I voted against all the draws that didn't include France. I couldn't allow an E/T to slip past and I would have only voted for the concession to Turkey after the Spring 1914 turn.

Greg, you thought I had this locked up two turns ago. As you see, England can pitch me out of St. Pete; and there were moves which could have saved MAR and SPA in the Spring (Why didn't

France pull A BRE7). But once I got all three I didn't need to send in Orders. The most critical move of the game was Fall 1901: Russia F Bla-RUM, Turkey F Con-AEG. I trusted Russia to ally with me, because of Austria's attack and my staying out of the Black. We were inseparable after that, and more, that turn enabled me to build fleet after fleet without fear of attack.

By Spring 1904, while E and F were finally settling their differences, my fleets were in Italy, and Russia had two Austrians SCs! But Russia's northern campaign suffered because of his emphasis south and east. I never really agonized over whether to stab Russia (he was a liability even though he almost pushed England off the continent). But I wanted to wait until the Mediterranean was clear, and after the sheer weight of my fleets gave me that, I went after Soviet centers.

I never was challenged at sea. Sure, it took a long time to get little gains, but I never once worried about a raider slipping by. I got the Mid by accident and gave it up voluntarily to annihilate a frog fleet, then got in again in order to try for Spain for keeps. (Spain was in fact my #1 target for the 18th center).

I gave everybody plenty of chances to pass a concession -- and I even voted for E/T or F/T from time to time!

As for the players -- I know Conrad's not here because he "stood by" a couple of times, and he told me so. (I think he believed me when I told him I was Italy in this game) I'm sure I beat up Stephen Wilcox along the way, and it wouldn't surprise me if the well played England wasn't either Evans or a rank novice -- the style of play either very stubborn or very lucky!

Too bad this ain't regular Dip -- it's only my second survival in 16 postal games!

GM -- Greg Ellis

I really enjoyed this game, and I don't think I made too many mistakes for my first game as a GM. I saw a couple of turning points in the game. First was Austria and Italy abdicating. Neither put up much of a battle once R/T started rolling. The second was the absolute inability of the West to put together a coalition once Turkey had stabbed Russia. All the players displayed skill, but the opinions on how to set up the lines clearly differed. Stephen took a chance on actually making gains against Turkey when all of Pete's units were busy in Russia by grabbing an English dot. That let him build an army, but England took it not as a trade but an attack. Even though Stephen never once turned around to defend himself from England, Dan kept up the attack.

In my opinion, Dan made two mistakes that cost him at least a draw. First, he helped carve up Russia rather than let her hold off Turkey, and secondly he took German centers when he didn't need to. He could have stabbed Germany at any time after Turkey was stopped or reversed. In any case, he did do a great job of both trying to stop Turkey and still take out Germany. It came very close; they kept surprising me with comebacks after I was sure Pete had it in the bag!

This is the second game finish out of two game starts that all of the original players finished the game. Outstanding! I may be able to make it on one stand-by after all!



LETTER COLUMN

Dick Martin (9/6)

Your philosophy is interesting, though I feel it is based on several very wrong assumptions. First of all, you assume that all government regulation is by the federal government because the federal government decided we need regulation, citing barbers, lawyers, doctors and beauticians as examples. But who does this sort of regulation help the most? That's right, the doctors, lawyers, barbers and beauticians -- and they would raise a tremendous cry if their government shields were to be threatened. No, they are happy with the status quo, which is largely of their own making. Don't think you're doing them any favors by deregulating, as a regulated business is a safe business.

Second, you seem to assume that the criminal court system works. I think you would be hard pressed to prove that one, or even make a good case. And you think that throwing corporations, with the best lawyers money can buy, into an already overloaded court system will make it work any better? Who's going to file charges against a corporation, knowing that a case will take 5 to 10 years and hundreds of thousands of dollars in legal costs? Nobody but the good old federal government, and then we might as well have the regulations we are trying to avoid.

Yes, a major drawback to such a system is holding a corporation accountable. You seem to think it can be done. I don't. How would you manage this crucial, impossible task?

To answer Pete's question, in the Great Big US of A, a profit is neither a right (except for regulated public utilities it would seem) nor a privilege. rather, the possibility of making a profit is a "right" upon which our economic system is based. Hatred of Capitalism is a strange concept. Sure, it has its flaws, but it is the most effective economic system around. What is better?

Pete's poll comments were very interesting, as our situations are very similar. Retal also had more votes than subbers voting, and we also got a zero. We had more votes than subbers voting last year, too, and this phenomenon never ceases to amaze me.

But Pete is looking in the wrong place when he takes out his zero vote. The real effect isn't in the mean score, but in the preferences! Assume, as a worst case, that the zero voter voted for each of the zines along with Perelandra. Now, if you take that zero vote out, all ties become wins, all losses by one ballot become ties and Perelandra's preference score jumps 2 to 15! With the new modified mean and preference scores, Perelandra jumps 12 places to #18! It's entirely possible that one grudge vote cost Pete 12 places in the final standings -- amazing. Can anybody think of a more compelling reason to ditch the "preference matrix" as a valid item in the poll?

Greg, I think I liked it better when you felt free to argue away in the same issue as a letter you disagreed with. Made the whole process quicker -- and provides for something to write about the following month, rather than two months down the road.

<<Ok, I guess I can answer a few of your points here. I want to get away from this somewhat because I am getting a little paranoid: everyone against me! But then, nobody makes me publish, and by definition I am the largest contributor to the zine, and so I should expect to be the most argued with. Let's

take 75% of the money spent on pre-regulation and give it to the courts. Still inefficient and overworked? I doubt it! Regulating agencies work better than the criminal court system? Well then, why don't we turn criminal prosecutions over to administrative agencies? Is a man's life and liberty less important than his haircut? Whichever system is better should be used for both.

I am aware that the regulations are mostly protective of the industry, and that is one more reason that they should be eliminated as much as possible. One way to make corporations accountable is to remove the limitation to liability for the stockholders; another is to hold the officers personally responsible. For another see Scott Hansen's letter.

Michael Hopcroft (9/10)

You ask about a rundown on Oregon politics. Well, let me give you a brief run-down. As you may have heard, Bob Packwood's scheduled opponent for the Senate, Representative Jim Weaver, was forced to leave the race after the House Ethics Committee asked him many uncomfortable questions about how he could lose half the fund from his last election. (Nobody's accusing him of really being crooked, just a poor judge of investments). The Democrats chose a State Representative, Rick Bauman, to take up their tattered banner in November, but nobody (including probably Bauman) thinks he has a chance. Bauman had finished third in the primary, drawing only 13% of the Democratic vote. There is now talk of Joe Lutz, the evangelical conservative who drew 42% against Packwood in the primary, staging a write-in campaign. But basically everyone is conceding Packwood his third term.

Attention has thus turned to the race for Governor, where the ex-mayor of Portland and U.S. Transportation Secretary Neil Goldschmidt is up against ex-Secretary of State Norma Paulus. We're talking people with long pasts in Oregon politics, and each has tried to capitalize on the other's tenure; Goldschmidt latching on to Paulus' efforts in state government during a state wide depression that is still going strong (about which state government has done very little), and Paulus lashing Goldschmidt's sponsorship of Light Rail in Portland instead of yet another freeway. ("The best thing we can do with Light Rail," Paulus has said, "is leave the keys in and hope that somebody steals it.") This is a close race, with Paulus slightly ahead (Democrats outnumber Republicans in Oregon, but when it comes to state office Republicans generally fare better), and things are expected to get hotter.

Most of the other attention is being focused on initiatives. There are three tax proposals, which conflict, three proposals which would basically shut down the small Oregon nuclear industry (by closing down Trojan, forcing Teledyn Wah Chang to clean up their radioactive sludge pile, and prohibiting the manufacture of nuclear weapons parts in the state). There is even a measure to legalize Marijuana -- talk about bad timing! Smack dab in the middle of a "war on drugs." And not one radio station will run supporter's ads. Politics are not always fair.

antelope is pretty much a dead issue these days. The last act was played out a couple of months ago, when Ma Anand Sheela pleaded guilty to trying to poison The Dalles and was sent to prison. The Rajneeshees still haven't been able to unload "the ranch;" there is talk of turning it into a minimum-security prison. And we thought that's what it was before.

In Portland a police lieutenant, Bob Koch, is running against a member of the City Council, Margaret Strachn. But his campaign is focused against Mayor Bud Clark. Koch's answer to the problem of homelessness is basically to run them out of town. And he wonders why Portlanders don't like the cops!

About South Africa; I think we would all like to see a representative, pro-West government in South Africa when all the turmoil is over; a stable ally in the region makes good geopolitical sense and true democracy would benefit everybody. But how likely is it? There was a "window of opportunity" for the West to help secure a moderate regime -- unfortunately it was twelve to twenty years ago. With each passing year (and many years will pass before this is over) the black people of South Africa will grow more desperate, the youth of the townships more radical, and the opposition more violent. And with each passing year the Afrikaner population grows more restive and intransigent; even now the equivalent of a fascist party is gaining considerable support in some circles. Ten years ago the West could have moved to prevent a race war. Now it may be too late -- too late to save South Africa from chaos, bloodshed, and inevitable genocide.

Still, restrictions on investments are a good idea. Not because they'll do anything to help South Africa; they probably won't. Rather, they will reduce the loss to the West when the inevitable explosion occurs. What we are seeing today is only the sputtering of the fuse.

I am unemployed, so naturally enough I am concerned to see unemployment ignored. It is becoming increasingly difficult to get into this economy, as employers are now demanding up to two years prior experience to minimum wage jobs that only give 20 hours or less a week. This may be just Oregon; but things are supposedly not too great in Texas either, with the collapse of the oil prices. There seems to be a public attitude the "the economy is going great guns, so if you don't have job it's your own fault!" I do not consider myself a very marketable commodity at the moment, but there must be something. I have rent to pay! And I am going to have a great deal of trouble doing it quite soon; since my last job was summer work-study (doing research for a professor) I do not qualify for unemployment benefits, nor does part-time employment (the only kind that seems available in this economy). Is there any other industrialized nation that takes this sort of attitude towards the unemployed?

<<Some of my more conservative readers will no doubt take issue with your last statement. Don't take it personally; I don't when the liberals jump on me! Texas has had a chronic unemployment problem along the Mexican border; any business that wants to locate near the area jumps across the border and pays 1/10 the wages. The minimum wage laws have helped out the folks in the Valley by taking away their only chance at a job! I suspect the problem is the same in Oregon. Your economy is weak, yet you are going to vote on referendums that will be hurting your economy further if they pass. I would favor making Teledyne clean up its act, but I would also be willing to bet that it was some public policy that created the situation to begin with. A prohibition on transporting, or storing the waste someplace else maybe? I have heard that Oregon is rapidly anti-growth, and you are one of those who are paying the price for that. I suggest you move to a growing state. You could probably find decent work, and be able to afford to finish your degree.

I am upset with Packwood because of the tax reform bill. He is letting the northern state deduct their state income taxes, but the southern states can't deduct their sales taxes. Either do both or neither; I favor neither! Texas is the opposite; we vote Republican for President and Senator, but Democrat for state and local and U.S. Representative.

For not caring much about the result of the Runestone Poll, Pete had quite a bit to say on the subject. Perhaps I can relieve a few of his sleepless nights. I was the one that gave Perelandra that dreaded zero. The only reason I'm making it public is that it was a mistake.

Let me explain. Like I explained in Pommes <<An excellent zine for discussion of foreign policy and global issues! --GE>>, I rigged my ballot so the average vote came out to 5. One way I did this was to give out a few zeroes to zines which did not respond to my sample requests. After all, isn't this the worst kind of contact one could have with a zine, to be totally ignored? It was especially galling to be ignored by zines which had formerly traded with Irksome (which cleanly folded), but refused to acknowledge my zine Pommes. So I gave zeroes to six different zines, including two that finished in the top ten. Unfortunately, one of those zines was Perelandra, which did send me a sample. 
