The Back Issue File: Back issues are available at a cost of one 8¢ stamp to Gamesmasters, 20¢ to others. I have 16 copies of #1, 2 copies of #2, and 12 copies of #3 available.

The Backup Number Custodian System: I had previously announced my intention to develop a backup system to help ensure against any repetition of the chaos caused by Rod Walker's default from the hobby. This system will operate as follows:

I will appoint my successor now, subject of course to his concurrence. During my tenure as Custodian, I will forward to the Backup Custodian weekly reports of all numbering activity during the preceding seven days, said reports to be due on a schedule preset between the two of us. If for any reason no report is to be issued for a given week (for reasons of vacation, for example) the Backup Custodian is to be given advance notice.

If a weekly report is not received by the Backup Custodian within five (5) calendar days - excluding postal holidays - of the required date of issuance, the Backup Custodian will immediately notify the Custodian by letter of the non-receipt. If two consecutive weekly reports are found to be missing five calendar days after the required issue date for the second of them, the Backup Custodian will immediately attempt contact by telephone, telegraph, and/or registered mail with the Custodian to obtain an explanation. (Said explanation, if obtained, must include a pledge to issue an immediate summary of all activity during the missed period.) If, on the fifth calendar day following the required issue date of the third weekly summary in such sequence, no report has been received by the Backup Custodian, said Backup Custodian shall immediately assume full duties as Custodian of the Boardman Numbers.

The Backup Custodian may resign his position at any time by giving thirty days' notice to the Custodian. The Custodian may remove the Backup Custodian at any time by giving thirty days' notice and by naming a replacement successor. The first issue of Everything... following any such action must contain full details thereof.

*But Had Better Sense Than To Ask.

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At this time I announce the appointment as Backup Custodian of, and the acceptance of said appointment by, Fred C. Winter, 640 N. Henry St., Apt. #18, Madison, Wisconsin 53703. In so announcing I express my fullest confidence in the integrity and competence of Mr. Winter to handle the position of Custodian should such duty descend upon him. Under the terms of the Backup System detailed on the preceding page, if at any time any Gamesmaster receives notification from Mr. Winter that he has assumed the duties of Boardman Number Custodian, said Gamesmaster is instructed to act in accord with said notification immediately and thereafter.

It is assumed that there will be grumbles over this appointment. No matter whom I were to appoint, there would be protests. Be it stated clearly and unequivocally that I will honour, acknowledge, and pay heed to no such protests.

Final Decision on Symbol '§': Many suggestions have been received concerning this. I have considered them all, I assure you. Nonetheless I have decided to abandon the symbol '§' except for six-and five-men regular games conducted in accord with the commercial Rulebook. This means that Localised games, tournament series games, delayed games, partially-telephone games, and any other such 'irregular' games previously designated '§' will no longer receive this symbol. Ratingsmasters who wish to exclude certain types of games will be required to make their own judgments and investigations.

Orphan Games Project: Although the Orphan Games Resuscitation Project does not, strictly speaking, fall within the scope of Everything..., it seems reasonable to publish here a brief summary of activity of late, mostly for the benefit of those interested in having an orphan game to run (please ask, we need you), having an orphan game to be picked up, having a desire to see an old orphan restarted, or worrying about whether in fact anything is being done.

I began in earnest to develop the Orphan Games Project under my supervision on 6 November 1972. As of the cover date of this issue twenty-six days later, I have dispensed orphan games at the precise rate of one per day - twenty-four orphans from Rod Walker and two from John McCallum. Fourteen apparently viable games from older sources are currently receiving action. Roughly one dozen other possible orphans are currently under investigation. I estimate that all outstanding viable orphans will be transferred and under way within sixty days, and all or nearly all non-viable orphans will be rooted out, declared non-viable, and laid to rest; thus clearing the books for perhaps the first time in history.

Letters of enquiry on any aspect of this matter are appreciated and encouraged.
