Here is the solution to last issue's problem. West, your partner, led a club against the four heart contract. You won and tried to cash another club, but South ruffed. South then cashed the diamond ace and ruffed a diamond, partner following with the queen and nine to show a holding of queen-jack-ten-nine.

You should have a pretty good picture of the distribution by now. The play marks South with ace-king-seventh of diamonds and a stiff club. And the bidding marks him with ace-king-fourth of hearts. If his last card is also a heart, you cannot defeat the contract. You must hope it is a spade, so the cards will be distributed as shown in the diagram.


Now that you've figured out the distribution, how should you defend? If you refuse to overruff the diamond, South can make his contract. He'll return to his hand with a trump honor and ruff another diamond to establish them. This time it will not matter whether or not you overruff. South will sooner or later get back on lead with his other trump honor to run diamonds. All you will get is a trump trick and the black aces.

To defeat this contract, you must attack declarer's trump holding immediately. You should overruff the diamond, cash the spade ace, and lead another club. At this point, these cards remain:

South needs the rest of the tricks. To get them, he will have to ruff another diamond to set up that suit. But he will first have to draw your trumps, for he cannot allow you to overruff again. So, when you lead a club at trick six, South might ruff in hand, draw trump, and ruff a diamond in dummy. But he will then find he is in the wrong hand with no way back to his good diamonds. He'll have to lead spades from dummy, ending up down two at least. It won't help South much to ruff your club lead in dummy. Now when he draws trump, dummy's trump will also be exhausted, leaving him with a diamond loser.



The Scoreboard
