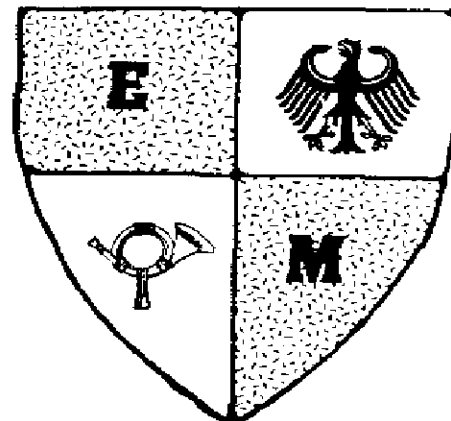

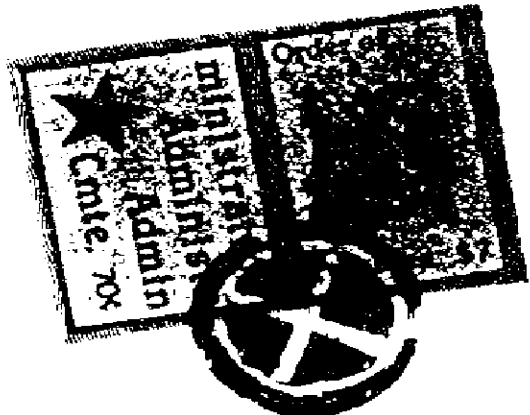

Grand Kommissar Policy Paper 072584: Funding Levels For Bureaus From The Second PDORA.

Four out of five members of the PDORA Funding Committee tendered in recommendations to the G.K. Their recommended funding levels are given below.

The USOS decided that it did not need such a large amount of money as they received last auction and have asked for a fixed money amount of \$25ish.

The BNC has recommended that the PDORA retain the monies due that Bureau until such time as they are officially requested.

No agreement on the funding of the KGO, ZR, IDHOF, Census, or Novice Packet was reached as the above testify.

Therefore, the funding levels of Bureaus from the Second PDORA are:
BNC, 42% MNC, 15% PONTEVEDRIA, 10% USOS, \$25ish.

Thus, 25% of PDORA monies will be paid out immediately. \$25ish will go to USOS. 42% will be held for the BNC, and the balance will remain with the PDORA, pending confirmation of recommendations.

Therefore, I make the following recommendations for the 33% balance of PDORA funds unassigned: 1) that \$15-18 be given to D.I.P., and 2) the balance of that be split evenly between the Census and Novice Packet.

MICHAELIUS RESIGNATION STUNS THE EMPIRE!

News of the sudden withdrawal of Michaelius from the campaign for Emperor has been positively confirmed by our B&C correspondent in Massilia, where the Governor made the official announcement of his resignation. Effectively immediately, he is surrendering his governorships of Gallia, Germania, and Noricum to pursue a career in the private sector.

B&C has also learned from highly-placed sources in Roma that a successor has already been chosen. Praetor EARL ANDERSON, who has distinguished himself in numerous assignments throughout the Empire, has been hand-picked to assume control of the provinces. He inherits a well-established post from the departing Michaelius, and whether he keeps intact the Allegantia Sidamericus or unfurls his own faction banner remains to be seen. His strategy planning sessions are already underway at his temporary headquarters at 5 PINE VIEW TERRACE, PEBBLE CREEK, TAYLORS, SC 29687.

Thus far, the unexpected news has left the Empire virtually paralyzed. Praetorian observers report a minimum of troop movement, most of it appearing to be cautious, uncertain, or defensive in nature. Technically, neutrality has remained in effect; Sidamerican cohorts were ordered to stand down during the political upheaval there, and the Severi command has yet to mobilize its forces. Nonetheless, legion HQs from Memphis to Eboracum have begun sounding the call for barbarian volunteers.

Even more alarming is the report of the first border incident in the Central Provinces. The Populares' touted Iron Legion, led by Germanicus, attempted to slip across the Dacian frontier into the unprotected city of Maissus. The force turned back to Dalmatia when confronted by a contingent of Praetorian peacekeepers.

Also adding fuel to the fires of speculation was an unexplained mission by Lusitanian imperators Branta and Sirkot. They were last reported in the Gallian port of Micaea, without a military escort. Were they delayed in an intended visit to Roma for the upcoming Senate session? And was their route through the Gallian capital in the midst of the recent abdication merely a coincidence?
