Miami -- Princess Winna, who had recently taken place of her father great Illinois Chief Kill-a-lot, sends great gifts to loyal and much respected Great Chief Haienthwatha. She has sent for the great Medicine Man Long Wig whose specialty is rising the Dead. It is believed she wishes to respect Haienthwatha's wish of having a male Chief in Illinois Long House by restoring her father. It is hoped Long Wig will receive a sign from the Great Spirit that he will send Chief Kill-a-lot back from the Happy Hunting Grounds to the Land of the Living, where he will again lead his people. The need for Caddo lands is believed only to be an autempt to punish the treacherous drinker who is Chief of Muskhogean. The Peace Pipe could be smoked if Muskhogean Chief stopped stealing cattle from neighboring tribes.

Messengers were quick to tell the Great Chief Haienthwatha of Illinois' great battles with Dakotas, of terms of peace pact between former Illinois Chief and Haienthwatha, and to be keeping a sharp eye on Muskhogeans whose drunken Chief is not to be trusted.

Broken Land -- Runners from the Princess of the Illinois were received by the Great Chief Haienthwatha and the Council of 50, in the Great Long-House. Many subjects were discussed, among them past problems and future possibilities affecting the destinies of the Illinois and Iroquois peoples. (Much to the relief of the Great Chief, the subject of marriage never arose.)

The meeting was somewhat stormy at times, with the Three Elder Brothers stomping out when the meeting was only half-way completed. The results, however, are being hailed by the Great Chief as "the strongest and most satisfactory bonds yet forged between our two great nations". He refused to go into any more detail at this time, but stated, with emphasis, "The I's really have it this time, they do!"

Propaganda --

Barad-Dur -- In the far-off tower across the plain, a light blazed, a light brighter than the sun, cold and hard on the dead land surrounding it. Gollum trembled. "Nassstylightss. Nasssty cruel lightsss," he hisses, scuttling behind a rock. It had been a hard journey, and now that it neared its end he was puzzled, for he knew that the Dark Lord was not here, and yet the light blazed, the Mountain trembled, and the soft scrape of thousands of Orc-feet could be heard in the distance. More Orcs than Gollum had known existed had marched by him as he lay terrified in a hole in the ground. Orcs and all manner of Southerlings, swarthy men in bright colors, contrasting strangely with the dun of the Black Land, and most horrible of all, oliphaunt the mighty, his tusks sheathed in gold, his manner high and terrible, and his voice fearsome as the thunder. Gollum thought back on oliphaunt with wonder and with fright. Even more than before, he respected the owner of the Ring, and hated Him.

Minas Tirith -- In the place which no longer had a name, except to the defeated West, Sauron waited, his captains and his chieftains surrounding him, and the Nazgul wheeling and keening overhead.
