1984AT Endgame Statement

Pete Kurucz (Italy): The conflict started out very well-defined in the southeast and remained so throughout the game. Russia and Turkey launched a well-coordinated attack on Austria (Rusnak) at the very beginning and then invited me to join in with a generous offer of Trieste. It became clear to me that if I went along with that deal, they would have so much momentum in sweeping through Austria that it wouldn't be too difficult to choose the next victim. So I threw my lot with Austria, and we managed to turn the tide back, however slowly. This worried me in that we were so locked into the battle with R/T that a strong western country could have given us a lot of trouble.

My early policy of staying out of western affairs went by the wayside as France was crumbling from the blows of England and Germany. It looked like whoever was to come out on top in the west was going to be in contention for a win. As Germany (Riley) was getting more and more successful against England and France, I tried to convince E and F to end their feuding and face Germany together, but to no avail. Fortunately, I was on good speaking terms with the German (until about 1906) and was able to maneuver around the unappetizing issue of stabbing Austria, while Rusnak and I slowly built up a stalemate line that made a draw appear to be forced. I was amazed yet thankful that Riley didn't go for the win. Apparently, it would have been much more trouble than it would have been worth to fight both I and A. Thanks go to the guys who stuck it out to the bitter end and made this a real challenge, and to Jeff who, as usual, did an outstanding job running the game.

Thanks for the kind words, Pete. It's a pleasure serving players like you. I've been GMing games for you for about four years, and you've never missed a move or forced me to call you. If only all players were so reliable...



Last month's bridge puzzle was an actual deal, played in the finals of the 1983 Bermuda Bowl, the world championship of bridge. It was Italy versus the United States; the auctions were very different at the two tables, due to the differences between the Italian and American bidding systems. Nevertheless, the contract was the same at both tables, four spades by South. The defense was also the same at both tables. West led the club king, which East overtook to return his singleton heart. In the Closed Room, Becker, the U.S. declarer, played the ten of hearts at trick two. Mosca played the jack to force out dummy's king. continued with two rounds of trump but could not afford a third, for this would remove the last entry to dummy's diamond queen. Instead, he led a diamond. Mosca won the ace and gave his partner a heart ruff. The defense quickly followed with a club trick. Down one. In the Open Room, Belladonna won trick two in his hand with the ace. But for some reason, he drew only one round of trump before playing diamonds. Wolff grabbed the ace, gave Hamman a heart ruff, regained the lead in clubs, and gave another ruff. Down two. Incredibly, both experts missed a straightforward line to guarantee the contract. All South need do is win East's heart lead in hand with the ace, and draw three rounds of trump before leading the diamond king. East has no more trumps with which to ruff hearts, and dummy still has the king of hearts as an entry to the good diamond queen. So, there is no way for the defense to prevent South from winning seven spade tricks, two hearts and a diamond.
