The time has come. We're going to have a little discussion on press writing. I like to see players submit press, as it adds interest to what would otherwise be a dull zine. However, there are a couple of kinds of press I can gladly do without. One kind is press which is in bad taste. A couple of months ago, a player submitted an item which contained graphic descriptions of extreme violence. This item was so bad that I decided to do something unprecedented in my five years of GMing experience. I refused to print the press release. This has not been a problem since, and I'm hopeful that this problem will not recur.

There is another kind of press that I'm not too thrilled with. This is the kind where the press "writer" finds some other author and quotes him verbatim. This sort of press is uncreative, boring, and has nothing whatever to do with Diplomacy. Now, my objections to press of this sort are actually not too strong. I've been putting up with Russ MacKechnie's T.S. Eliot press for many months now, and I would continue to do so but for one thing. A couple of you have decided to imitate Russ's style, giving me visions of a *Frobozz* of the future containing nothing but quotes of T.S. Eliot, Woody Allen, Michael Jackson, Spiro Agnew, etc., etc. So, last month I decided it was time to take some action in the matter. I wrote Russ and asked him to quit submitting Eliot press. I was hoping that without Russ's bad influence, the rest of you would go back to writing normal press. Unfortunately, I did not take the time to explain to Russ exactly why I want Eliot gone, so now it seems that he is somewhat upset by my action (see Russ's press in Jack of Diamonds). I certainly do not want any hard feelings as a result of this, which is why I'm taking so much space here.

Now that I've considered the matter further, I've decided that it should really be left up to you, the readers. If you like the kind of press I've been discussing, then I'm doing a disservice by attempting to get rid of it. Maybe you don't care, and I'm wasting my time. Or perhaps you agree with me. I would like to hear from all of you. Should *Frobozz* adopt formal guidelines for press writing? If so, what should they be? If not, should players be expected to police their own press? Or should we simply allow anything at all? Please tell me your opinion.

The house rules require me to grant a separation if half of the players (two in this case) request it. In addition, if any player asks for a separation, I may grant it if I feel the situation is too complex for the player to write conditional orders.

Last turn, Austria anticipated that he might want a separation and asked for one. Since it turned out that the only changes he would have to worry about were French removals, and only two French units neighbor the Austrian units, the situation did not seem too complex. Thus, I did not grant the separation. No problem so far, right? But something I didn't expect happened this turn. Austria withdrew his request for a separation, and England meanwhile requested one. I had to look at the board once again, and I determined that England's position, unlike Austria's, was a complex one. Nearly all of the French units border on the English forces, which would make it very difficult for Rusnak to write conditional orders. Thus, I decided to grant the separation after all. I'm confident that I'm doing the right thing, but it bothers me...
