End of the Year Report

The Office of BNC currently has on hand an operating capital of \$117.11 with which to start the year of 1988. Due note that this is in addition to those moneys set aside to cover our subscription obligation and transfer expenses, should they ever occur. As I mentioned before, the more active this Office becomes, the more expense it generates. However, looking at things as they now stand, I do not expect any difficulty meeting the financial obligations for 1988.

In light of our healthy financial condition, the price of EVERYTHING has been reduced. Should things improve more, the price will go down accordingly. To our resident accountant, PM, I hope this makes more sense than what we had published previously.

1988 Financial Matters

There has, of late, been a great furor raised by a member of members (?) of this hobby concerning the use of mandatory fees set by the CNC for the assignment of Boardman Numbers. I think it's time to identify this accusation for what it is - ridiculous. To the best of my knowledge, no one has ever charged for the assignment of a Boardman Number. I most certainly am not doing so now, nor do I intend to do so in the future.

There is no basis for this accusation. If such accusations continue, it is hoped they will be accompanied by some factual evidence rather than a fantasy.

1988 State of the Hobby

After the dismal showing in 1986 (94 games started), we have broken back over the 100 mark with 128 games started for the year of 1987. (This 128 represents the listed gamestart figure. We have a GM who, because of a grip he has with me (?), an anti-Dip attitude (?), a desire to be his own BNC (?), other (?), is refusing to list his games. If this situation changes, or I can get the information from alternate sources, space has been left to list these games, by me or some future BNC.

The Boardman Numbers

The Boardman Number Custodian (BNC) began recording games in 1963 with a game run by John Boardman in his zine, Graustark. Records have been kept from that time forward. In a few short years, the number of games recorded rose to over 100 per year, or well over 2,000 recorded games to date. The listings consist of who started the game, who played in the game, and how the game ended; and they are recorded for...posterity. The BNC is responsible for recording game starts, game finishes, and reporting them quarterly in his/her zine, EVERYTHING. The BNC is also responsible for determining whether the games were "local" and whether they were played in a "regular" manner.

The general criteria for the determination of a regular/irregular game are as follows:

1. Local game: 3 and/or more people live within 50 miles of one another or have local phone access. Note: Computer network games are considered a special class of game and not considered local.
2. Family Members in a Game: Two of the eight people involved in the game (the GM is the 8th) are related (parents, siblings, spouses, etc.).
3. Cross GM Violations: (for example) The GM is discriminating against 1 or more players. The GM is violating the rulebook to such an extent that the game is a variant. The GMing was so poor the game was unplayable. Some examples of "poor" are inconsistent rulings on similar situations, cheating, making major mid-game HR changes without player consent, violating player confidentiality...
4. Illegal player removal: The GM forcibly removes someone from a game without due cause. Some examples of due cause are: failure to submit moves, failure to meet financial obligations.
5. Inconsistent/annoyous Standby Policy: The GM must not change his SB policy (use or non-use) during a game. If SB's are used they must be known to the active players.
6. Playing more than 1 position (obvious).
7. GM is or becomes a player in the game.
8. Other...as circumstances present themselves.

The bottom line here is to use some common sense. Put yourself in the player's position and ask how you'd feel if it happened to you. You may also find that some people get caught up in the regularity-ratings thing. Again the bottom line here is the quality of the GM, not the rateability of the game. The criteria established above are not restrictive or all-inclusive. A GM who cannot, whether through irresponsibility, inexperience, or perhaps just outright stubbornness, run a regular game hurts both the players

and the hobby as a whole. They should be avoided like the plague.

Acquiring a BN is a very simple task. You need to submit your name and zine name (if any), the names of your players/addresses, and the list of who's playing what. There is no fee for acquiring a BN, although you may contribute to the BNC fund at this (or any other time). Mail the above information to me and I will mail a BN to you. You do not have to be a GM to register a game, any player may do so, so you players reading this make sure your game has a BN or know the reason why. Also, there are provisions for registering a game that may have started before a number was requested. In cases where a new GM didn't know about BNs, or an old one forgot, had a hard-case against the current BNC and refused, etc., are all reasons for acquiring a BN after the game begins.

Reporting an ended game is also a simple matter. You need but list the SC count for each ended Fall season; the people, including standbys, who played each country; and what happened to them (win, draw, drop, resign, out). For example:

The BNC's zine, EVERYTHING, publishes the above information along with hobby-related writing and is available through trade or through subscription. The BNC will trade EVERYTHING for any published Dip zine.

Always remember that if you ever have any questions, do feel free to write and ask. That's one of the reasons the BNC is here.

SUBSCRIPTION NOTE

For those of you who did not catch it this time, we have dropped the subscription rate for EVERYTHING from \$1.00 per issue to \$0.75 per issue. This was effective from E73 and reflects a healthy financial condition for the Office of BNC.

GM Helper Sheet

Some time ago, a GM helper sheet was included with the assignment of a BN. However, while the idea had some merit at the time, I found that few, if any, publishers were returning these sheets, preferring instead to send a zine copy with the end game report. If, however, you would like a GM helper included with your BN assignment, please let me know where you request a number(s) and I will fill it out and send it to you. A sample is enclosed with this zine.

PUBLISHERS COMMENTS

So far we have had very good luck in sticking to our imposed schedule of publication. EVERYTHING is published quarterly (January, April, July, and October). It is our intention to have EVERYTHING in the mail by the 15th of those months. This month, however, it may be a tad late. I was involved in a traffic accident today (Jan. 9) and may be without the service of my car next week. Look for EVERYTHING to be mailed sometime the week of the 18th (or sooner if things improve).

The above notwithstanding, keep these schedules in mind if you wish to advertise any hobby related function. For instance, the yearly PDORA Auction is listed within this issue. We will advertise (free of charge) any such activities, including cons. The best way is to (1) send me the advertisement on an 8-1/2 x 11 sheet and I will include it or (2) run off a number of copies and I will use them as flyers (as with the PDORA Auction sheets).

- 2- In the case of tied bids and there aren't enough items to cover the bidding, the earliest postmark will win out.
- 3- This will be a 1-round mail order auction. There are numerous items, some of which are offered in "multiple lots". Read the item explanation very carefully before submitting a bid. Bids will be secret until the winners are announced, and at that time you'll be asked to send your pledged bid in. Once you've placed a successful bid, you are obliged to accept the item and its costs.
- 4- You may make your bids conditional upon \$\$ spent, therefore it is suggested that you place your bid in preferential order if using conditionals. Other type of conditional bids will not be accepted the regular bids accompanying illegal conditions will be accepted.
- 5- Simply list the items you wish to bid for and how much. (Example- A-001 \$5. If you're the high bidder, you'll win a 10 issue sub to K/W.) If the item has a postage cost, do not include it in your bid. Submit only a direct bid for the item. You'll be billed for the postage cost later, if you win the item. (It'll be included in your final owed total.)
- 6- All items are postage paid by the donator unless stated otherwise.
- 7- All winners will be notified with a request for their payment, including any postage costs. After receiving payment, all donators will be notified to whom they should send the appropriate items. Postage money will also be forwarded by the administrators to the donator at this time.
- 8- All donations received will go to hobby services as determined by the 5 member financial committee. Neither Simon or I, or anyone on the committee is entitled to any money, including reimbursement for flyers or postage costs affiliated with the auction.
- 9- All input is welcomed. We are striving to make this your auction, a smashing success, year after year.
