
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Puzzle Challenge

Last month's puzzle was to form as many seven-letter words as possible using only letters from the phrase "diplomatic pouch". The largest list I can compile (using solvers' answers and my own) consists of 42 words, only 17 of which I would consider to be common:

The following words were disallowed: "matchup" and "paludic", which I could not find in any of my dictionaries. The words "tapioca", "topcoat", and "caloric" were also disallowed because they cannot be formed using only the letters in the given phrase.



This month's puzzle is less difficult, I think. It is also one of those all-or-nothing puzzles — either you figure it out or you don't. Put an integer from 1 to 7 (inclusive) in each of the hexagons to the left. This must be done in such a way that the same number does not appear in any two adjacent hexagons. Further, the same number must not appear in any two hexagons which are both adjacent to a third hexagon. Note that some of the hexagons have already been filled in. Deadline for solutions to this puzzle is Friday, May 8, 1987.
