Litigation: An appeal of the notation at the conclusion of 1985AO

Events: In 1985AO, the original Turkish player dropped and was replaced by Hugh Christie. Hugh is the father of Howard Christie, the original GM. The replacement occurred in P02; and the situation of 'family members in same game' existed until P04 when Howard's zine, Stab-back folded. Hugh Christie eventually drew a 2-way draw with James Young's England in ((presumed)) P06:

The notation, 'Turkish standby player related to GM', was issued at the conclusion of this game. ((see E71, page 14))

When E71 came out, Hugh called me and issued a complaint that he felt the notation was not fair and requested that I look into the matter.

1) The first of two points in consideration here is the notation itself, 'family members in the same game'. This is a dead issue to me. It is a policy that was established before my time (1) and is (2) one which I am in total agreement with. I will, therefore, hear no complaints regarding the legitimacy of the notation itself.

2) The second issue involves changing the ruling of a previous BMC -- this folks is another dead issue. Once a BMC makes a ruling on a particular game, that's it. One BMC does not change a ruling of his predecessor. In the game, 1985AO, however, the particular ruling itself was in question...

Hugh Christie claimed to have researched the matter before assuming the position and in a letter to me stated: "previous game 19847 was ruled as legal and BMC was contacted before signing on for games under above situation. Ruling was that separate residence from GM /based on telephone call/ was sufficient to disregard relative status."

I, myself, can verify that Hugh was trying to contact people about the legality of this issue as I can remember him asking me about it when I was serving as an apprentice, and I can recall referring him solely to Bill Quinn. However, in the master book, the game 85AO was already carrying the notation of 'family members in the same game'. Somewhere something was wrong. I contacted both Bill Quinn and his predecessor Kathy (Byrne)Caruso as either BMC would have made judgment on this game; neither could remember issuing a statement such as Hugh described, the 1985 game from Bill's time/the 1984 game from Kathy's.

Since there was this confusion, I asked Bill to restate his opinion regarding 1985AO and the notation attached to it in the master book. His reply: "... I feel sure that the situation was entirely innocent and had no bearing on the outcome of the game. ... If I was a player referee keeper I'd rate the game. HOWEVER that does not change the fact that two blood relatives participated in the same game at the same time and the game should carry a note that Hugh and Howard Christie are related. Hugh should never have been called as a standby -- but Howard did not know of this. I do not feel ignorance is an excuse."

I must then fall back on my original premise of not changing a previous ruling; the notation stands.

General Note:

I received the following item from Andy Lischett, 2402 Ridgeland Ave., Berwyn, Ill. 60402. Anyone reading this should be made aware of a potentially damaging situation to the games you run, and Andy is requesting anyone contact him if they have further information on this potential problem.

A WARNING AND A REQUEST FOR HELP

For the first (maybe the second) time ever I'm about to throw someone out of CHEESECAKE for deception of the GM.

Before I ever mentioned running a gunboat game, two people named Spike - Spike Sayers and Spike van Robart - asked to join such a game. When I did decide to run gunboat I only informed Spike van Robart, figuring that one unsolicited Spike is okay but two would be too coincidental. I know, I was dumb for allowing either Spike to join, but I get really flustered at deadline time and only after sending the invitation did I regret it.

Besides, I had no proof of attempted deception, but now I do. I sent the latest adjudication of the gunboat game to... Spike van Robart,, c/o Izzo,, 34 Chapin Avenue,, Providence, Rhode Island 02909, just as I have been. Someone there or at the Post Office scribbled out the address beneath the name and replaced it with... 19985 Wild Cherry Lane,, Water's Landing, Maryland 20874-1015, and someone else crossed that out and sent the envelope back to me. The Wild Cherry Lane address is Spike Sayers address, which means that Spike is playing under a fake name and tried to sign up for two spots in the same game.

What's the big deal? Why not let Spike play under any name he likes? Well, I ignored my suspicions before and they turned out to be true, and since I also suspect that both 'Spike's may be stooges for a third player, I'm going to toss Spike out just in case.

So, the warning: GMs, beware of 'Spike Sayers', 'Spike van Robart', 'S.S. van Robart' (under which name he tried to join my standby list), 'Izzo' or anyone using the above addresses in Rhode Island and Maryland.

My request for help is: If you know of any other Diplomacy player who is associated with 'Spike', 'Spike', 'S.S.', 'Izzo' or either address, will you please tell me? If I find that 'Spike' is a front for someone else, I'll throw him out also.

PUBLISHERS' ALERT

There is an attempt being made to restart those plus Diplomacy games formerly run in PBM, by Roy Fleming. The last issue available to both myself and Rod Walker in the April-May issue of 1987. Roy was a GM/publisher who declined to request BNs for his games so I am involved in a dual capacity here: both to issue numbers and to assist the restart of any game that the players feel is worthwhile. OK, all you publishers out there ... I know it is real -boring- to be reprinting this stuff; but there are a lot of people out there that have gotten the shaft; let's see if we can't do something to help this hobby along.

Also, this once again underscores the need for registering these game despite the 'bother' and the 'inflated egos' that abound; had we not been provided with an address list (a rather fortunate circumstance), where do we, or anyone, start. When a gamestart is recorded players addresses aren't just tossed in the wamer pile, they are kept on file for just such an emergency.

A MATTER CONCERNING TRADE POLICY

((from Elmer Hinton)) As you know, a year ago Kaisa #112 and #113 came out mentioning that players would receive their issues, and everyone would receive general issues, but that traders could get player issues by requesting to be a spectator. I didn't receive such a request from you, and as a result, since there were only three general issues last year you received only three issues. I guess that wasn't sufficient since the BNC did the unprecedented thing of cutting trade with an active publisher. Now, if you don't want to get every player issue, which I presume (since you started out well, and seemed literate, and had NOT requested to be a spectator to any games), it would seem defeating to send them to you anyway. Since the BNC traditionally trades with warehouse zines smaller than the player issues, presumably I could get EVERYTHING ... by sending player issues to you; but since you didn't indicate you wanted them ... you see the problem?

((BNC)) Sorry, Elmer, I did not do the 'unprecedented' thing of cutting trade with an 'active' publisher. I am not at this point going to elaborate on your 'active' status; both you and your players know the truth or non-truth of that statement. What I will say is this: as a trader you have an obligation to trade; if you fail to meet that obligation, your trade will be cut. I did not receive three copies of your material in 1987; therefore, having gone over 6 months without receiving anything from you, your trade with Everything was cut; your publishing delays had nothing whatsoever to do with it. It was instead your complete absence. Let me repeat what I said above: YOU have an obligation, not me, not Melinda, not anybody who succeeds us in this/these jobs. I will take your submission of an issue (however small) to indicate your desire to receive Everything as a trader; I will take your failure to fulfill your obligations as your desire not to receive this zine. period. Please do not shuffle your responsibilities, however small, off onto someone else. Thank you.

BNC Note: The follow list of games has been presented to me by a third party for the assignment of a Boardman Number. All the games in question are being run in the zine Retaliation, and to the best of my knowledge they are being run by Dick Martin. Mr. Martin has chosen, for reasons of his own, not to participate in that section of the hobby of which Boardman Numbers are a part. In light of this all players mentioned here should remember that to record a completed game, someone must keep a record of the Fall SC charts and a list of who played what as it would not seem likely that Mr. Martin will bother to send this information to me. Perhaps when I step down Mr. Martin will find my successor more 'suitable' and will once again participate in the hobby, re. BNCs; until that time all players should take no

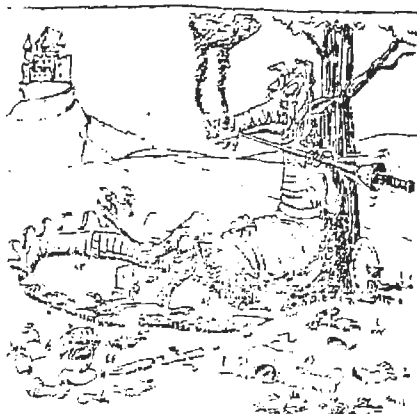
