PARIS SHOCKED! de LAMPALLE CASE THROWN OUT OF COURT! COMMISSIONER OF PUBLIC SAFETY LOSES POSITION!

In a surprise move, the case against Mssr. Joffrey de Lampalle was dismissed today despite overwhelming

testimony by some of the most illustrious members of Parisienne society. At a special press conference this afternoon, the Commissioner of Public Safety announced his resignation(rumored to have been requested by the King), saying that he could not in good conscience continue in office when the likes of such criminals as tried here today are set free without the least punishment. - IN EUROPE

Professor O'Foran, claiming that no one's guesses as to the number of grains of sand in his large jar was even close, has reopened the contest. - IN AFRICA:

McBuns escapes alone without any food or weapons.

ORTE'GO DE DAGO, unable to advance through the jungle-swamp, decides to retreat back down the river, hexes 285->261->260, which is a lake hex. He attempts to explore hex 259, which is a veldt hex, with a river source flowing over a 180 ft. cataract into the lake(hex 260). His hunters each obtain 1 ration, which saves his expedition from total starvation. He is able to feed all the men, except 3 bearers, who all manage to avoid becoming sick. Dago finds his expedition surrounded by 48 warriors of the Bassanga, while he is looking for neat things. He approaches the chief in an open and friendly manner. The chief is impressed by this act of courage and does not kill Dago. Dago may study and trade with the Bassanga tribe next turn. Guides hire on for 3 gifts, Askaris for 4 gifts and bearers for 3 gifts. He can trade for rations at the rate of one gift per ration. Canoes sell for 4 gifts each.

The Right Reverend TWOMBLY decides that marching across the continent may not be as easy as he first thought and stops to reconsider such an epic journey. He convinces his guide that the stars favor such a journey and they will continue next turn. His hunting provides the expedition with 2 rations.
