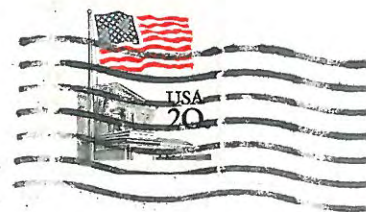

NOTES FROM THE JOURNAL OF THE ROYAL ZOOLOGICAL SOCIETY - Edited by LOU HARRISON BURKE, Spring, 1827

- IN EUROPE

MADemoiselle ROXY LARUE finds that Paris police officials mean business, when they decide curtail Roxy's efforts to raise money for her African expeditions. Police have decided to no longer publish the weekly list of men arrested visiting Roxy's establishments. This decision seems have slowed down Roxy's business. She was only able to raise \$100 this turn.

- IN AFRICA

PROF. O'FORAN pushes on due west (dir 5) across what he hopes is desert. He goes from hex 72 into hex 71, which he finds is a mountain hex with peaks of 11,800 ft. He does not find a river source or natives so he decides to move on west into hex 70, which he finds is jungle, which cannot enter with his camels. He therefore must retreat to hex 71 to decide what to do. He shoots camels for food and water, he more than likely will continue on foot with the camels as pack animals, avoiding the jungle at all costs, due to prior experiences.

DOCTOR HYPO GUY CEMIA moves on into the desert, consuming Bon-Bons at an ever increasing rate to prevent them from melting in the desert heat. The good doctor moves on into hex 124, which is a desert hex. Finding no oasis, he move on, in a seemingly desperate or risky manuver, into hex 123, which is also desert. The good doctor does discover an oasis in this hex, saving the expedition from disaster. His Hunters do not shoot any game. The desert may prove to be too much for the good doctor's Bon-Bons.

ORTE'GO DE DAGO, believing that he has discovered the extension of the Ogove River, decides to go up the river. In moving up river (dir 1) into hex 235, he discovers jungle with the river continuing in dir 1 into hex 213. Dago does not discover any neat things so he moves on into hex 213 which is also jungle. The river turns in direction 2 into hex 214. hex 214 yields nothing in the way of neat things, therefore he decides to move on next turn. His hunters each provide the expedition with 3 rations.

THE RIGHT REVEREND TWOMBLY moves west, following the stars. He moves from hex 521 to hex 520, which is swamp. He marches through the swamp, now determined more than ever to make it across Africa to present theological evidence that he has discovered the source of the Nile. Twombly continues west in the spirit of epic adventure.

ALFRED H. MCGUFFIN arrives at Kilwa and hires 17 Askaris. McGuffin heads into the veldt. McGuffin says "No more Mr. Nice Guy". Headlined out of Kilwa, byline McGuffin, as seen in the London Times, McGuffin also reported that the hunting was easy in the veldt. "You just line the Askaris up and march through and shoot anything that moves." This technique provided him with 3 rations per hunter on the first attempt. He can not figure out why one of the Askaris will not line up with the rest and never seems to be doing what he is supposed to be doing.
