The Scoreboard

Last month's puzzle turned out to be particularly difficult for the solvers, and even more difficult for the scorer! Almost everyone made some sort of mistake. One solver obviously didn't understand the rules. There were two cases of letters being incorrectly copied from the Letter Pool. And there were several scoring errors. Ironically, the only solver to protect against this by submitting three solutions, made no mistakes at all! This was Jim Lawniczak, who gets credit for his best solution, scoring 463 points. Other solvers (all of who scored lower than they thought) earned points as follows: Pete Kurucz - 309, John Ricotta - 230, Bruce Linsey - 206, Melinda Holley - 92. You may be interested to know that it was possible to score over 1200 points on this puzzle. It's an obscure solution, and I'm not surprised that no one found it. I won't go into detail about it, but for the curious, the eighth play is "D 1-15 EXTEMPORIZATION". That should give you a pretty good idea how it's done.
