Daryl Rothchild (Turkey): Scott and I made a firm alliance. Unfortunately, it took time to build up trust, and by that time, Mike and Mike were rolling. I still believe that if Dale had allied with Turkey/Russia, we could have swung the game in our favor. Mike and Mike, you guys played well. Scott, thanks for the game-long alliance. Nice job, Jeff, I hate to see you quit.
