## 1983AZ Endgame Statement

Dave Lincoln (Russia): Dear players: Thanks to all of you who stayed until the end, and to those who picked up standby positions. Thanks especially to Jeff for GMing the game so well after the crisis of the folding of *Manifest Destiny*. It is a credit to the hobby organization that the game was not allowed to disolve.

As to the game itself, the early alliance between Russia and Austria was a direct result of Turkey's Spring '01 NMR. Paula and I enjoyed good communication and did our best to eliminate Turkey as soon as possible.

While we were doing that, France was under extreme pressure from all his neighbors. I thought you were going to be out rather early, Herb, but you grew to second place. Pretty impressive under the circumstances.

While Austria headed west, I tried to go over the top and engage England. I greatly enjoyed our war, Jim, and I guess it ended in something of a stand-off. My hat is off to you for organizing a common defense with Germany, which was changing hands quite often. I still felt that Austria and I could penetrate into the West if we could maintain momentum, but then MD folded, and when we got back together in Frobozz four months later, Paula and I were out of touch.

I remember that Austria's NMR in S'04 really shook me. My whole position was dependent upon an alliance with Austria, and suddenly I found myself writing frantically to the assigned standby player, Lu Henry. We worked out a tentative agreement, but it is hard to say what would have happened. In any case, Paula surfaced in Virginia just before the deadline and maintained control of Austria. Our level of communication was never as strong after that though, was it Paula? I feel that it was this breakdown that determined the eventual outcome.


It was right about this time that Rob Winslow took over Germany. Alas, no more of F Netherlands or F Hol - Den as we had seen in 1902. Germany was solid thereafter. About this time Italy went into permanent CD and still survived. Amazing.

The most exciting play for me was in the North. In 1905, I failed to clear St. Pete for the building of the fleet I needed, and that cost me time. Nevertheless, my attack in 1906 would have netted the North Sea except for a dumb-ass mistake. I forgot to write down the retreat order to Norway that I had vacated for that very purpose! So, I failed to get the North Sea and Jim restabilized the position. Opportunity gone; dumb...

Fortunately, the door was still open in the South for the win, so I took it. It wasn't the best game I've ever played by any means, but I guess they all count. I hope to meet all of you across the board again soon.

## The Bulletin Board

Frobozz welcomes two new traders, Jim Bumpas and Howard Christie. Jim is the publisher of Liberterrean, one of the hobby's oldest zines. Jim's zine features regular Diplomacy and a number of other multi-player games. I'm not sure what game openings are currently available, though he does mention two openings in a PBEM (play by electronic mail) game.
