Aside from that, there are few restrictions. You may create characters and place them in the game setting, or just write general comments if you prefer. I do reserve the right to edit press which is excessively long or in bad taste. And keep in mind that only white press is allowed (the identity of the author of the press must be obvious). On another matter, Frobozz is composed on a computer and printed on a Xerox 9700 laser printer. Since most people don't have access to a printer like this, I'm afraid this information won't be of much help to would-be publishers.
