

#### "ANOTHER PIECE OF THE PUZZLE"

Speculation about the origins of the game of Diplomacy, and how it has achieved popularity in this country, has been widespread in recent issues of Ex. Many facts have come to light regarding the creation, and distribution of the game we all have



come to love. We found out about the KGB's involvement in the creation of the game from John MacFarlane. Jack Fleming told us how the C.I.A. discovered what a valuable training tool the game was and encouraged its use, while Scott Hanson informed us of China's influence in expanding the distribution of the game.

Scott hit the nail right on the head when he said "covert involvement in the Diplomacy hobby continues even today." His doubt about Russia, the U.S. and China being the only countries involved is well founded, because I have found evidence of yet another government's meddling in Diplomacy-related affairs——Fidel Castro's Cuba! I feel that of all the countries involved in this affair, the effects of the Cuban intervention are the most serious, and have the most potential to do the most damage to our hobby in the long run.

While the U.S., Russia and China have all promoted the game thus far, Cuba has been attempting to disrupt the interest in, and growth of, both Diplomacy and the postal Diplomacy hobby from Day One. Afficiandos of international politics might wonder about this apparent conflict between Russian and Cuban policy. Let me assure you that they are as united on this front as they are on any other.

It was obvious shortly after the release of 'Diplomacy', that the game was not going to have the effect that the Russians desired. In fact, it was having almost the reverse effect from what was anticipated.

Realizing their mistake, the Soviets attempted to bury the game, but by that time, the C.I.A. and John Boardman had gotten hold of it. Both Boardman and the C.I.A. began promoting Diplomacy for all it was worth, one for the fun and the other for its Diplomatic training potential. The Americans had turned the tables on the KGB!

Trying to undermine that which they created would have caused the Soviets to lose face in the intelligence community, so they did the next best thing...they called on Cuba. Since that time, the Cubans, with some discreet assistance from the KGB, have been attempting to bring down the postal hobby and, with it, the game itself. The recent eruption of difficulties in Central America(part of another Cuban intervention program) has put new emphasis on the Cuban efforts here.

Knowing that the only way the United States can diffuse the explosive situation in Central America is through skillful diplomatic negotiations, the Cubans have redoubled their efforts to bring down our only training ground for diplomats, that being the postal hobby. It was through this escalation that I became aware of the Cuban involvement, and its relationship with El Salvador, Guatemala and the rest of Central America.

I had three sources of information and all three told the same story—a story of oppression, despair and anger. Juan Valdez, a former coffee plantation owner in Colombia, made his way to the United States through all of the hot spots in Central America. I caught up with Juan in Los Angeles where he was filming a commercial for Hill Brothers. He told me how he had tried to purchase Diplomacy at a hobby shop in Honduras, and was almost arrested for his trouble.

Everywhere he went it was the same story. "The Cubans say no more Diplomacy," he was told. Juan had assumed that this Cuban outrage was limited to Central America alone, until he met Pastoré Giron, a businessman from El Salvador, at a Face-to-Face con in San Diego. Pastoré had tried to organize a postal Diplomacy hobby in El Salvador, when he began receiving death threats, and was forced to flee to the U.S. with his family.

"I'm still laying low," Pastore says. "I've heard that the "Cubanos" are trying to stop the game everywhere. I'm not going to risk the lives of my family again by trying to play postally, so I guess F-t-F cons are all I have." It's a sad story indeed.

The final bit of corroborating evidence came from a former Cuban spy, and now a Cuban defector living in the U.S. under C.I.A. protection. Esteban Herrara came to the U.S. to disrupt postal Diplomacy. His mission was to enter as many games as possible while establishing himself as a fun-loving guy. He was also to publish a zine if possible and, at the peak of his Diplomatic career, he was to quit. Some of you have probably heard of "Al Rodriguez", the psuedonym Esteban used. His attempted disruption of the hobby came before the recent big push, and proved only to be a minor inconvenience to the hobby at large. He was briefed on Operation Tretick before his defection though, and as he says "This operation could have far-ranging implications, far above the minor damage caused by 'Al Rodriguez'."

Estéban showed me documents pertaining to Operation Tretick and what he says is true. The effect could be devastating.

Phase 1 of the operation involves infiltration of the zines and games. Phase Two includes NMRing, starting feuds and on the plus side, starting up a few zines. Phase 3 involves escalation of feuding, attempts to drive key hobby members out of the postal hobby and zines folding, along with the replacement of game pieces with plastic stars and anchors. A lot of this has happened already, but the hobby has proved resiliant thus far.

According to the documents I now have though, Phase 4 will soon be initiated. This calls for the assassination of several key hobbyists in what is called "Sub-operation PudgeCon". I don't know what this means, but as soon as I figure it out, I'll send out a warning to try and stop this awful thing from happening.

With such a high level of Cuban involvement in our hobby, one can only imagine how many other enemies of the state have their hands in postal Diplomacy somewhere. I-I....I shudder to think of it."

### "THE MISSING LINK"

---by Patrick Hart

People of Dipland. Hear ye. Hear ye! There is a rule which should've been included in the original Diplomacy rulebook, but wasn't. I have not seen it played in a variant game. Perhaps it has, but I haven't even seen it mentioned since I've been playing. Others would know better than me. I call it the "piggyback option".

I hear some of y'all out there saying "it's already

in the rules, it's called a convoy." You're right...and you're wrong. But this is the real thing. Think about this. When the Allies invaded Normandy during World War II, their troops were carried/piggybacked by ships and took the beaches. The ships/fleets didn't remain in the channel preventing the occupation of enemy ships like they do in Diplomacy. I know, I know. Each turn takes place over a several month period. That proves my point, a fleet can't be in two places at once.

Basically, the piggyback option involves an army and a fleet coming to the same coastal province, whether by design, a retreat or builds. The army is then piggybacked by that fleet and goes with that fleet until ready to disembark. A true convoy. You wouldn't need a string of fleets to get an army from London to Rome. That's reality!

These are the conditions for the piggyback option:

- 1) The army and fleet must go to the same coastal province to initiate the piggyback.
- 2) An army and fleet from different countries cannot piggyback from a supply center.
  3) When piggybacked, they're counted as one unit for combat and movement purposes.
- 4) Once piggybacked, the army must go with the fleet to avoid the two units in a space rule.
- 5) If the fleet is annihilated, so is the army.
- 6) The army can disband anytime except when in a body of water.
- 7) The army can leave the fleet anytime after the turn the fleet lands on a coast.
- 8) Once on the coast, the piggyback remains in effect until the army acts on its own.
- 9) The piggyback is still in effect if the fleet fails to move as long as the army is unordered. ((Continued on page (Continued on page (Continued

- '10) When the piggyback is broken, the army and the fleet must be in different spaces. Otherwise, the army is considered annihilated and removed immediately from the board.
- 11) Written orders look like this: F Lon P A Lon-Nth.
- 12) These are not written in stone.

So, after some thought, you can begin to see some of the tactical and strategical possibilities of this option. It does have its advantages and disadvantages compared to the convoy. It's meant as a supplement to, not a replacement. Yes, it is slower to initiate, but does have a more far-reaching effect to the added capabilities of a country far away from yours. However, it's nearly impossible to hide your intentions which would make it a marked fleet. The most compelling reason may be because it's realistic and adds that little extra to naval battles---break through and invade!

And next is the 3rd in a series of articles on how to play Diplomacy to win by "Billy Argon", psuedonym of a well-known hobby member who thinks it best that he remain unknown for his future game chances. So "Billy Argon" it is.....

## PLAY DIPLOMACY TO WIN ---by "Billy Argon"

When you start receiving replies to your first letters, it's time to seriously look at the game and determine what you plan to do. I'm not sure how this works—but for some reason we usually decide that one person will make a better ally than another. I think friendly letters that show a lot of interest in the game are very important. Non-writing means death. With these first replies you're finally going to have to be specific about your intentions. Don't be in a hurry. If a neighbor suggests exactly what you want then encourage him. If he suggests something else, compliment him on his plan and suggest your idea. ((Continues on page ?))

Be very open-minded at this stage. Never give a positive "no" unless you absolutely must. Always look for another alternative and the good points of the other plan. If possible make your neighbor think he thought up your plan. It's a great boost to his confidence and if it's what you wanted you're in great shape too. Talk to everybody whether they want to hear from you or not. France and Turkey can at least trade information if they can't make specific plans together.

With the second and third letters before the 12 deadline, your plans should be really shaping up. Make alliances with your friendliest neighbors. If you've been writing a response to every letter then you should be on a good footing with the other letter-writers. Make your first targets the neighbors who won't write you no matter what you do. In these situations, the opening moves are pretty clear. The Have-Letter Nations gang up against the Have-Not-Letter Nations. You should be in a good alliance --- who's going to join with a country who doesn't write?

After you've decided your opening alliance and target, don't neglect the other side of the board. When the first target is out of the game, you're going to have to hit someone else. If you don't write to the players on the other side of the board, your options are very limited. You might even end up in one of those disgusting "Game Long Alliances"! Keep communications open with everyone so you can choose whether to stay with your opening ally or hit him for his centers. If you can get on friendly terms with one of the distant players early in the game, it will mean you have a chance to take all the gains your first ally made. Usually with the help of another power you're sure to win--and will get most of the centers shince you're closer. But you still have the option of sticking with your opening ally and hitting the other players. Lots of fun and lots of options.

That gets you to the opening deadline and moves. If all has gone well, you should have at least one strong ally nearby and a couple of good friends on the other side of the board.

## HOUSE OF HAPSBURG 1979 R: WRAP-UP

"House of Hapsburg" began in John Leeder's zine, Runestone based in Alberta, Canada beginning in 1979. John was the GM for this game until Spring 1912 when he decided to fold Runestone and place his games in other zines.

became the new home for 1979 R christened "House of Hapsburg" and 1981 HK, dubbed "House of Bourbon".

Both games were 10-week deadlines

and both were run on the British method of Diplomacy, i.e. Fall and Winters seasons are combined with the Spring season by itself. Each game appeared in every other issue of EE and this reason was why I chose the "House" names for

The idea came from the novel <u>Marie Antoinette</u> by Stefan Zweig which said: "Upon dozens of German, Italian and Flemish battlegrounds, the Hapsburgs and the Bourbons had engaged in deadly strife, each party hoping to make itself predominant in Europe. Now, extenuated with fatigue, the longtime rivals perceived that their insatiable jealousies had served only to give free scope to the ambition of other ruling houses. In view of this, the monarchs of France and Austria, and their servants the diplomats, entered into an alliance; and they decided that the friendship between the dynasties should be cemented by marriage. The most natural possibility was to betroth the young Dauphin, the grandson of Louis XV, to a daughter of Maria Theresa of Austria and a provisional proposal was made in 1766 concerning Marie Antoinette, then eleven years old."

Also in the 1700s, most of the rulers held the decisions of peace and war in

their own hands (just like Dip players in games now) not consulting parliaments etc.

Since I only began CMing this game in Fall 1912, I cannot provide a lot of detail. Five players played France, 4 players played England and three players played Germany. This was yet another game where Bernie Oaklyn was removed and it had another famous woman player in it, Margaret Gemignani.

The players lived in Canada, Japan, West Germany, the United Arab Emirates and the United States. Horst John, the Austrian winner of "House of Hapsburg", is from West Germany and was the original player of Austria in a game which was not even in his native language. Maybe there is hope for me yet!

Next will be the headlines and cartoons that "House of Hapsburg" did have in its short time with EE. After this follow the end game statements in alphabetical order. (Despite the Russian player's endgame statement, I received no notation of Dave Pengelly from John Leeder, the original GM for this game).

ENDGAME STATEMENT FOR ENGLAND (Dave Carter) "House of Hapsburg" 1979 R

WFinal supply centre count for England in Winter 1913 should be 7, not 5. I'm not submitting an end game statement. I came in late and nothing interesting happened.

((Gary here. I called Don Ditter, the then ENC, and changed England's supply center count so no Double BLAsashzhzhhh!!! for you. (See Italy below!)))

ENDGAME STATEMENT FOR ITALY (Fred C. Winter) "House of Hapsburg" 1979 R

"Congratulations to Horst John[Austria] on the victory, and I'm glad I could help him get it. I think it only appropriate that he saluted me by allowing me to keep Tunis and thus end as a survivor with Fleet Clyde.

This game saw me around the world, from Oklahoma to California to Greece and North Carolina, back to Chicago and then Milwaukee. I don't think I missed a move. And my addresses at intervals included "General Delivery, St. Mary's (Glacier Park), Montana. And, as I admitted to our second gamemaster, I've never missed a move, even though I did forget to mail one set for four months.

I hope John Leeder gets a copy of all the end game statements Leeder was the original CM and he will get this copy of EE]. I've got a nice collection of foreign stamps from this game too. What more could one ask? A worldwide hobby taking 4 years to complete; amazing!

So. Austria and I allied from the start. I hoped to be a partner, but as so often happens to Italy in that role, I ended up in eclipse to Austria. Horst [the Austrian player] did contemplate dropping out in 1908 and 1909, and I think that my obnoxious attempts to have him roll over and play dead so I could capitalize on our early game partnership(including some complicated Italian armies in Greece roaming the Balkans) and have a shot at winning. Instead, he attacked(I won't call it a stab) me and dominated me completely. I pushed west and out of his way, capturing pirate supply centers all over. I'd have ended the game with 2 supply centers except my mail got jammed between my motorcycle saddle and gas tank, and I didn't find the letter was unmailed until this March when I took the bike out of winter storage. Back at the game, I enjoyed my scenic tour in Liverpool and as an outlaw in Clyde. All I have to say to Turkey and France[who were eliminated] is BLAsaahzhzhhh!!!

How appropriate that my last contact with this game is being sent over 3000 miles away from my first\_contact. How appropriate that England, despite throwing barbs at me and taking Liverpool back, dropped to 5 from 6 centers even so. Double BLAsashzhzhhh!!! Goodbye.

ENDGAME STATEMENT FOR RUSSIA (Tom Butcher) "House of Hapsburg" 1979 R

"I took over the Russian position in this game as a standby in 1903 with a virtually hopeless position. Four units dwindled to two before Horst John, who had a strong position as Austria, befriended me and set me up, in effect, as his northern buffer against England, Bernie Oaklyn.

Bernie's tactics were unorthodox, to say the least, and none too successful, as I gradually managed to push him out of Scandinavia. About this time I also pushed south and aided Austria in eliminating Turkey from the game, giving me six centers and a fairly sound position since most of the Austrian forces were now in the west.

Bernie England was then dropped from the game for failing to re-sub, and his replacement being an old comrade-in-arms, Dave Pengelly, we immediately saw eye-to-eye on the need to join forces to stop Austria from winning. I accordingly stabbed my benefactor with villainous treachery and foul perfidy, but to be successful the effort needed help from the new Italian player According to Leeder, Fred Winter has been the only Italian player, who unfortunately had been persuaded he would get second place if he abandoned the Mediterranean to pester the western allies. This abandonment of his homeland most certainly didn't give Italy anything like second place, but it just as certainly gave Austria first.

Horst[Austria] was not always tactically successful but was quite successful ((Continued on page 12 ))

Memphis to Russia: It seems Austria-Hungary is helping out on that front.... Austria-Hungary to World: S.L.O.P. is bringing the Boche under control. Moscow to Budapest: You are denied acceptance into S.L.O.P. until such time as you sink below 6 centers.

Memphis to Casual Readers: S.L.O.P. stands for Society of Little, Oppressed Powers, and perhaps Russia can tell us what it stands for? Moscow to CM: Yes, S.L.O.P. supports turmoil, war, pestilence, deceit, backstabbing, lying and cheating. S.L.O.P. is opposed to nations above 6 centers. Utopia is

defined by the S.L.O.P. Charter as a game in which no one is eliminated, no one rises above 6 centers and everyone stabs and lies to every other player a maximum number of times.

Ratings! Ptui! I care nothing for the ratings! I care for the game! challenge of trying to control Europe while fighting six others who also desire the same thing. Siamese-Allies are a menasce to the spirit of the game, Imagine seven people like the French and English leaders in a game! It would end with a 7-way draw after everyone found out that they all just wanted a part of a draw. The game wouldn't even reach 1902! These people don't want to play Diplomacy; they want to find a friend and never let him go. To help cretins like this to any part of a draw just encourages their Siamese-Allies mentality. I won't do it. I'll try to give the game to the Austrian. That way, (the Kaiser smiles) we end up tieing with England and France in a way. We all lose.

Democratic Representative, Tip O'Neill jetting off to China on a fact-finding tour. He didn't know basic facts about China and he couldn't speak Chinese. This trait often embarrasses me about American leaders. I remember that another representative whose name escapes me went to Israel and was lecturing the Israelis on what they show do. They asked him to find the West Bank on a map and he couldn't do it! But I have to wonder if non-Americans are any better when they cannot tell hardly any difference between America and the Soviet Union. That is ignorance of the highest degree. Another letter on this subject is from a recent European visitor to America....

Ivo Bouwman (The Netherlands): "Even though it was back in EE #24, and this letter probably won't make it in time for EE #26, I still want to react on a few letters concerned with, let's say, the American-European relationship. I find it very hard to do so, but because of the way I feel, I think I should. The problem is that it is so hard to put into words what I think about this matter, but I'll try anyway. Let me explain first why I find it so hard. All my life for some reason I have felt an inexplicable admiration for the U.S. In spite of the general anti-American tension around me, I did. Since this feeling was only based on what I saw on TV and in the cinema, most people considered it silly. So back in '81, I decided to go over there, hopefully to be able to judge for myself.

Well, even though vacation for a month isn't the most ideal way to do so, I still met a lot of people whom I talked to, and became friends with. After getting back I knew my admiration had been just and had only increased! So now I was confronted with people at home saying I could not possibly judge after four weeks, "only" being on vacation. This attitude of my friends and relatives more or less represents the general attitude of at least the Dutch, but I feel of a big part of Western Europe. They all stick to the monotonous image they have of Americans: fat, stupid people, thinking they are the best, always wearing striped pants, white shoes and hat, wanting to take over control of Europe. And that hurts me, since I know most Americans are not at all like that (well, lets of them are fat....).

And since Americans damn well realise the Europeans think like that, they tend to fight back by pointing at all the things they did for us, etc. Bill Highfield states the problem halfways. In EE #24 he says: "I'd like to know where Europeans get off thinking they are so damn superior." The fact is that Buropeans wonder exactly the same thing about Americans! Right now, Europeans use arguments like lack of culture in the U.S. to underline their sophistication, while Americans brag about their economic achievements, and try to put Europe down by using the past wars against us. And that's being countered by Europe making clear how bad America is, in Central America. What, for God's sake, is the point in treating each other like this?!

I think(I'm not sure) that Europe probably started this "feud" by getting jealous, but that doesn't really matter. We both live in the free world, even though Europeans tend to forget that every now and then. To have that in common should be by far sufficient to be one! What I consider the worst thing Europeans tend to do is interfering with other people's (read: nation's) business. I hate that! Even though things other people do may be "immoral" to us, who the hell are we to say so for others?! In that sense I think most of Europe still lives in the past, when we told the world what was moral or not ...

On the other hand Americans seem to grow too big for their boots sometimes. I think that might be the key to the uncomfortable relations between the two continents. Europe used to be the biggest, and can't get used to being overtaken, while America may emphasize that point a little sometimes. If all Americans and Europeans would sincerely behave like inhabitants of the United States of the World, things like economic crises wouldn't have to be and fear of commies neither!

I, for myself can only say that after visiting your country three times now, love it at least as much as Holland, and hate to see our countries dispute. As players of the game of Diplomacy, whenever we feel bad about"the other side of ocean", we should realise that it took an American to invent it, and a Europe to situate it...

## RESULTS OF THE SEVENTH ANNUAL NORTH AMERICAN POLL

This poll, also known as the Runestone Poll(and formerly the Leeder Poll) was conducted for the first time this year by Randolph Smyth, pubber of Fol Si Fie who sent cut advance copies of the results. This poll also includes the Gamesmasters Poll---see page 32) and had 78 votes, the lowest turnout since 1979's 72 bellots. (last year was 99). To make the main list, a zine had to receive 10 votes. A further 36 zines received less than 10 votes and I'm only listing those concerned with Es subbers. If you didn't take the time to vote, shame on you! One vote and only one wote kept 4 zines off the main list as they only got 9 mentions. These were Festungs Hof. Fol Si Fie. Liberterrean and Ter-ran. Was it your vote?

I'm very grateful to the 37 of you who took the time to rate Es which won
lst place in a dead heat by 1/100th of a point! Randolph said that Es had 12 tens,
9 nines, 8 eights, 3 sevens, 1 six, 1 five, 1 four and 2 zeros. Randolph also
will be coming out with more detailed analysis of the poll in the coming months.

Some Quick Observations: This is the first year that zines and subzines were put into separate lists. Of the top 10 zines, 7 have letter columns of some sort; 4 are digest and 6 are open-page; 6 are xerox, 2 are ditto, 1 is word processor and 1 is mimmo; 3 are on 4-week schedules, 3 are 5-weekers, 2 are 3-weekers, one is a 3-4 weeker and one is  $5\frac{1}{2}$  weeks. Two are folded zines. Two come from Canada. A poll in Mark Luedi's Thirty Miles of Bad Road on the "best zine that you don't receive" had the same top five as this poll. One is a new zine begun last year.

The voters continue to be fickle. Only one zine from the top ten of 1980 is represented on the top ten this year. Only 2 zines from 1981 and only 4 zines from 1982. However the so-called "Curse of the Top Three" noted by Fred Davis in his <u>Bushwacker</u> is broken, at least this year. Fred said: "All three 1981 Leeder Foll leaders have apparently disappeared, and now two out of the three of the 1982 winners have gone likewise. Watch out, Gary Coughlan, Y'ALL better watch out—whatever it is may be contagious!" Es was 3rd last year.





With Origins behind us by the time you read this, I won't comment further on that, other than to point out an oddity that I noticed somewhere: Linsey et.al. organized a Beer Blast for folks wenting to drop in, but then added "BYOB". Hmm. If that went over real well, I want to announce a hobby Wife Swap at my home each Thursday night, Bring Your Own Wife. Or somebody else's if you prefer. Maybe Woody will offer a hobby Swim Party, Bring Your Own Pool?

The latest DW is out, #34, a below par issue, but it has some good parts. Berch does his usual decent-filler role well, but what I think it really needs is more of Walkers own writing, AS writing, rather than just marginal comments. He does write an awful lot of hobby stuff, but it's all been in OTHER zines lately, not DW. Sad to say, there was some dumb stuff too: this "Peery" person whose name is often seen with a "Send \$12 to.." nearby, writes a whining editorial about how masty it is that hobby folks call each other names, moralizing over a nonexistent issue; Walker plugging Peery's assorted projects/polls/zines/whatever (all at more than a few bucks a crack... one thing you've got to hand Peery, he does have a nose for bucks!); a Walker editorial taking a potshot at some of Sack's stranger rantings, and supporting Peery; variant stuff; all in all, not much really worth reading. I see in the front that this Peery, Walker's fellow-Californian and egsy, is now listed as "CO-EDITOR AND BIG HELP"-I guess that explains it. DW is, I presume, the big help to Peery's \$2/issue zine, \$12-15 Con, and whatever. (Foreign readers should note that in the US, most zines rum 40-75¢ each, and most of the Cons you hear of are essentially free aside from transportation there, and your food). What bothers me is that this sinking of DW causes me to suspect Boardman has been right; these odd voices from the west will soon (and to me, 'already) carry no more weight than does Sacks' strange comments, or that New England fellow-what was his name?--that ran his one-man "Gamemaster's Publisher's Association" some time back. Now, oddball:rentings are nothing new. There was that latter's zine CLUE & KEY; or the Curtis Gibson letters I used to print; or Peery's own XENO today (even Walker's plug is forced to add "Warning: you have to like to read pages and pages and pages of peeriblah."); some of Sacks' KGO letters; and the like. But while it is one thing to have a few screwball features or columns or peripheral zines, it is quite another to see DIPLOMACY WORLD being taken over by this same affliction. REally a shame.

On a happier note, the latest VOICE OF DOOM arrived last night with the latest Runestone Poll results. EE naturally took first place, so at least this year we got rid of the bullshit stuff that marred last year's results so badly. The others—well, it's hard to say. A lot of my favorites are down in two digits, and the last three Brux reported (28-30) are among them, while the "top 20" contain 8 zines I would have voted lower than they got, including 3 of the top 10. A lot of others will comment on individual zines, so I will let it go myself for now. Just congratulations to Gary for a clear win. I know it is satisfieing, having been stunned by winning it myself many years ago my first year out. If you publish, you remember that sort of thing.

In the subzine section, this column got into top place among a strange mixture of others, some of whom I don't even recognize, and virtually none of which I read, KK being the one notable exception. I do appreciate the vote, but I really have to wonder about it: is this thing that loved, or is it all just some carryover from my old BRUTUS BUILETIN days, or is the competition sparse, or what? I do know that when I get someone's zine, the best parts are the parts about THEM—what they think about inflation or El Salvador or Cartahena or Budweiser or black—vs—white undies or parochial schools or riding in a car Caruso owns—but from my vantage point, MES

really is just "filler", and not nearly as good as I would like, but good enough for some sub credit that I can in fact use. Were it more just a "letter from home" type thing, we might both be happier, but it is much less so that than I would usually like. ("So why not change it?" I do these in a stream-of-consciousness mode, and ain't about to retype anything. I just type it as it comes, then quit when I have to. It's all extemporaneous, or darcimonious, or whatever.) This sort of thing then is appreciated, but, isn't there more elsewhere, and perhaps far better? And more importantly, if there isn't, why not? Why don't MORE of you do the same thing?

Two related quick notes I should add to my comment above about not reading many of the top 10 subz's Brux listed: First, it might seem strange that I play in three of the top ten listed, and yet said I read "virtually none" of them. I should explain that said subz's are heavy on press, often very poor/black/or both press, for 90% of their material. I skim this stuff just looking for my own name (which is OFTEN there!), or something cleverly Olsenish sounding that I can use somewhere else myself another time, but pay little heeed to the bad bulk of most of the rest of the press. Another note is that too many publishers have music sections, and most music, especially what is commented on by the generally younger, more modish pubbers, is a complete waste. I'd rather go back to Mazzer's STRANGE DOINGS and read that sick press about the guy who analyzes people and societies by the way their shit stains streak toilet bowls they leave behind them. (Yes folks, STRANGE DOINGS hits some alltime intellectual highs, let me tell you). (I wish he'd open another black press game like that though). But like I say, music doesn't impress me.

One common plague on the current hobby is the dumb remarks being made about DNQ/NFP letters and the like. A refreshing new tack was recently taken on this matter by Mark Luedi in the latest 30 MILES OF BAD ROAD, wherein he wrote:
"...I will now endeavor to spell out the TMoBR letter policy. T-M-o-B-R l-e-t-t-e-r p-o-l-i-c-y. There, it's done." Way to go.

Another hobby issue of burning importance had a couple of items come along on it lately: separations of season. Someone else in Lischett's CHEESECAKE complained about Andy's policy of granting separations at the drop of a pin on the part of any player, even for a separate SUMMER season, echoing a complaint I had there too a few months earlier. Guess he hadn't read that exchange earlier. Paul Rauterberg, (MIDLIFE CRISIS), writing in VOICE OF DOOM #81, defends that very idea though. Linsey came through with an illustrative item in his response, where he pointed out that he had received enough (2) requests for a separation in his Neptune game, but took a look at it and realized that there were no adjustments to be made! I suspect the requests came from the same folks who put together the DIPIMASTER shit in last year's Runestone Poll. At least this time it was funnier. Allowing I vote seps is wrong thowhile I'm mentioning VD 81, a "John MacFarlane" wrote this in the lettercol:

"Let the commiss come in and in five years, Salvador will have a democracy". I hope that this MacFarlane is one of Linsey's European subbers, or extraterrestrial or something. I'd hate to think there was much of that communism-ain't-so-bad kind of thinking over HERE.

Do any of you play 4th edition THIRD REICH?
