On the positive side, I think this hobby owes Melinda a debt of thanks for actually recognizing a problem and doing something about it rather than complaining inanely or spouting off eloquent, meaningless, solutions from a self-proclaimed ivory tower.

Litigation: The Case of 1986HI

Responding player: Jim Goldman  
GM: John Boardman

As with most things, the case of 1986HI is a little more detailed than the average player-GM dispute, and as such three separate matters must be addressed here.

The first and perhaps the most simple of the lot is timeliness -- at what point in time is it too late to address the regularity of a game. In the case of 1986HI, I do not feel timeliness is an issue. The game is still an ongoing one, and the player complaint was received approximately 6 months after the initial occurrence, with a mitigating circumstance which will be addressed in part two. However, just because this case is not 'untimely' that does not preclude the fact that at some point in time there must be an end to the right to complain. I have decided to follow the policy most used by the GMs I see, myself included, and that would be as follows: A player has until one issue (of Everything) after the game has been listed as finished or one year after the initial occurrence, whichever is the lesser, to register an official complaint to the BNC ... of course using the widely-used 'one issue' theory still provides a player with 3 months given the publishing schedule of Everything.

The second point deals with who may/should/? register a complaint with the BNC. The 'problem' was initially referred to me by Bruce Linsay on behalf of Jim Goldman. Gentlemen, I can make this short and sweet. I will not now nor ever accept a third party complaint. It is the decision of the 'wronged player' to register the complaint - if he/she does not do so that's their business and no one else's. Third party complaints, with due respect to Bruce, reek of fued-ism, and I wholeheartedly feel there is enough inane fueding going on in this hobby without one side or the other trying to drag the office of BNC into the fray. As such, any complaints other than that finally registered by Jim Goldman were ignored.

Finally we have the actual complaint. To begin with Jim's complaint could fall under either 'discriminating' or "GMing so poor the game was unplayable". ((Jim did not site a specific reason as outlined in the standard BNC intro sheet)).

In the Winter turn of 1904, John had an incorrect adjudication that was not discovered until after the S 1905 season had been played. (Due note that John uses 'immediate reply mail' to handle his Winter adjudication so it was not the one turn of W/Spring.). When the err was reported to John he decided to replay the Spring 1905 season. Unfortunately, Jim had just executed a complicated stab in Spring 1905 and it would be impossible to repeat that move in any way shape or form, given the replay. On the other side we also have the player that would be unduely served if the game had continued with his incorrect.

Jim then resigned the game in protest and subsequently came to the BNC regarding the game's irregularity.

In viewing this complaint I first went th John's HRs to see what was his listed policy for handling adjudication errs. John's HR#10 states: "The gamemaster shall be responsible for his own failings, but not for those of the players or of the United States Postal Service." John did mention

that he has used 'replay' before when an err situation had occurred; and this pretty well puts an end to things.

I can certainly emphasize with Jim's position -- I have been there several times; and I see nothing wrong with his resigning in protest ... I have done that a few times too. However, I do not feel John has acted in a manner that would cause this game to be irregular. John's HRs are made readily available to any and all that ask, and I do feel it is Jim's responsibility to be aware of what HRs he is playing under. If there was some question as to how John would handle an err under his HR#10, Jim should have asked before playing.

As for the specific policy of 'replay': no, I do not care for it myself, but that does not make the policy irregular per se. It has been an established, albeit slightly used, manner to handle errs for quite some time now, and under the conditions that John used it I do not find the policy itself sufficient grounds to declare the game irregular.

In summary then I ruled in favor of John Boardman and find that there are insufficient reasons to declare 1986HI irregular.

#### STATE OF THE BNC

You should all know (I hope) by now that I am actively seeking a replacement, so my state is 'temporary'. Due note that I have postponed sending off the questionairs for a while as I was not satisfied with the way this information was spread, too little ... I do ask that any publisher reading this let his readership know - the entire hobby does NOT subscribe to Everything.

Our monetary situation is good and should remain that way as long as funding from the PDO keeps coming in. For those that expressed of the BNC imposing a mandatory fee, forget it, any contributions remain that - contributions. (see financial statement)

Everything has again maintained it targeted publication schedule, though we have had some trouble getting the zine through to Canadians in any form let alone a timely one. Melinda has promised to continue her efforts after I leave so the fine work we have come to expect should continue. Due note that we do have a deadline for submission of articles and hobby news of 1/1, 4/1, 7/1, and 10/1 - last issue we could not use a new letter from the CDO as it arrived too late. Everything will continue its policy of publishing news-related items if they are submitted in a typed form.

The west: generally speaking England seems to be your best choice as an ally with 11 strong showings to 2 weak ones (as compared to (F) S9, W3; (G) S7, W8), but we are all semi-intelligent enough to realize that a strong England is contesting your good buddy Russia somewhere ... right? What I do find somewhat amusing is that it is general GM practice to split potential friends, close players in the 'traditional' A/E split, now ain't that a kick since A/E do show such, uh, potential.

Italy: Oh, poor, Italy, once again, despite Austria fears of 'VEN-TYO' it just doesn't appear that it makes one bit of difference whether Italy is strong, weak, or whatever, just keep the SOB off your back for a couple of years and Italy will take care of itself.

Russia: Well, there I go again ..., but stronge vs weak doesn't seem to make much difference either, though the quantities are more, the average (about 50-50) remains the same as for Italy ... just keep the sucker off your back for a while. 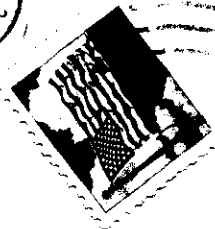
