
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Puzzle Challenge

Endgame statement

Jim Lawniczak (France): This was a game of shifting alliances and dropouts, as a look at the supply center chart will show. I started with an attack on Italy and nonaggression agreements with both England and Germany. The attack on Italy was a success when the original Italian dropped in 1902 and the standby never really came to grips with the attack. By 1903, it seemed I was committed to the F/G alliance against England. But, Russ Rusnak put up a great defense (I may not agree with Russ' style of play, but I can't deny that he is an effective player). Despite the F/G attack and with no allies, England was growing. Then Germany suggested a series of moves that would leave Belgium and Holland open to England. I thought that was crazy and told him so, but he insisted. To be honest, I didn't believe he would really make those moves, but even if he did (and he really did!) I had no intent to allow England to grow to 7 as we attacked him. Thus, I supported England into Holland.

The next phase of the game began with the E/F alliance, which was capable of sweeping the board. However, Rusnak stabbed prematurely, with no chance to win, and I was forced to turn back to stop him. That left the board clear for Austria, who had been biding his time. Austria played well, left me enough units to stop England and then took my centers after England was stopped. I really think his mistake was in taking those centers a bit too soon, as I was committed to the attack on England and might have left even more room for him if given a few game years more.

The game ended in a draw once England and I decided to take the draw rather than let Austria win.
