Hugh Polley (8 Feb 1983): "I have the rough draft of a Dippy program. It uses the string capabilities of a VIC 20. Does your computer have the following functions: Mid\$(x\$,y,8), Right\$(x\$,y), Left\$(x\$,y)? If so let me know." ((Yes, my Osbourne Microsoft BASIC supports those functions, but I would be hard pressed to tell you what they do. I have not tried programming anything in BASIC yet -- I have not found the time to play around with it. However, recently I bought a copy of Steve McLendon's adjudication program and am now trying to figure out how it works before typing the hundreds of lines of code on my Osbourne. I will be interested to see how your program works, Hugh, when you have it finished.))

"On genealogy my uncle is also crazy about it. So Dick Martin (6 Feb 1983): far he's got us back to Charlesmagne! I think I'm impressed, but by now just about everyone should be related to us! Actually, I think the great x 3 grandfather from the Civil War (Union side) is much more interesting. (my uncle has) actually dug up some of his old letters and diaries, which make for interesting reading. What have you come up with so far?" ((I have not been able to get very far on the Beyerlein side of the family. I can only go back as far as my great grandfather, Christ Beyerlein, who was born in Germany in 1840-1 and came to the U.S. sometime before 1887. The problem is that there are very few Beyerleins in the U.S. My great grandparents had only two sons and only one of those had children. My father was an only child, so that means that we have zero Beyerlein relatives outside of the immediate family. Some of the other family lines go a bit further. My father's mother's name (Wasson) goes back to the early 1800s in the southeast. My great great Wasson In 1863 he enlisted in the grandfather was Abner Washington Wasson. Confederate Army and was a member of Brown's Company that raided through Texas (I don't know what they were raiding in Texas). One of his ancestors (and mine) was William Bone, who immigrated to the United States in the 1690s. And if the story can be believed, he was a descendent of the de Bohun family which has been traced back to Normandy in 975 AD. I have not found any connection with Charlesmagne yet, but I have found a line back to Edward I of England and Eleanor of Castile. And supposedly branches of this same family include the legendary Daniel Boone and Sam Houston of Texas. I take it all with a large grain of salt.))
