 November for the next issue. Submissions should be no more than 200 words and should answer the questions Who, What, When, Where, Why and How as appropriate. Press release format or highlighted items from

other publications are acceptable.

To promote DW's 50th birthday we've launched a hobby-wide advertising campaign consisting of ads to appear in hobby publications and a direct mailing to many hobby members.
