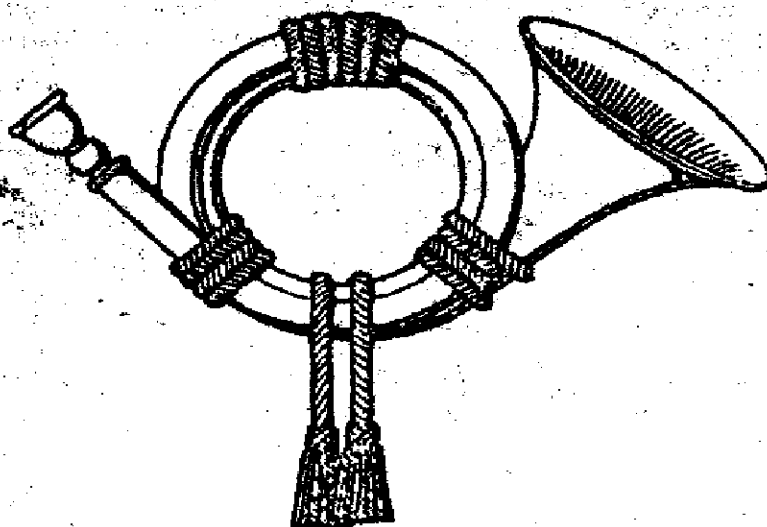
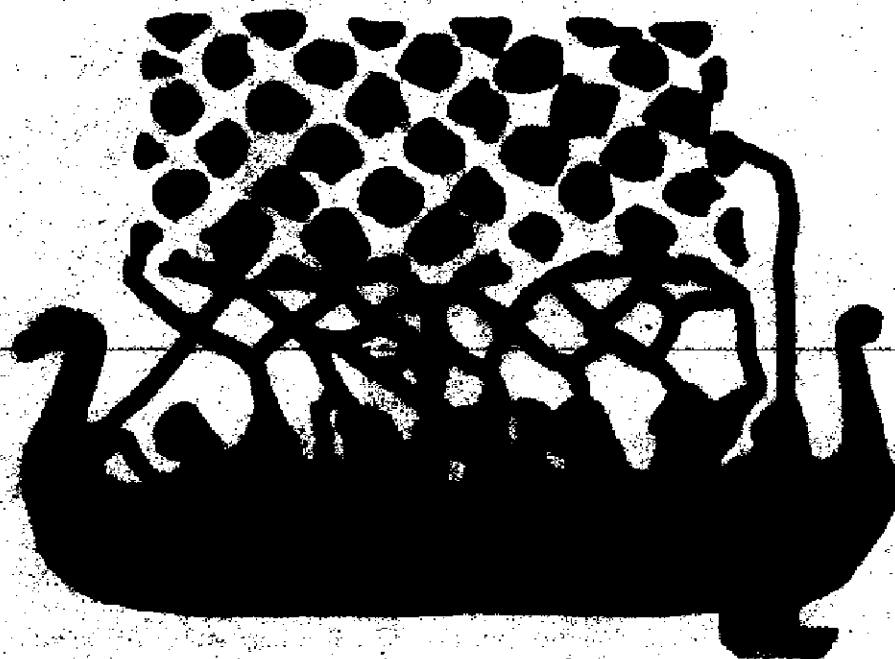

\*Subscriptions are available at the rate of 10¢/4pgs. + postage. Subscribers maintain a subscription account from which the cost of each issue is deducted. It is recommended that subscribers start their account with \$5. Payment may be made by check, M.O., cash or unused postage stamps (Canadian and foreign Okay). When your account falls below \$1, it is time to renew.

\*Writing in EM: Writers receive compensation in the form of sub credit at the rate of \$1.50 per printed page and fractions thereof. Suitable topics include but are not limited to how to devise a workable game strategy, tactics, methods of negotiation, etc. DYO COO scenarios are also sought for Battalion Briefings.

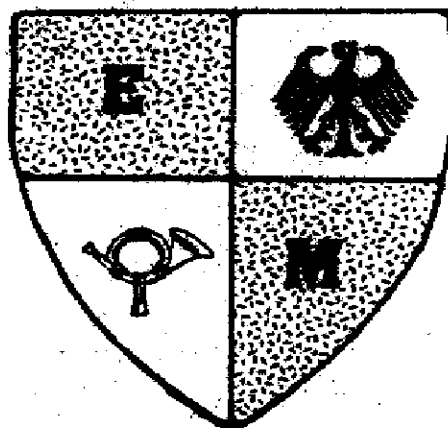

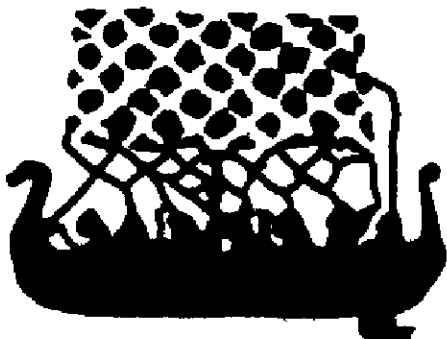

More on this will be coming your way as time goes on, so stay tuned.

Both BARBAROSSA and GOTZ are entering the end-game phases of play, and when the next Diplomacy game starts, that'll be the last for many, many, many months. EM will carry about 1 Dip game along from now on. The content of EM will be KONIGREICH and S.P.Q.R., plus Squad Leader with new games coming on from time-to-time.

At the moment, I have this inspiration for a game about the Vikings. I guess I've read too many books about them and Scandinavia recently. As envisioned, three to five players are Kings with ships and land, fighting-men and riches. Each orders raids against the undefended (?) coast of Europe and gains more riches. The game would end when only one King is left alive, or when the Kings vote one of their number, supreme. The terrors of the game would be storms, meeting well-armed locals in a raid, political dissention within your clan, etc. More later.

# BATTALION BRIEFINGS

Tank vs Tank: The Tankers, six of them, are off and gunning. Periodically, I'll summarize the action here for everyone and post the current point scores. Each tanker is playing four different scenarios vs another anonymous player in different terrain and under different weather conditions. Should be loads of fun, eh?

Limited Intelligence Scenario: So far four takers for this with a clear preference for the German vs Russian city-fight. Talk about bloody! I'll put myself on record now as going for the city-fight. We need at least 3 players per side, with four being optimum. Invite your friends to inquire, but don't ask if he's playing. Half the fun is the restricted intelligence set-up, where you only see and hear what your troopers see and hear.

A few questions have come my way regarding the play of the scenario. Each sides' battalion commander commands the on board headquarters unit which is invariably composed of engineers, heavy weapons section (HMGs, Mtrs, ATs, etc.). Also, the bat.com. is the only player on the side who can call in on board and off board artillery. For such calls he has to act in tandem with the spotter in the area for artillery accuracy and adjustment. Communication is done via radio between commander and company commanders. If the radio breaks down, no talking! Each company commander will have a special 5dKfz 251 as a radio command car, plus a radio for the troops.

As the game goes on, company commanders radio back to battalion the enemy and their troop dispositions so that he can coordinate strategy, etc. Also, the Bat.Com is the only player on the side given the victory conditions and provided with as much intelligence about the enemy in the set-up stage as permitted. Also, figure that the Bat. Com is in charge of reinforcements and the like and could reassign a platoon of yours to another player if he wished.

In this city-fight, the Germans and Russians will have an amazing plethora of things to fight with. Expect to see snipers, DMs, FTs, STGIIIIs, JSUs, confused lines (that is the Reds hold two blocks of buildings in the German rear, and the Germans have a company isolated among a sea of Red).

One thing you'll have to remember is that those big stone buildings could garble or cut you off from radio contact with your HQ, so you'll have to bear in mind where your radio man or car ends up at the end of a turn.

There will also be an opportunity for the enemy to listen in on your chats on the radio. If BNHQ sets up a listening post that does nothing but scan the bands for your messages he stands a 50-50 chance of knowing what you know, which could be deadly, if you say, for instance, "Have lost all squads in Bldg. H5 and can't reach it."

Keep tuned in for more announcements in the very near future!

Some playing suggestions:

**RADIO CODE:** If the enemy knows what you're saying, you could face terrible consequences so that it behooves the BNHQ to have a radio code ready for use. You could code the principle target as "BRAVO RAY," the Russian Engineers as "DELTA FOX," etc. You could also capsulize entire instructions, like "In the next Prep/Def phase you must take building at hex ..." coded as "ALPHA NOMAD" with the hexes given in a cipher as 0010, where 00 might mean "R" and 10 means 7.

**MAP:** Because the game will go on for some time and sightings may be very important and very hard to remember, it would be advisable to XEROX the boards, tape them together and write in any important info, like known enemy starting positions, the objective or suspected landmine locations, etc. Then you can whip out your map at work and impress your friends that you command a Panzer platoon of Tigers!

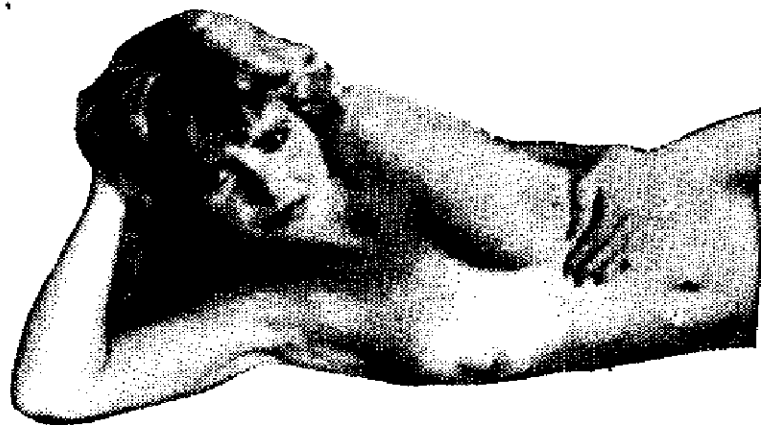

## THE MANIFESTO OF THE PEOPLES' DIPLOMACY ORGANIZATION (April 1963).

I. The purpose of the Peoples' Diplomacy Organization is to promote fair and ethical standards and practices within the play-by-mail hobby, and to help maintain and support needed hobby groups within the records and services committees. It is not the intent of PDO to create a hierarchy but to serve its membership.

II. PDO is organized into three branches: the administrative, the deliberative and the judicial. Each functions independently within a system of checks and balances.

A) The administrative branch of PDO is composed of three committees: the Records committee, the Services committee and Administrative committee.

1) The Records committee consists of six Bureaus: the Boardman Number, the Miller Number, the Zins Directory, the Census, the North American Variant Bank and the Calhoun Point Count Bureau. The Chief Executive of the Records Committee is always the Boardman Number Custodian.

2) The Services committee consists of four Bureaus: the Orphans', the Game Openings, the Ombudsman Services System and the Women's Bureau. The Chief Executive of the Services Committee is always the Orphans' Bureau Co-ordinator.

3) The Administrative committee consists of three Bureaus: the Membership, the Elections and the Information Bureau. The Chief Executive of the Administrative Committee is always the Chairman of the Membership Bureau.

4) The Chief Executive of the Administrative branch of PDO is always the Grand Kommissar, who is elected by the Grand Council. He serves a 12 month term. He helps to enunciate policy with the help of the Grand Council through the issuance of policy papers on matters important to PDO.

B) The deliberative branch of PDO is composed of one Grand Council and 12 regional Zone Councils.

1) Each registered member of PDO is a voting member of the Zone Council in which he lives. Boundaries of Zones may be changed with the approval of the Grand Council and Grand Kommissar. Each Zone Council elects a Zone Kommissar who in effect serves as spokesperson for his Zone and who serves in the Grand Council. Zone Kommissars serve a one year term.

2) Each Zone Kommissar serves a one year concurrent term in the Grand Council, where they elect a Grand Kommissar and are responsible for representing the members of their Zone. PDO policy is approved by the Grand Council, though enunciated by the Grand Kommissar.

C) The judicial branch of the PDO is composed of the Judicial Panel, which consists of five members selected by the Grand Kommissar with the approval of the Grand Council. Panel members serve eight month terms and are empowered to deliberate and rule officially on matters of fair and ethical standards and practices in the pba hobby.

III. Matters of administrative, deliberative and judicial detail are determined by the policy papers of the Grand Kommissar with the approval of the Grand Council. Items covered in Sections I, II and III of this Manifesto may be amended by a three-quarters majority vote in the Grand Council.

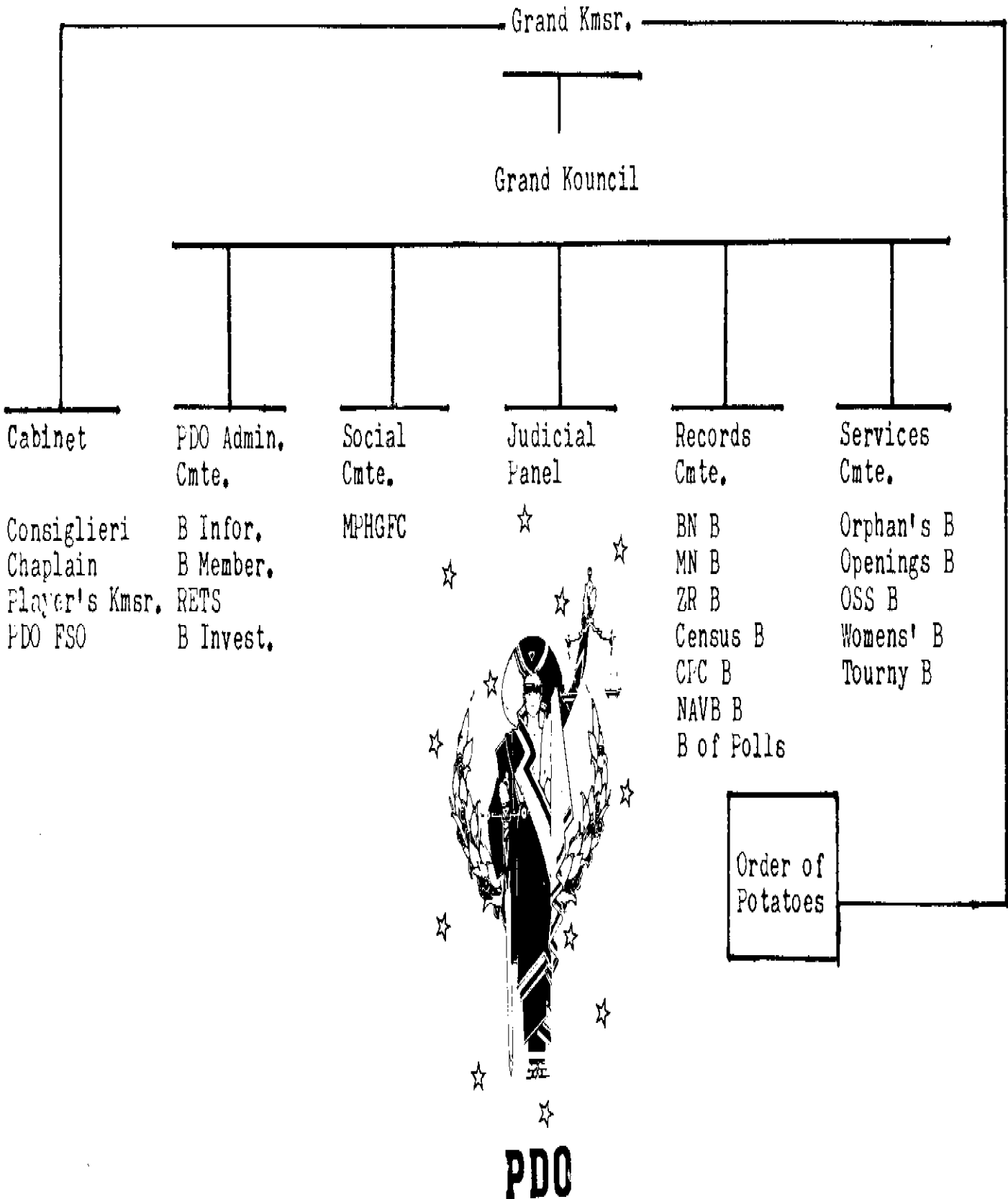

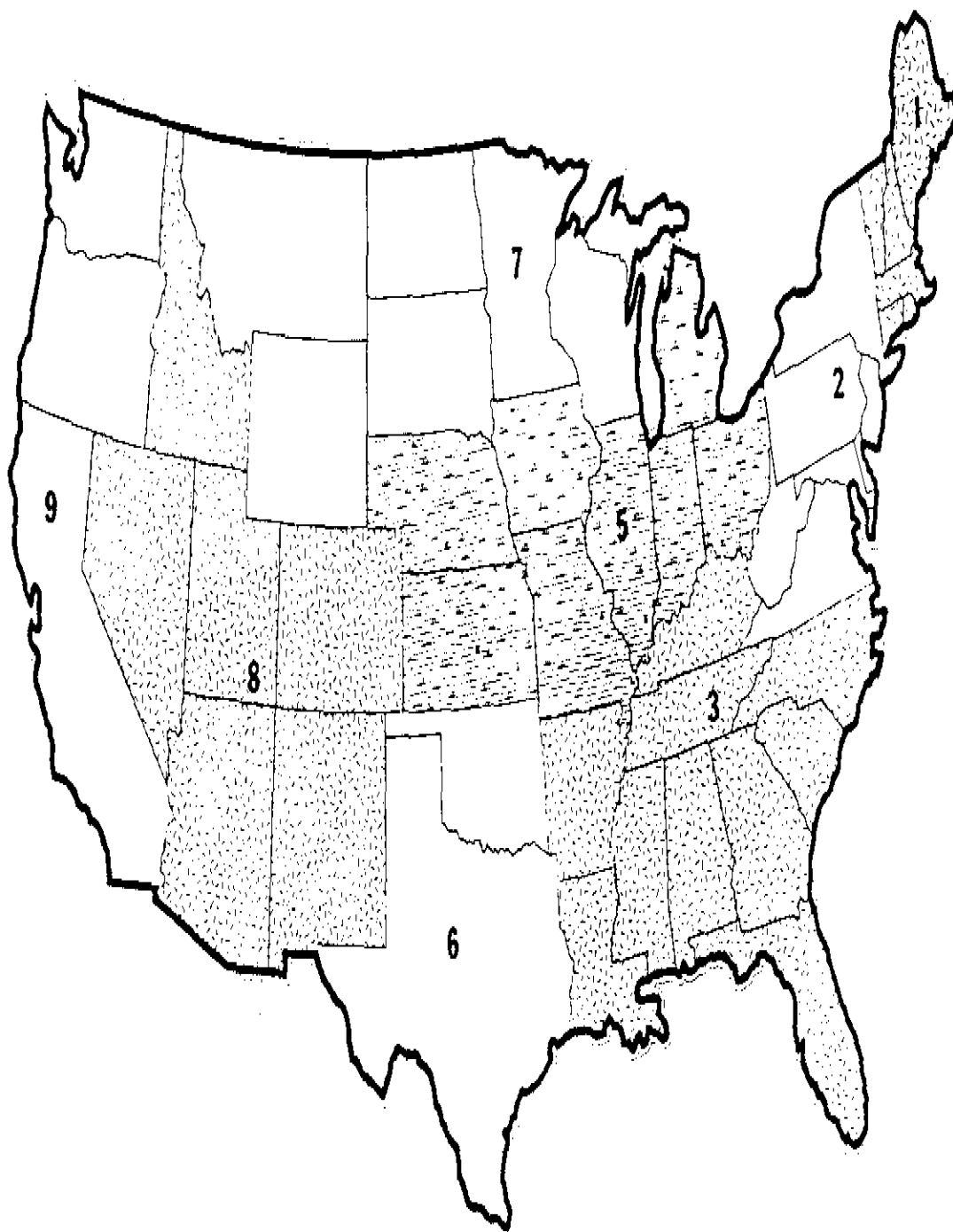

SEB: Last season there was a miscalculation regarding the piastre. It was listed as .73Sf, when it should have been 1.03Sf because I didn't tally the PIGs 3000Tp buy. Sales of Tp were put through at the 1.03 level and no buys were recorded. The firm of BG BAHL has resigned its position in the SEB and we're dividing their assets up and giving each remaining boursier a fourth of it. Therefore, next season you can add the following to your totals above before trading: 1002Ak, 360€, 1780F, 124DM, 498R, 128Tp, and 2.25Sf.
