West leads two top hearts against South's four spade contract. If South carelessly ruffs and draws trump, he will find himself in trouble when spades split 4-1. By drawing trump, he exhausts his own trumps, so when the defenders get in with the club ace, they will be able to cash enough heart tricks to defeat the contract.

South may be able to survive the 4-1 trump split by switching to clubs before all the trumps are drawn. South draws only two rounds of trumps, discovering the bad split when East shows out. South then proceeds to knock out the club ace. If the defense continues hearts when they get in, South can ruff in dummy, return to his hand with the diamond king, and finally draw the remaining trumps. The club suit now provides enough winners to fulfill the contract. The trouble with this line is that it opens up the possibility of a defensive club ruff. East will duck the first round of clubs, win the second, and lead a third for his partner to ruff. Since South must still lose a diamond trick, he will end up down one.

South's best chance is to allow West to win the second trick, discarding his diamond loser instead of ruffing. This costs nothing, since the diamond had to be lost in any event. Now West cannot profitably continue hearts, for dummy is able to ruff. Nor can West obtain a club ruff, for South can now afford to draw four rounds of trump as soon as he gains the lead.

The recommended line of play could fail if it turns out that clubs, not spades, were 4-1. This is less likely than a 4-1 spade split, though, because West might have led a singleton club if he had one. Indeed, by continuing hearts, West has already given declarer a chance to make an unmakable contract, assuming that clubs were 4-1.
