On July 28, 1914 Europe went to war in the massive orgy of destruction that has come to be known as World War I. Through almost two-thirds of the conflict America remained neutral. Why did this nation eventually go to war? Who caused this great decision to be made; one that changed modern history?. The blame, if any, should weigh heavily on the shoulders of then President, Woodrow Wilson.

When war broke out Wilson, along with his deeply pacifistic Secretary William Jennings Bryan, seemed committed to neutrality. Wilson on August 4 issued his "Proclamation of Neutrality" and on the 19th gave a solemn speech asking all Americans to be "impartial in thought as well as in action." Wilson also affirmed the rights of neutral nations to carry non-war goods and protested whenever these rights were infringed upon by either Germany on England.

Indeed, the nation was as neutral as Wilson wanted. It was true that many Americans hoped that the Allies would be victorious. Yet, this hope was not to be confused with a desire to join the fray. There was even a sizeable anti-British majority among Irish and German Americans. Many people thought that the war would burn itself out and the combatants would come to their senses. There was a confusion of values. On the one hand the Democracies of Britian and France were fighting the Monagahies of Germany and Austria. Yet Russia fought with the Allies and to be sure she was no land of the free. Also, was not Germany the land of Beethoven and culture? Teddy Roosevelt even praised the Germans as "strong and virile".

Yet this public opinion changed. The main reason for this has that after the Atlantic cable was cut and the naval blockade of Germany complete, the only source of information about the war came from 10 Downing St. The pictures of the belligerents became one dimensional thanks to masterful British propaganda. The Germans became despotic murderers of school children and rapers of French women. The British became "our brothers fighting for Freedom". The French were transformed into a bunch of brave Lafayettes. The Russians became the helpers of the North during the American Civil-War.

However a great leader should not be fooled as easily as a reader of a Hearst newspaper. Wilson was also unneutral in action. He tried to get Britian to agree to the Declaration of London of 1909 which stated that neutral nations could transport peaceful goods to belligerents. Britian refused and Wilson backed down. This was in fact a deadly blow to Germany since this meant that no American goods could be shipped to Germany. If this was not enough, trade with the Allies rocketed from a pre-war \$824.8 million to an astronomical \$3,214,500 per year. Bryan tried to remain neutral by banning loans to combatants, but by 1915 this was disgarded.

That Britian was able to succeed with her brazen stragulayion of trade with Germany was astounding. Yet, it must be pointed
out that Wilson's passivity and weakness were not the only
causes. Britian did an incredible job of justifying her actions
by seizing American shipping headed for Germany, or her neighbors
like Denmark. First of all she always did so in legal terms, always
presenting the proper documents. She alluded to Lincoln's block-

ade of the South during the American Civil War.

Britian also took care not to insult any major group in the US which had the political power to fight back. Finally, the strangulation of trade was done very slowly and gradually. This does not let Wilson off the hook. If he truely wanted to be neutral, he would have threatened to join the Central Powers if Britian did not back down. Instead he acquiesed.

Whatever British actions were, they had not costs Americans one life. Germany soon realized that since the High Seas Fleet was a flop, as Jutland had proved, then the only recourse was the submarine. America complained that this sort of war was unfair. America said that Germany must give all merchant ships warning, giving the crew time to evacuate. Yet Britian used Q-ships disguised as merchantmen so that any U-Boat commander fool enough to give warning would be sunk in short order.

In August 1915 the passenger "Arabic" was sunk, and America went to the verge of war. Germany hastily reconciled and made the "Arabic Pledge", stating that unresisting liners would not be sunk without warning. In Feb 1915 the French liner "Sussex" was sunk by a German sub. Wilson blustered and threatened to cut off diplomatic relations. This time the Germans put all their cards on the table. They stated that they would end the unrestricted submarine warfare if and only if America would stop playing favorites and force England to submit to International Law. Wilson refused. It is now incomprehensible that Wilson continued to allow Americans to sail into combat waters and then cry "Tour" when they were torpedoed.

Wilson in name still proclaimed neutrality. He ran for re-election under the "He kept us out of the war" ticket in 1916. In his famous January 1917 address to Congress he stated that Europe must accept "peace without victory". This was not to be. In the next monthsa series of events was to thrust America into the war.

On Feb 1 Germany launched an all-out submarine offensive to drive England out of the war. On Feb 3 the USS Houatonic was sunk by a U-Boat after the ship had been warned and she failed to respond. Diplomatic relations with Germany were then broken. There also were wild rumors of German sabotuers after a munitions dump in NJ exploded under unexplained circumstances. Also in March the Tsar was overthrown, leaving the Aliies pure democrats. Finally there was that mistical piece of paper, the Zimmermann Telegram. It was a document that which the British said revealed a possible German-Mexican alliance to attack the SW US.

Thus by April 5, 1917 America and its leaders had been convinced that the nation must go to war in order to make the world safe for Democracy. I ask what Democracy? Would it have been so bad for Germany to have won the First World War? Why didn't Wilson realize that this was one case when George Washington was right when he said that this country must not enter into Ventang ing alliances". We did and we have been paying for it ever acce.

Austria: The Righteous Nation

Before you read this go back and look at Austria in the games contained within. (dum-de-dum). Pretty awful right? Except for 76BD. The fact of the mattr is, that the traits needed to guide the other six powers to prominence—patience and compromise with neighbors do not work well with the Hapsburg Empire.

Sitting on top of the Balkan Knot and the crossraods of East and West, Austria is all too vulnerable with only units. Her shipping power is hampered because she has only one port, which is usually garrisoned against the Pone

one port, which is usually garrisoned aginst the Pope.

Thus, Austria's direct course to victory is not quiet diligent compromise, but exploitive brinksmanship. The first necessity is to gain Gre and Ser without letting the Italians, Russians or Turks advance on the homeland: you have to convince everyone that you are his ally. At the same time you must see to it that Russia goes to the north, so as to easily tempt Turkey into the Black Sea (remember you're Turkey's ally.)

Naturally, the other powers on the board are doing much to same thing, but only Austria does it for survival.

Hopefully around Fall 1902 Austria will have expanded to include Bulgaria in her Empire, and Italy has moved to The East Med. Austria now has some security, but it is still a turkey to the birds of prey because its units are needed in the Balkan penninsula and the frontier mountain ranges of the Tyrolia and Galicia.

The Tsar's price in this madness is help vs Turkey and letting Rumania go Russian, though as The Sultan's ally you could see to it that custodianship of Rumania was given to you,

since you're Russia's ally, and together you will stop the Infidel.

The main premise in Austria's plan must be expansion costs. So what if you make enemies. If you have the edge they do to you?


