I recently received a letter from a publisher who told me that he has been sending his trade copies to John Weswig and that he would inform me when he stops publishing. I am glad that he wrote and let me know why I was not receiving copies of his zine (I had him listed as a questionable trader, which I guess is why he wrote). But in my reply to him I stated to him that all trade copies should be sent to me, not Weswig; a fact that I had previously thought I had yelled probably far more than enough. But apparently not. So, one more time: please send all trade copies of your zines to me (Doug Beyerlein) and not to John Weswig. I am the one who has the unfortunate task of keeping track of who is publishing and who is not and what is happening in each zine. And if I receive nothing from a publisher in over two months then I must assume the worst and place the publisher on the questionable trade list. Then if two more months come by and there is still nothing I can only report that the publisher has apparently gone defunct unless I hear convincing evidence otherwise. Past experience has shown too many times that a publisher, even with the best of intentions, will fold without telling a soul. I can probably count on one hand the number of cases where that has not been true. So please don't ask me to believe that you are still publishing a zine if I don't see anything from you in a four-month period. Facts are facts and lets play it that way.

Available from me are a limited number of photocopies of the Terminus Listing (game finishes 1963-1970, compiled by Walt Buchanan) for \$6.00 a set and game results from EVERYTHING #1-18 (selected pages from those issues), also for \$6.00 a set. With these two booklets of game results (90 pages each) and issues of EVERYTHING #19 to present (available from Weswig at 50¢ each) you can obtain a

complete collection of the games rated in the Postal Diplomacy Rating Commission's Standard Rating Base. For anyone interested in designing their own rating system this information is a must.

Your friend and mine, the United States Postal Service, went to court and got their planned rate increase right on schedule, as you all should now know. And indications are that the extra revenues generated by this increase will not come even slightly close to offsetting the deficit the U.S.P.S. is faced with. Future possibilities are more postage increases and the elimination of Saturday mail delivery. All in all not very good. So, if you want to save a little I suggest that you send your trade copies to me via third class mail. The current third class rate is zero to two ozs - 13¢. Each additional oz. is 10½ cents more. Most zines hit just below the one ounce mark and therefore I suggest that bundles of two issues is probably most economical. Some traders do this now. However, remember that I like to see something from each of you at least once every two months, so send me something at least that often. And for you traders, in whose zines I am playing, don't go to third class mail. Sound okay to everyone?

During the past month I found some free time to compile some game start statistics. Much of that work is still going on, but I have finished enough to look at game starts by country from 1963 through 1975. The results are interesting and somewhat surprising. I thought over everything and then wrote an article on my findings. You can read it in the coming issue of DIPLOMACY WORLD, published by Walt Buchanan. I am interested in whatever comments you might have and will include them in the next issue of EVERYTHING. I assume that all of you publishers trade or send your zines to Walt Buchanan in exchange for DIPLOMACY WORLD, but if not I strongly suggest that you do so. Walt tries to collect all of the zines for the archives that he maintains for the hobby. If you publish something then he would like a copy. So start a trade with him, help the archives, and receive DIPLOMACY WORLD in exchange. Its a good deal.

Something that has nothing to do with Diplomacy, but still might interest you, is the fact that yesterday (5 February) we awoke to a record snowfall for the San Francisco Bay Area (Randolph Smyth, please take note). It was the heaviest snowfall in the past 89 years. In Palo Alto and at Stanford University, through which I ride my bicycle to work, the snow was a quarter to half an inch deep. On the higher terrain the snow was obviously deeper and some roads were closed in the hills. For you who live in real winter country you will only laugh at what we call a heavy snowfall, but for this area where last weekend the temperature was in the 70s and people were out getting suntans by their swimming pools, it was quite an event. Now the sun is out again and the temperatures are rising and within a week we will surely return to our perpetual summer. Ah, it is a rough life...

And now from Russell Fox:

I am just about finished for discussions or commentary in this issue, but there is one last thing of interest. Ron Kelly, in a letter dated 14 November 1975, asked how anonymous games are handled by the BNC. Richard Sharp, in the National Games Club (U.K.) zine, Dolchstoss, brought up the same subject recently. So, apparently a few words on the topic are needed.

Anonymous games of postal Diplomacy are games in which the players' identities are known only to the gamesmaster. All diplomacy, therefore, must be routed through the gm and the zine in which the game is being played. Only at the finish of the game are the players' identities revealed. Richard Sharp believes that anonymous games are closer to the true ideal of pure diplomacy as they remove the interactions of player bias, conflicts in personalities, and the like. Therefore, he suggests that these games be rated along with standard postal Diplomacy games in which the players know each other's identity.

Since the late 1960s when variants were first split off from regular Diplomacy and assigned their own Miller Numbers anonymous games have always been considered variants and given Miller Numbers. That is still the case today. Anonymous games are therefore not rated by any of the members of the PDRC. Because of Richard Sharp's desire to have Boardman Numbers for his anonymous games he was assigned such by Richard Walkerdine, the associate custodian for the U.K. However, these games have an irregular notation attached to them so as to warn ratingskeepers of their irregularity. Ratingskeepers still have the option of rating anonymous games, or any other irregular games if they wish. But in North America (and I don't know about the U.K.) none do rate anonymous games.

That doesn't counter Sharp's argument regarding anonymous games, but it does show that a precedent has long been established for anonymous games as far as North American ratingskeepers are concerned. However, that does not stop the NGC ratingskeeper from rating the anonymous games in question. That decision is completely left to each ratingskeeper.

The above is pretty much what I told Richard Sharp in a recent letter and as yet I have not a reply. If anything of importance happens on this subject in the future I will pass the word along.

For me, Doug Beyerlein, that ends another issue of EVERYTHING. John Weswig should, however, have something to say on subscriptions and the like. See you all in May.
