THANKS, STEVE ...

As you probably know by now, Steve Heinowski has stepped down and relinquished the office of the Boardman Number Custodian to a successor. He is the 16th BNC to do so since John Boardman first turned the job over to Charles Wells, over 25 years ago.

As BNC, Steve continued the efforts of his predecessor, Bill Quinn, to steer the Custodianship clear of personal controversy while providing quiet and efficient service to a not-always-thankful hobby. His tenure of 34 months (9/86-6/89) is surpassed only by the 37 months endured by Doug Beyerlein (9/74-11/77) ... judging from what I've seen here in just the past 4 months, it is a remarkable achievement.

Like every BNC, he has naturally had detractors--it's the nature of the beast. There are those who will argue he was wrong about this or that decision, those that think he was too active, those others who'll hold that he wasn't active enough, and those who are ultimately never happy with what the BNC does, no matter what. Well, folks, it's a tough watch and the job description is pretty vague.

Steve left the BNCship in admirable shape. The records are up to date, litigation calendar is clear, finances are in the black (for a few more months anyway), and the office is feud-free. For the solid, impartial and quietly efficient way he performed as the Custodian he should be commended and roundly applauded. I suspect, though, that he's happy to be done with the whole thing and would settle for a simple thank-you.

You are now in the hands of his successor, the 17th BNC. I will do my best to merit the confidence he has entrusted to me to keep the office running smoothly, to be as fair and controversy-wary as possible, and to uphold the reputation, tradition and independence that Steve and others have maintained for the office of the Boardman Number Custodian.

I guess there's just one more thing to say at this point ...

Thanks, Steve.

THE SHAPE OF THINGS TO COME:

With the above having been said, it's time now to quickly turn to the business at hand, letting you know who I am and what the future holds in store for EVERYTHING... and the BNC.

I'll forego the long biography and give you the essentials. My name is Don Williams and I am the new BNC, effective several months ago on July 1, 1989. I have played DIPLOMACY off and on (mostly off) since I was fourteen--I'm 32 now. I entered the PBM hobby somewhat accidentally

in early 1982. By October of that year I was publishing the subzine, FIAT BELLUM! (which has since moved to zine status), and was running three games. I've been pubbing and GMing ever since. I'm also a player and have somewhere between 25 and 35 games to my credit (though if you saw the results you might think "credit" is a poor word choice). I'm in eight games right now, which is probably five too many. I am married, have three children and work as a city planner. I truly enjoy the competition and camaraderie offered by that game of games, DIPLOMACY. End of story.

I don't figure to make any sweeping changes in the way the BNC functions, and only a very few small ones. I didn't take the Custodianship to make of it something it is not--like most of you, I hope, I'm basically satisfied with the way the office runs and with the scope and range of the duties, responsibilities and services provided. There will be a few changes here and there, but these will mainly be to reflect how I do things, not a change in the Custodianship itself.

In line with the above, there will also be a few changes in EVERYTHING... over the next couple of issues. Changes in the appearance and cost of the zine may already have caught your attention. Changes in tone and content are also in the offing. In the future, look for a bit more chat and info, maybe some articles or an occasional letter, possibly a regular column from FOL SI FIE publisher, Randolph Smyth. (I'm still working on that one. We've also got a few intrepid souls trying to track down the various Associate BNC's for the non-North American hobby; toward what end we'll use that information I do not now know, but I suspect we'll think of something.) I'd like to organize and standardize the content of the zine (the bureaucrat in me, no doubt), maybe put in a few regular sections, a table of contents, page numbers ... you know, the really sweeping kind of changes.

Finally, I would like to make EVERYTHING... more readable, more enjoyable, maybe more interesting. We'll see how that works out because, frankly, E... is a "service zine" and its primary function is to report game starts and game finishes. Anything else is just gravy.

Wish me luck, okay?

LITIGATION

On page one I mentioned that the litigation docket was clear. Well, that wasn't quite true. In Issue No. 80 Steve left a couple of items to be cleaned up this time, after he'd had a chance to get information from the various involved parties. I have heard from him on one of the items and been given direction on the second.

-1984IV KAISSA (Elmer Hinton)

I have sufficient material on hand at this point in time to render judgement on the case of 1984IV. To wit: A letter from Mikel Petty stating that he did not agree to a transfer of 1984IV from Elmer Hinton to Bob Olsen. It is the opinion of the BNC that for a transfer to take place there must be a unanimous agreement among the active players, as long as the GM produces a turn--even if, as was so in this case--the turns were few and far between. Mikel Petty did not agree to the transfer; why he did not do so is strictly his business and not subject to questioning. I can, therefore, do no less than rule in favor of Elmer Hinton, GM.

RESOLUTION: The end game report submitted by Elmer Hinton will be

considered the valid conclusion to 1984IV.

Briefly, this game was to be declared abandoned in Issue No. 80, after the USOS had determined there to be no interest in the game on the part of the players and had advised Steve on the matter. Randy Grigsby had appealed the decision on the grounds that there was still interest on the part of the players. Steve extended the date to this issue and asked the players to contact him directly if they were still interested. I was directed to declare the game abandoned if I did not hear from Steve (or any of the players, I presume) by 10/05/89. To date, I have had no contact in regard to 1987N.

RULING: 1987N is declared abandoned due to lack of player participation.

A final word here. I will likely be assigning litigation "case numbers" in the future. If you were to go through back issues of E..., you'd quickly find yourself very confused by the current system of using the BN as identification when it comes to litigation. Furthermore, I'd eventually like to sort out and re-publish the various rulings over the years. These rulings guide and shadow the way postal DIPLOMACY is played, and making them available in a more-or-less "codified" format seems to me desirable. (It might even be interesting reading.) Chalk this one up to "long-term project".

PUBLICATIONS AVAILABLE FROM THE BNC:

- There aren't that many yet, folks, but be sure to stay tuned.
- EVERYTHING... back issues are available for \$1 each (US). Nearly all issues are now available, due to the recent reacquisition of #'s 1-18.
- "ADJUDICATING POSTAL DIPLOMACY GAMES" by long-time GM and former BNC, Doug Beyerlein. Full of information on how to be a good GM, set up adjudication procedures, and how to minimize screw-ups that detract from the game. (My players will probably send ME a copy.)
Cost: \$1.
- GM HELPER SHEET, designed originally by Don Ditter. Use these to keep track of player changes, supply center counts, standby call notes, etc. You can also send the thing to the BNC when the game ends and save us both some trouble. (I'm now sending them with all new BN assignments.)
Cost: First five are free, after that they're 10¢ each. I suggest you get a freebie, then make your own copies.

A LETTER FROM BILL QUINN (08/21/89), FORMER BNC:

"Dear Don,

Enclosed find my check for \$20 as a token of my continued support for the office of the BNC.

I could not help but notice the mention that there were no financial statements issued from E... #62 on, which was when I took over as BNC. The reason is quite simple: I ran the publication of EVERYTHING... in the red. I did so from the time I began publishing for Don Ditter. The losses [incurred] I made up from my own pocket. I could have published in digest form, used lighter bond, smaller print, cheaper repro, etc.,

and been in the black. However, I didn't like the cheap way out and paid the difference. So, you see, to publish financial reports which showed the BNC going deeper and deeper into the red would not exactly inspire confidence and financial support. It was, for me, an inexpensive hobby. When I transferred the records to Steve Heinowski, I simply transferred the same amount of money I had received (\$200, I think). So, no need for a CPA, I think. This letter is for print if you need filler. Congrats and condolences ...

[Hey, thanks for the letter, and the donation--both are much appreciated. You bring up an interesting point about inspiring confidence in the office--the constant need for donations brings up an interesting quandary: Is it better to be in the red, thereby showing the need for donations, or better to show a healthy financial picture which inspires confidence and, one assumes, continued voluntary support? I don't have an answer for that one yet. As for the whole question about BNC finances and the reporting of ... well, read on.]

FINANCES, GENERAL DISCUSSION:

There has been some discussion in several zines lately regarding the finances and fiscal record-keeping of past BNCs. I won't go into all or any of the various points of view espoused here as they are basically irrelevant. Let me hold forth a bit ...

The finances of the BNC and E... may be of interest to the hobby-at-large, but I am basically unconvinced by the "right to know" and "accountability" arguments currently in vogue. The Custodianship is basically funded in three ways: voluntary contributions/donations, subscriptions and back issue sales. (Donations are by far the largest single funding source and are of two types; donations for game numbers and services (and the PDORA funding falls into this category), or those which arrive unsolicited (such as Bill's)). The BNC is NOT funded by mandatory fees, charges, taxes or exactions, and that is a key point. So long as the office continues to function and subscription and trade orders are filled, what mandate is there for the Custodian to make financial records a matter of public record? Most money given to the BNC is donated and constitutes a contribution freely sent so that the service rendered by the BNC is 1) not interrupted, and 2) does not become a heavy financial burden to be borne by the BNC or publisher of E... alone.

Various allegations have been made that, because Steve Heinowski and Bill Quinn did not regularly report the financial health of the Custodianship, they are guilty of some sort of impropriety. Personally, I find this silly and irresponsible--both put more time and money into the office than we will ever know.

The hobby's interest in the fiscal health of the BNC is acknowledged and understandable; the hobby has been supporting the office at one level or another for many years, always voluntarily, and the smooth functioning of the BNC and the publishing of E... are legitimate concerns. (I mean, nobody wants a repeat of the DW debacle of a few years back.) But, should this interest factor cause the finances of the BNC and E... (the publication of which is the single largest expense incurred by the BNC because of the long-standing all-for all trade policy) to be held to closer scrutiny than the finances of any other service or zine? I don't think so. Again, contributions are received because the hobby trusts that the BNC will use the funds responsibly and for the purposes intended. This trust has been engendered in the office by the reputation and efforts
