Welcome, friends, to the zine that never ends! And with that line, stolen from an Emerson, Lake and Palmer concert, we get about the business at hand.

1. I have heard from a great many people that they did not get the game report section of Everything #34. In fact, some didn't even know that there was one. Yes, Virginia, there was a game section. It was printed by Cliff Mann. I received my copy about three weeks after E#34 part I. It ran 49 pages and contained game reports for 138 games as well as reports on 148 number assignments I do not have the back issues for this or any other issue of Everything, excepting #'s 35, 36, 37, so don't write me about it. As soon as I find out what has happened to #34, I will let you know. I believe that they were at least mailed as Cliff cashed Doug's cheque. What's the story, Cliff? Regarding the back issue situation, I am still waiting to hear from John Weswig. He is to send me back issues from #19-#33, as well as the BNC fund. As of the above date I have neither. I expect that they will arrive shortly.

2. Despite the number of reported games in #34 (138!), it is becoming quite apparent that a number of games have not been reported. For example, I give you the following letter from Alan Rowland: "...at the pace you are moving, I doubt if you'll ever catch up on finished game reports. For example the following is done showing 'zine, unreported game'":

Diplomacy world: 1976BG.

"These just happen to be picked from random issues in my files. I can think of at least 9 dozen more and I only get a dozen or so zines. Not that I'm concerned about, (sic) I'm just curious to see if you can and in what manner catch up."

Although I think that Alan is exaggerating about the number of games unreported, it is obvious that there are quite a few games hiding out, awaiting reporting. Of the games Alan mentions, 76BG, 75CF, & 74HW have been reported (in #34), but that still leaves half of his examples missing.

Here's the important part: As of this issue (#37), I am completely caught up in game reports AS FAR AS I KNOW. If you have GMed a game to completion and it hasn't been reported in Everything, PLEASE send me the game report so I can print it. There is a good chance that it appeared in #34. If so, I'll check it and let you know

((Very lucky. Your letter was the only received about #36 aside from one line comments.))

((Although I wonder about your apparent copyright of the term "America", I think that you're right. I didn't realize at the time the irony involved. Anybody from the bottom half of North America care to apply?))

((I've been collecting material for a scathing editorial about the current apathy in the hobby. That's what it is, y'know, apathy. People are too lazy to write letters to publishers ((No, I don't exclude myself. I'm basically the laziest bastard you'd ever wanna meet)) Until the hobby stops growing and shrinks to about one /third the size, we will not have the personability (is that a word?) that used to abound in the early days.))

From John Leeder: You wanted comments on Everything. I like the lighter touch. The ditto format is less "classy" but, I suppose, keeps costs down so it's a tradeoff? Can you get acceptable reproduction for that size a print run? The column system (as in The New Statsman) seems to leave fewer blank spaces, otherwise there's little to choose from in terms of design. I hate the games which overlap from one page to the next - makes it hell to do ratings. But this is a distinctly minority drawback.

To sum up, my only criticism is that the spirit duplication is not compatible with a "prestige" publication, if that is what we want Everything to be.

((The only comments expressed on the columnar versus linear formats, which didn't say "Use whatever you think best", were in favour of the New Statsman format. Unfortunately, I disagree. It's much harder to fit it in with 8 1/2 x 11 paper. Also, since I print the games in order, I have no control, such as printing "short" games to fill in blank spaces. Also, I get more games to the page using the linear format. So...if you like the NS format, send me some money...))

((Is a "prestige" publication really desirable? I can't help but think of what Fred Winter mentioned above in his letter about the hobby being too impersonable, or, in a word, too professional. I personally disagree that ditto is less "classy", but I know that some people think that ditto is the pits. Maybe if enough people are actually outraged, I could get Andy Webber to mimeo them off, but I am happy with ditto. Anybody agree with me? Disagree?))

From Elmer Hinton: I am pleased to offer on behalf of G.P.A. ((Gamesmasters Publishers Association. This is Elmer's little pride and joy which started out with high hopes of revolutionizing the hobby, but whose main virtue has been the salvaging of some orphan games and (another) variant numbering system,)) a subsidy to the offices of Boardman Number Custodian in the amount of 20¢ per Boardman Number assigned, payable no less frequently than annually, nor more frequently than monthly, after receipt of each issue reporting number assignments, in the minimum amount of \$1.00 to the maximum of 20¢ per number assigned, effective retroactively to the issue published January 1/78 which contained 14 assignments. 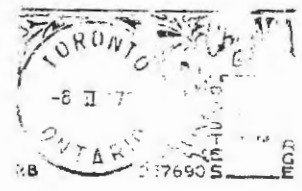
