In continuing with the the statistical annalysis from last issue (due to that wealth of stats I have from the DipWorld project), I felt that since last time we looked briefly at draws, it would be appropriate this time to look at whitehelps, er winners, though I suppose that depends on what side of the win you're on.

I have chosen an arbitrary time to determine when the stats should be pulled, in this case E67-75, and an arbitrary Fall season to look at the games before the win .. and finally, an arbitrary country to look at: Russia, the definitive winner. So, let us then look at the end of the biginning, F03, to see what Russia did to ensure its win. There were 21 Russian wins during this period, and by 1903, most all were well on their way to a win (12SC/2 times, 11SC/5 times, 9SC/6 times, 8SC/5 times, 7SC/2 times and 6SC once. So, my friends, if you're playing Russia, you best be on solid footing by 1903 or it's time to start looking for a facesaving draw. There is, however, another way to look at this - if Russia was doing well at this point, who was not.

If we set a value of 3SCs or less as a poor showing for 1903 and 6 or more as a good showing ...

a) Austria was 'weak' in 13 of the 21 Russian wins to lead the pack in countries to 'get', but second in the pack was not the close Turkish neighbor, but the northern menace of England with 12 'weak' showings. So, if you can, it seems that if you can't arrange Austria's destruction, you're next choice is to ensure that England goes down the poop-chute.

b) France, on the other hand, makes a great ally because in the 21 wins, France should be considered 'strong' in 13 occasions, and it didn't make one bit of difference in your quest for the win. ... and right behind France comes Italy with 7 'strong' FO3s and only 2 'weak' ones. These are your definitive allies ... remember ...

c) Turkey looks like it could go either way with just as many 'strong' and 'weak' FO3s ((well, almost)), but the key here is '6'. You damn well better hold him to 6 SCs for it appears that the 7th will invariably be one of yours!!

d) I'd comment on Germany, but it doesn't appear to matter much what he did, poor fellow, caught between you and your good ally, France ...

e) Lastly, take a quick look a dominance. If we set 9SCs as a determining factor

for dominance, you will not that it is very, very rare for another country to become a dominant player in your game: A did it one, and I did it once and you got away with it, but I'll bet you did it with a quick surgical removal. Let no one else, dominate the game.


