Well, it looks like I'll have plenty of space this issue for things besides game starts and reports, and to me, that's what it's all about. First, I'll give you the news that has come in since last issue.

I suppose the big news is that Doug Ronson has resigned from his post as associate custodian for Canada effective today, Jan 1/78. Doug is to be thanked for his efforts over the last two years and I'm sorry to see him go. As of now, I don't believe that a replacement will be necessary. I can handle the thirty odd game starts that we generate per year. If anybody is interested in the job, let me know and you'll be seriously considered. You should live in Canada, though. Oh, you knew that? Okay... (Ron Kelly)

Last issue I printed the statement that I was cutting trades with my personal zine, Electra Glide Blue. I tried to make damn sure that people would not think I was cutting trades for Everything, but it seems that some people did anyway. Please note the following. All trades for Everything are in effect and will be honoured by me. It is my personal zine Electra Glide Blue which is not available for trade. Thanks to Jerry Jones for pointing out that there was confusion over my statement.

I want to thank Dave Ditter for being the only person to comment on last issue. This issue is therefore dedicated to him. Dave also pointed out that I did not print a subscription price for Everything last issue. This was actually on purpose. I hadn't figured out what I should charge then. Now I have Each 14 page issue costs me approx 22½ to 23½ ¢ each. Therefore I will set a sub rate of 8/\$2. This will cover the odd oversize issue plus the postal increase due in April plus keep things simple for me by having the same price as Electra Glide Blue. For those of you who hadn't notice Everything is now a monthly zine. This will up the cost slightly to me, which doesn't bother me too much, but which will spread the work out twice as thin which is a great help. I have put out two anniversary issues of zines in my time, one of 27pp and one of 50pp. If I published every two months, each issue would be about 30pp. Once a year, an issue that size, I can hack. Not 6 times a year.

For those of you who are interested in such things, the last number in 7 was 1977KY. That means that there were 311 games started ~~this~~ last year. Despite all the messes the hobby has gotten into in 77, the important things, the games, are stronger than ever. Viva Calhamer!

* But Had Better Sense Than To Ask.

I think that I should print a short biography of myself. Although I've been in the hobby three years today, I found a disconcerting number of unfamiliar names when I addressed Everything #35. And if I don't know you, you probably don't know me.

I am nineteen years (ya hear that? A kid!) old, I work for Grant Security on contract to the Department of Immigration. I work at a detention centre, where some of the illegal immigrants to Canada are held for deportation.

I enjoy this job because I have nothing to do in the way of real work. I kill the eight hours by reading, playing cards or more often now, doing the work that is essential to maintaining the Boardman Numbers. My job is probably the main reason that Doug Beyerlein figured I'd make a good successor. As far as education, I completed 9 years of grade school and 4½ years of high school before being thrown out for misconduct and chronic absenteeism. I am rather proud of the record I hold for having missed 142 classes in one term. Considering the fact that I was only taking three subjects this is pretty good.

My interests (here, I'm supposed to say "besides this insanity") include history (although another record I set in school was my third term history mark in grade 11. I scored 0.078%) centreing around the second world war and also ancient Greece, Rome and Carthage. I also enjoy archaeology. (Ron Kelly once sent me orders on the back of half a photocopied article about the steps in the descent of man. I asked him to send his next set of orders on the other half of the article. Instead he sent me about 10lbs of newspaper clippings, magazines, pamphlets and whatnot all on archaeology. Now he sends his orders on at least six sheets of archaeology related stuff) I am a big sports fan I am mostly into the participatory stuff, esp basketball and football but I also love watching hockey. (The Leafs rule.)

I came into the Diplomacy hobby via the flyer in the gamebox. I wrote to John Leeder and joined a novice game. This game is reported in this issue (75AE) After about six months, I decided that I wanted to publish a major zine (I told I was into participatory stuff) I joined with John Gross and we put out 45 magnificent issues of "Janus" including the 27 50 page anniversary issues I mentioned on the first page. After John went to university, Janus folded and I started Electra Glide Blue which means "In the Year of Our Motorcycle" in Latin. I have just put out the 13th issue two weeks ago. It is now monthly, but just may go twicemonthly again soon. I am playing in about eight games and am now GMing four having just farmed four out to guest GMs. I have GMed two games to completion including one fake game mentioned last issue.

Whither the Boardman Numbers? Well, I am going to try to do basically the same things mechanically that Doug Beyerlein did. Instead of writing down the methods he used as BNC, Doug sent me a cassette tape. Therefore, he was able to go into much more detail than would have been possible by writing. Since a large part of the work involved in being BNC is absorbed by the associate custodians, I expect that I shall be able to continue for at least 2-3 years after which I will review my commitment to the hobby.

So, therefore, the Numbers will remain mechanically about the same. The difference will be in the custodian. Doug Beyerlein was absolutely incredible in his ability to avoid trouble. My personality is such, though, that I am much too controversial a person to not have or express an opinion on anything. Therefore, the Numbers will probably seem more lively to many. Or maybe not the Numbers, but the Custodianship will anyway.

After reading that over, all I can say is that it is quite correct. Don't say I didn't warn you...
