It is the opinion of Elmer Hinton that the game ended and no transfer took place.

Opinion) This was a rather difficult one for me to work on and I was sorely tempted to withdraw due to personal bias; unfortunately there is, being BNC, no person to turn this over to. After some long, and I do mean long, time considering, it was my opinion that I needed to go specifically to each player and ask him/her whether a legitimate transfer took place, and this I have done. I currently have but two replies to my inquirey, both stating that they did agree to transfer the game to Bob Olsen. I do wish to give the players in this game a fair attempt at a solution -- I have found that anything lowers this case to the realms of fuedism in the highest degree.

Ruling) I am holding the 19841V file from BNC-transfering. I have not heard from Geoffrey Richard(T), David Lang(G), or Mikel Petty(E). If I hear from these people and they affirm that a transfer took place by 9/30/89, I will submit to Don the end game report submited from Bob Olsen's GMing. In any other case, I will submit to Don the results recorded by Elmer Hinton.

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from Doug Acheson on behalf of the CDO)

From last year's Can Con, a list of the top 10 Canadian Players were created and the CDO wished to have a 'best of the best' game (of PEM Dip). Doug wished to run the game in his zine, <u>Cladestine Activities</u>; this presents a problem in that one of the players involved was Doug's brother, Robert. Doug asked for special dispensation on relaxing the rule regarding relatives in a game to accommodate the running of this special Canadian game.

Opinion) I agree with Doug that given the nature of this game the fact that sibblings were involved would not normally detract form the play of the game, but then that's me and I know quite a few pair of relatives that's layer-player or player-GM in a game and most definately not show favoritism towards one another. I am, however, also aware of the potentials for complaint should one of the pair do 'exceptionally' well, or should one of the pair's enemmey's moves strangely (but ligitimately) disappear. The reasons for setting this rule were sound and I see no reason to change them (1) nor for establishing the precedent of allowing the BNC the discretion of deciding when relatives are allowed in games together and when they are not (2).

First, just because relatives are in a game does not mean that the BNC will not issue a BN. He will do so, just as he will do so for requested 'local' games. What will happen is that when the game is listed as finished it will (in this case) bear the remark that the GM and one player, by name, were related. The term, 'irregular' is not employed by this BNC because the hobby seems to associate the word 'irregular' with the terms, 'misconduct' and 'fraud', which may be the case, but which may easy as easily not.

Second, I will not allow the BNC to establish a precedence of deciding when a rule is to be followed and when it will not. It's either all or none.

LITIGATION - Ruling on IWAP, a modified version of WAP

Charles Fargo(GM/The Last Resort) has asked me to rule on the regularity of Rob Boyd's variation of WAP, designated IWAP. IWAP rules are as follows:

- 1) Any unit that successfully moved in the previous season will hold in the season of NMR.
- Any unit that successfully moved in the previous season will support the successfully moved unit in place during the season of NMR.
- 3) Any fleet which successfully convoyed an amry and is adjacent to that army will support it during the season of NMR

player I abhore the concept of WAP. NMRs are a part of the PBM hobby (period). A GM who takes it upon himself to create moves is interfering with the game (period), even if he is doing so through the 'legal' accepted norms. As BNC, however, I felt I had to go with the general hobby feelings which was simply, 'why not try it and see what happens'. I, in effect, ruled against my own personal feelings.

The hobby has tried WAP and if our GM survey was an accurrate reflection of hobby opinion then WAP is not a major trend (less than 5% of the GMs use it), but then it doesn't seem

Opinion) For those of you not around during the WAP decission, let me state that as a GM/

to be a hindrance either, though that may be ascribed to the small numbers of GMs using it.

The ligitimacy of WAP is technically based on its (rather close) similarity to the 'standing order', and the fact that the GM does not create any order on the turn sheet. ((GM-created, or neutral, orders are by past hobby practice accepted no later than 1901

and only if all players are aware of what the neutral orders will be))

There is one major difference in IWAP and WAP; that is, the CM is creating, by housefuler a condition where neutral orders may be used throughout the game. This is a problem I forsaw back when the original decission was made —— it's the old give someone an inch

and they'll take a mile cliche; and it is why I wrote my ''strange'' ruling the way I did. To refresh you (all): "If you consider WAP to be nothing more than a statement that this season's orders are to be considered to be preliminaries for the next season, you are OK [read: no listing will be attached to the game finish]" "If you try to squeeze that extra mile out of WAP ... you are not." ... and people I am not going to contradict myself.

Ruling) Any game which is reported as using IWAP, after the standard 1901 grace period, will be listed as having "GM interference".

The assignment of BNs and the completion of the games run by Roy Fleming in PBM

I was asked several times over my tenure why is a EN necessary. Of course the obvious reply is history — we are after all nothing but a reflection of our past, looking towards a future. The Boardman Numbers, though simple in context, are the stuff of which this hobby is made (and why I detest those few petty ego-builders who try to work in opposition to the simple assignment of starts/finsishes to blooster obvious low self-es teem problems, but that's another story). EMNs serve a second function; they provide a place for a beleagured player may go to when his games collapse, since the EMNC knows who to go to and has a listmm of everyone's addresses from which to start the process of resurrecting lost games.

PBM ran 9 regular Dimplomacy games, finsihed one, and then dropped out of sight, leaving the poor players hung out to dry.. It took an exceptionally long time to get the games from the point of total abandonment to a point where they could be revived. Unfortunately it took too long. Players moved, lost interestmin, or just thought the whole thing was a waste. Red Walker and I tried to restart several of the 8 games to no avail. ... perhaps if the players were more into the hobby mainstreem and knew where to go for help sconer, perhaps if the address list we finally used was in better shape ... who knows. We have then 9 lost games and quite a few disenchanted Diplomacy players.

Ruling) There will be no BNs issued to these games.

LITIGATION - An appealof the Abandonment Status for 1987N

Randy Grigsby wished to appeal my notification that the game 1987N will be considered abandoned this issue, siting that there was sufficient interest on the part of the active players to warrent continuing the game, in contrast to the report I recieved from the USOS. I have taken it upon myself to contact those players listed to see if they wish to continue; to date, no one has replied. I will give the members of this game until 9/30/89 to reply to my inquirey, at which point they will have the option of placing their game in my zine or in one of those listed in last issue's GN survey. If I do not hear from sufficient people by 9/30/89 it is my ruling that the USOS's recommendation of abandonment stand. If Don does not hear from me by 10/05/89 regarding the game, 1987N, he is to list it as abandoned.
