Roy Matheson(Byers, Colorado): 'Do you have provisions for calling a player collect
in the event that you do not receive his moves?'

<u>Jeff Sandelin</u>(Ft. Collins, Colorado): 'I did'nt notice any comments on NMR insurance. Will you have it? I was burned last issue of <u>Raging Main</u> by the U.S. Postal Service and am all for the insurance.'

Ken Peel (Silver Spring, Maryland): 'I hear from Roy ((Matheson)) that you may go to Germany if not Officer Candidate School? What will that do to your publishing/GM activities?'

((First, I have no provisions for NMR insurance. I feel that a play-by-mail game should be just that. A Play-By-Mail game, not by phone, semephore, ESP, etc. Also, I expect to PCS (undergo a Permanent Change of Station) in May, to either Germany (actually I have about a 10% chance of getting stationed in any NATO country) or to OCS. I won't know which until late April at the very earliest, which is frustrating, to say the least. If I go to Germany I just found out that I must spend at least 5/6 of my tour before attending a service school (OCS), so I'm desparate to get into it now, before I leave for overseas. Since I'm scheduled to spend 29 months overseas I'm looking a two years before going to school.

I don't have a phone, because I live alternatly in Barracks and Hotels, and calling collect from a pay phone is undesirable because of noise, etc. When and if I go to OCS or overseas I'll be unable to call anyway, so I decided to not use NMR insurance.

If I go overseas the only effect I expect on my GMing habits is to lengthen the game turnaround by a week to 6 weeks. Since I've been doing effectively that anyway there should'nt be to much difference.

Anyway, Gary Coughlan says that I'll probably be the first North American to be publishing overseas, North Americans will be able to mail to my APO (Army Post Office) in New York, and Europeans will be able to send mail dirrectly to my unit in Germany, so European subscriptions will be at a reduced rate.))

Gary Coughlan (Memphis, Tennessee): 'Got TEJTM today. Hopefully you have my orders already ((for Der Fuhrer)). Did you get the Europe postcard as well? Let me know. Here is a xerox of my copy of Ya'all. I think Mike Mazzer did it. It's really very good. Happy Holidays!'

((Yes, I got your orders. No, I did'nt receive the postcard. Jack Fleming wrote me a letter, and sent it to me five times before I got it, so your postcard is probably in some dead letter box some where. On Ya'all, it was very well done, but one thing throws me. Once in the press for Free for All (1981IX) in Paranoiacs' Monthly someone suggested I do a 'Poll Poll.' Mike Mazzer and I do not have very much contact, and I don't know if he subscribes/ed to PM, so I have my suspicions.))

Ken Peel (See Above): 'I just wanted to drop you a line and let you know how much I am enjoying being an 'ender.' ...or is it a 'meanie?' Hey, just what are us TEJTM'ers called anyway? But whatever, you have a friendly and comfortable 'zine, even for a closet Democrat such as myself.'

((You know, this guy writes me more than Guy Vander Jagt, Chairman of the Republican National Committee. Guess Who (Not the Group): 'Let me compliment you again on how well-written and enjoyable your zine is. There are a couple of publishing styles that get under my skin. One is the pubber who thinks he is so humorous, and his life is so interesting, that all subbers ever get is narcissistic babbling. A few, of course, do genuinly pull it off, but the number who succeed are far fewer than the number who try. The other style is that of the pubber as ponderous, pompous omnipotent personality. There are those who write to posterity rather than their subbers, and get into the trap of GM-as-god.

'Of course, there is a flip side. I have both GM'ed postally, and hosted many FTF games. Each have their specific problems. But as for PEM, players naturally expect serious intent, and timely and accurate adjudication on the part of the GM. As well they should. But the contract is two-way: I believe the GM is equally justified in expecting on the part of the player serious intent and willingness to play out even a less than brilliant position. I cannot understand how some players enter so many games and expect to be able to keep up with them all.'

((I must agree with you about Publishing and editorial styles, and many zines I receive just get a quick perusal then get buried in my files. Some of them I just don't like, but only continue to receive them because of Mutual Subscriptions and because I don't like to throw anything away. I feel pubbers should write for the subbers, not for themselves. Your second paragraph brings home a point I've been meaning to mention, but have just not had time to write about. When I joined the hobby I started in 3 games, and quickly picked up 5 standby positions. Clearly I was overloaded, and my playing has suffered. I've never been eliminated, but I could barely keep up with the games. Now I'm back down to 3, and that is still one game to many. As a GM I try to get the results of the previous turn back to the player as soon as possible. Right now my publishing is erratic because of service commitments, but to get around that I lengthen the deadline to a guesstimate of when I'll be in El Paso. I would never shorten a deadlin to less time than stated in my Houserules.))

First, let me explain the notation. PARTY (Name) PLATFORM ISSUE expenditures. For example, Gary is the Social Democrat campaigning on the Liberal platform. In East Prussia he spoke on the issue of Versailles, spending 1 Propaganda Point in the province. He also sent 1 Street mob to break up the the Nationalist's rally. He called out the Army to protect his campaign staff, spending the required PP and an additional point as well. He also attempted to Rally Pan the Coalition, spending only the required PP. The underline means he failed to ban the COAL. Total PPs spent this turn were 5. By Calling out the Army, Gary neutralized 10 SMs.
