Much has happened since the last issue of Everything in July. Marie and I had a great trip to the East Coast, visiting friends and relatives, seeing historical sites (Colonial Williamsburg in Virginia is a must), and attending Origins II and DipCon IX. At the DipCon we had a good time seeing old friends and making new ones, although I wish that there had been more time to talk with some of you who were there but I may never even had a chance to meet. I played in the Diplomacy tournament, as I do every year, and finished in a tie for 11th place with an eight unit Germany and a 12 unit Turkey. If there had only been a third round... Since we returned from the DipCon Marie and I have been active in bicycle touring events. We have now done four centuries (100 miles in one day) at L.A.W. sanctioned tours, and last Saturday we did a double metric century (200km or 128 miles). Add 4000 feet of elevation gain (most of it after riding 80 miles previous to the real hill climbing) and do it all in less than 12 hours. It is a lot rougher than talking your way through two rounds of Diplomacy. Also, it takes away from time that could be spent on typing this -- and now you know why I enjoy bicycling so much. Oh, and a postscript on the 200 km ride: Marie was the only women to complete the entire distance. And you thought that I only married her because of her Diplomacy skills.

I had a discussion with Don Greenwood at the DipCon. We talked about the relative merits of the Boardman Numbers and the possible Avalon Hill subsidy. At that time no decision was made by Avalon Hill. However, since then Greenwood, through various letters to myself and Walt Buchanan, has come to a final decision and has presented Avalon Hill's offer regarding Diplomacy World and the Boardman Numbers. Greenwood's letters discussing the Boardman Numbers and Everything and my decision can be found elsewhere in this issue. Your opinions on all of this are welcomed.

AVALON HILL AND EVERYTHING

Don Greenwood (30 August 1976): "I will stand on my earlier statements and that of my letter to 18 Aug to Walter Buchanan. I am NOT cutting out the Boardman Number subsidy - I AM cutting the total Diplomacy picture subsidy to \$800 annually. If you and Walter cannot agree on a satisfactory sharing of this subsidy it should not be referred to as cutting off the Boardman Numbers. I see no reason why the two magazines cannot be printed as one with considerable savings to all involved, despite the protests of both yourself and Walter.

"What I want is to see the DIPLOMACY hobby stand up on its own feet and amount to something. I believe I've stated that well in the first paragraph of the above mentioned letter to Walter ((see below)).

"If cutting the purse strings is the only way to make Diplomacy enthusiasts stand up and do something for their hobby, then it should have been done long ago.

"I have the warmest regards for you and the efforts you've made for the postal Diplomacy hobby, but you must understand that no other hobby group (of which there have been dozens in the past and present) has ever even applied for financial support let alone received it. If the postal Diplomacy hobby is worth having, then its members should quit their petty politicking, get together and support an organization, which in turn can give them the hobby they want. I stand on that statement."

Don Greenwood (letter to Walt Buchanan dated 18 August 1976): "Also note the change in Clause 3 pertaining to Douglas Beyerlein. I do not like to see Doug cut out of the subsidy picture entirely as I feel that the Boardman Numbers are every bit as important as DIPLOMACY WORLD. However, I am also just as resolute in my feeling that if the DIPLOMACY enthusiasts of the IDA ever want their hobby to amount to anything they're going to have to stand on their own two feet and run their own affairs. I'm firmly convinced that unless the IDA asserts itself now with full Avalon Hill support that it will never become more than a soapbox for petty politicking. In short, I want to see the IDA finally come up with a worthwhile program and support the Boardman Numbers systems. I recently delivered a check to Edi Birsan for \$360.00 as the proceeds of the DIPLOMACY tournament. I also understand that he took in an additional \$80 from standby entries. This means that the IDA took in close to \$450.00 at this tournament alone and this money by itself could support the Boardman Numbers for two years. Unless the members of the IDA are willing to stand up and pay part of the load for their own hobby I fail to see where this hobby is worth supporting. Any hobby or Interest Group is only as good as the amount of work and sacrifice willing to be put into it by its enthusiasts. If DIPLOMACY enthusiasts have so little regard for their pastime that they are not willing to support themselves in such minimal fashion then I can't help but think that the total DIPLOMACY hobby is unrealistic. Please relay my feelings in this regard to Douglas and other key members of the DIPLOMACY hobby. I'm confident that you are the individual worthy of our trust that will overcome the considerable difficulties involved and set the IDA and the DIPLOMACY hobby on the right course."

And that is the word from Avalon Hill after meeting with them at the DipCon. I can either use the pages of Diplomacy World (taking up a quarter to a third of it with Boardman Number business) or go my own route. As you probably know, I have always preferred the second option. Thus, some changes will need to be made. I have given this plenty of thought, asked around for input (and thus the recent questionnaire), and have now made a decision on how to finance the Boardman Numbers and EVERYTHING in light of Avalon Hill's above stated decision. But lets start this on a new page.

As of 1 September 1976 the Boardman Number Custodian and associate custodians (excluding Walkerdine in the UK) will charge a fee of one dollar (U.S.) or comparable foreign currency for the assignment of a Boardman Number. This fee will be voluntary until 1 November 1976; after that date the fee will be mandatory. This fee must be included with the request for a Boardman Number. The fee can be paid by anyone (gamesmaster, player, or players, or whomever), but it must be forwarded through the gamesmaster/editor/publisher of the zine in which the game will be played along with the other information which is required for a Boardman Number. The fee must be paid by the Fall 1901 season of the game in question. Any game without a Number will not be reported in EVERYTHING after it has finished. Thus, unnumbered games will probably not be included in rating lists.

Perhaps this sounds rather drastic, but I believe it to be the one way that distributes the cost among almost everyone (14¢ per player per game) and is, therefore, the one financial solution to the cost of publishing EVERYTHING and running the Boardman Numbers. This system is not being made mandatory immediately so as to give everyone time to adjust their game fees and tell their prospective players. Some will not like this solution (unfortunately you cannot please everyone) and will not apply for Boardman Numbers after October. If you decide to go this route then please tell your players that either one of them has to come up with an extra buck or nobody is going to get credit for the game when it finishes. If that is agreeable with them then great. But I do not want players writing me at the conclusion of a game saying that they didn't know that their unnumbered game wasn't going to be rated, because if they do you know who I am going to dump on.

Gamesmasters/publishers when applying for a Boardman Number can send either cash or check or stamps. However, sending cash through the mails is not advised and obviously I cannot make any guarantees about receiving it. If you know that you are going to start a number of games in the near future then you can send extra funds to cover the fees of the later starting games. John Weswig will handle your money in his typical professional CPA style. Excess funds can be refunded at any time. Checks can either be made out to myself (Doug Beyerlein), John Weswig, or Chintimini Enterprises for U.S.A. based games. Canadians should deal with their associate custodian (Doug Ronson). Foreign gamesmasters can use the ISE (although I am not sure that Birsan is still running it) or send funds directly to Weswig. Money sent to me will be forwarded to Weswig and requests for Boardman Numbers sent to Weswig will be forwarded to me. So no matter to whom you send things they will get to the right person. But remember, all trades must go to me, Doug Beyerlein.

All games started in Britain and assigned Boardman Numbers by Richard Walkerdine are excluded from the fee because the great majority of British zines do not trade for EVERYTHING. They receive instead Walkerdine's The Finishing Touch, the cost of which is not paid for by the Boardman Number treasury. Thus, I leave it to Walkerdine to handle his own expenses and funding. The rest of the world (U.S., Canada, France, Switzerland, Sweden, and Australia) all receive EVERYTHING and thus should help to support it.

While the above is to be the official policy of the Boardman Number Custodian at this time I am not completely inflexible to suggested changes or ideas. Also, if an alternative source of funding becomes available (such as, complete funding by IDA) then the policy may be revised. Otherwise, we are stuck with the above. Questions???

In the last issue of Everything along with the poll results were some selected comments that people sent in. Bob Hartwig made a statement there that he wishes to discuss in more detail. His letter follows.

Bob Hartwig (5 August 1976): "Concerning my blatantly emotional remarks on Avalon Hill's incorporation of Diplomacy in the last issue of this publication, I wish to explain further.

"I wish to point out that I do not hate Avalon Hill or its owners/operators. To the contrary, I own several of their games and find them to be quite enjoyable, and probably better than most Simulations Publications (SPI) games. I question their refusal to mention SPI in THE GENERAL, but that is another story.

"My complaint with AH is the fact that the company is so terribly large. It is my understanding that they will do over \$3 million in business this year.

"Large companies tend, by the very fact of their size, to become isolated from their customers. This can cause the company to make unsound decisions, and ones that their customers may not need or want.

"This is the point that I am trying to bring out. When Games Research had Diplomacy, we didn't have to fear anything, because GRI never was that big as far as I know, and because they weren't terribly worried about what happened to their game, since it was in the hands of only a very few, avid fans who really cared about it.

"Now AH hopes to flood the market (why else would they buy the game?). With that will come more players, more need for good organization (thank goodness for the new constitution), and more distant relations with Avalon Hill, hence what I see to be the problem.

"I feel that we can get along with AH, but what we will need is a good, strong, viable, hobby-wide organization (such as the new IDA-NA), which will maintain close and constant ties and communication with Avalon Hill, with the understanding that the Diplomacy hobby should be left to its own designs, without a lot of controls set by AH. I fear the result if any different course of action should be taken."
