Here are the answers to last month's contests. Chuff Afflerbach submitted the winning answer, with a score of 115:

The bridge puzzle was also well received. Jim Lawniczak submitted the correct solution. He wins five free issues. Fred Townsend was close enough that I've decided to award him three free issues. Here is the solution, with the hands rotated to make South declarer:

South, declarer at a contract of three notrump, can guarantee his contract regardless of the distribution of the enemy cards. South should play as follows: Win the spade lead, shedding a diamond from dummy. Next, enter dummy with the diamond ace to lead the two of clubs from the North hand. If clubs prove to be 2-2 or 3-1, South will have no problem establishing the suit, and he will end up taking at least ten tricks. Similarly, should East hold all four clubs, declarer will have little problem. East must either win his king at once (leaving South with the three top clubs which can extract East's remaining clubs), or play low (allowing South to win the first club with the queen). In the latter case, South continues with a club to the ace and a third club from dummy, limiting East to one club trick.

South's task becomes more complicated if West holds all four clubs. South puts up the queen on the first round of clubs, and West does best to let the queen win. (If West wins the first club, he must either lead diamonds (establishing them for declarer), lead a major suit (giving South an extra hand entry which allows him to finesse against West's club ten and later run the rest of the suit), or lead clubs (providing South with an opportunity to finesse; he later returns to his hand with the heart ace for the remaining club winners)). After the club queen holds, South continues with a low club toward dummy. Let's say West plays low (it does not help him to play the ten), allowing dummy's nine to win. Declarer then cashes the club ace and makes the key play: He leads the heart king from dummy and overtakes it with the ace. He then exits with a club to West's king. West now has his choice of losing options: He can lead a spade or a heart, giving South an entry for his club winners. Or he may have diamonds to lead. This does not embarass South, for dummy's diamonds will become established by this defense; South can afford to discard a heart if West is able to cash two diamond tricks. If South is forced to discard a heart, he can no longer be sure of reaching his hand should West then shift to hearts. But South won't mind winning a heart play in dummy, since the diamonds are now good. Similarly, if West plays a diamond when in with the club king, and East wins it, the diamonds become established at once; South can safely win a heart shift from East in either hand.

Note the importance of the overtake play in hearts. Were South to play a *small* heart to the ace at that point, West would sometimes have a safe heart exit when on lead with the club king. South would be unable to force an entry to his clubs in this case and would have to rely on a fortunate division of the red suits to make his contract.

I've been asked where I get all these puzzles. The answer is I create them myself. To be sure, the concepts behind the puzzles are not brand-new, which I guess is why the puzzles look like they came from other sources. However, though the concepts are not original, the puzzles themselves are. I'm glad you enjoy them. I'm also glad to see so much interest in bridge; I've got lots of bridge hands for you pasteboard fanatics. I'll include a hand from time to time, if interest remains high.
