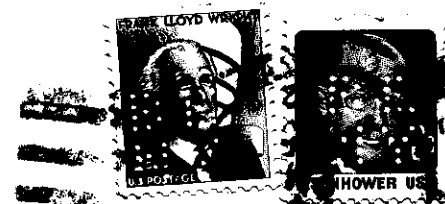

Well now for diplomacy. To date 17 games have been started at Dewey. These are 1974HA, 1974HV, 1974IE, 1974IF, and 1975e¹⁻¹³. I would appreciate it if Boardman Numbers would be assigned to these last 13 games as soon as possible. 1974HA, 1974HV, 1974IE are now all finished. 1974IF Fall 1901 moves are enclosed somewhere in this issue. Due to the great volume of 1975e games, I will only publish the complete moves to 1975e¹¹ and 1975e¹³. For all other 1975e games I will only publish the number of supply centers controlled by each country at the end of each year. I have chosen to publish the complete moves to e¹¹ and e¹³ because supposedly these are the two best games going on with all Dewey players. I will include Press from other 1975e games.

Within the 1975e games there have been two major fiscos to date. The first occurred when Mike Lazar (no relation to the head of the Taxi and Limo Commission) resigned as gamesmaster of 1975e⁶. Actually he did not resign; he just disappeared. We finally convinced (under the threat of death) Pauline S. Powledge II to become the new gamesmaster. The other major fisco occurred when Bill Seligman was exiled from the Math Department for gross incompeteness and having a loose mouth. At the time he was the GM of two games. 1975e¹ Press:

THE BIG SEVEN DOOMED

REACTION

"Went down to the mailbox and got out the mail
When I saw the gamezine I let out a wail
Thought he'd been truthful

Way low-down I've-been-stabbed-again Blues"

Speaking with the Nestorian wisdom of a survivor of nearly four years in this hobby let me say the one thing that has been surprising me for those four years is the reaction of someone who's just been stabbed. Although the above lyrics have not yet been put to music I feel it's only a matter of time. I can hear it being sung by someone in a hurt, whining voice. Say Bob Dylan.

I've seen some strange reactions from people who've been stabbed. Some have cried; some have attempted physical violence. I know of a couple of friendships broken up because one friend stabbed the other.

All this seems a strange reaction to me. The guy who just stabbed you keeps telling you that this is a game. And he is right. Two friends can go for years playing chess, thinking nothing of checkmating each other. A draw, they will agree, is for the times when neither can win. Such is Diplomacy.

I suppose it's the make-up of the game. Chess is a purely tactical game; Diplomacy is very strongly a game of interpersonal relations. It's also due partly, I'm sure to the fact that many players take this game of ours too seriously.

Once we've agreed one should not take a stab personally, how should we react to one? After all, if it's there, it's there.

Diplomacy is a game of interpersonal relations. The more facts you have on a player the better able you'll be to anticipate what he'll do. Certainly after someone has stabbed you once you'll be careful to not leave yourself completely open to him in another game. That's simply a matter of common sense.

But Diplomacy is also a game of realpolitik. If you can use someone who's stabbed you and he can use you it is folly to attack him blindly. Because after a while people will begin to notice this and it will give them a handle on you. They'll be able to count on your reaction when you're put in a game with someone who has stabbed you. That's bad.

Consider this also: When you go into a game there should be six people with whom you can work towards your ultimate goal of winning. If you insist on revenging yourself automatically on a stabber and you're put in another game with him your chances go down. If you're fanatic about your revenge you may find yourself in a completely untenable position because of your insistence.

That's two strikes against you automatically and there are six other players ready and able to fan you so that they can win.

So don't be pig-headed about being stabbed. If the necessity arises, be willing to ally with the guy again. After all it may give you the opportunity to stab him! (Robert Bryan Lipton publishes the Mixu Maxu Gazette out for Lafayette College in Easton Pa.)

CORRECT CALMER NOTATION

The first three letters of any space on the "Dipply" board are used to represent them in order to abbreviate the writing of orders. These abbreviations will always be unique except in the following cases where the first three letters are the same:

<u>Longhand</u>	<u>Abbreviations</u>
North Sea	Nth
Norwegian Sea	Nrg or Nwg
Norway	Nwy
North Atlantic Ocean	Nat or Nat
North Africa	Naf or Naf
Tyrrhenian Sea	Tyr
Tyrolia	Tyr or Tyo
Liverpool	Liv
Livonia	Liv

The Tyrrhenian Sea and Tyrolia are so totally unrelated, because one is solely accessible to fleets and one to armies, that Tyrolia is generally abbreviated as Tyr. The inaccessibility between Liverpool and Livonia enable them to have the same abbreviation.

There are also certain exceptions which involve utilizing the first three letters of the space. They are indicated below:

<u>Longhand</u>	<u>Abbreviations</u>
Gulf of Bothnia	Bot
Gulf of Lyon	Lyo

When writing orders, it is necessary to include which coastline the fleets may be utilizing. The three coastal territories where this must be done are:

- St. Petersburg - (nc) or (sc)
- Spain - (nc) or (sc)
- Bulgaria - (ec) or (sc)

This concludes the discussion on Proper Calmer Notation, now for something more interesting ...

(The editor wishes to add that if you are ever in doubt as to the correct Calmer Notation for a move, it is better to write the move out in longhand than to write it incorrectly in Calmer Notation)
