Once each name on the list has been used once, I will go to the top and start again. New names will be added to the bottom of the rotation list.

There is, by the way, nothing in my HRs which prevents a player from playing two or more positions in the same game, so long as he does not do so simultaneously. However, I will not put a player into a game he has already been in once unless he is the only name left on that cycle of ro-

tation

By lot, the cycle of rotation for players on my current list is esetablished as follows: McCullam, Gemignani, Payne, Hessel, Hinton, Wan, Nyderek. A player is considered to have been "used" when he actually takes over a position in a game as a replacement.
