Kirk to Paris: How's the weather over there? I'm glad we've such good relations so early on! I'm sure we could go far some day!



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This is your new puzzle:



The four circles above right intersect each other to form eleven sections. Put every integer from 1 to 11 in the diagram, one number per section, so that the sum of the numbers in each circle is equal to the sum of the numbers in every other circle. The numbers 8 and 11 have been entered already; do not use them again. Deadline for solutions is March 7, 1986. This is a pretty tough puzzle. If you need help, hints are available.
