NOTES FROM THE JOURNAL OF THE ROYAL ZOOLOGICAL SOCIETY - Edited by LORD HARRISON BURKE, Spring, 1828.

- IN EUROPE

Growing bored of Paris, M. ROXY LaRUE puts on an all out effort to raise money to finance another expedition to Africa to look for interesting specimens. Her effort gains her \$200 in donations this turn. This puts her a little closer to returning to Africa.

PROFESSOR HUMBERT HUMBERT, learning that Laurence Margues is a Portuguese port and closed to all but portuguese explorers, takes an extended holiday in Lisbon. He spends several hours in discussion with a Portuguese governmental official in an attempt to become naturalized as a Portuguese citizen. This request is denied because of some minor indiscretion in his past. The professor receives no donations this turn.

- IN AFRICA

PROFESSOR O'FORAN, having studied the Fulah, pushes on. He does get a good laugh out of the native boy who tried to sell him a camel. O'Foran is well aware that camels are only found with desert tribes. He moves into hex 95, which is a desert hex, with an oasis. He now turns in direction four into hex 120, which is a mountain hex with peaks of 10,500 ft. He encounters Doctor Hypo Guy Cemia, negotiating with 16 warriors of the Ania tribe.

DOCTOR HYPO GUY CEMIA, refreshed by his bath in the oasis, heads west into hex 120, which is a mountain with the highest peak being 10,500 ft. While heading for the mountains, 4 Askaris succumb to sunstroke in the desert and the good doctor is unable to save any of them. The good doctor is able to only take one of four camels ridden by the Askaris. The other camels are shot and provide the rest of the party with a feast. Things get a little better for the good doctor in the mountains as he encounters 16 warriors of the Ania Tribe. The chief approaches the

good doctor in a bold warlike manner, but the good doctor offers him some sugar and he calms down. Suddenly, Professor O'Foran shows up! Both Cemia and O'Foran are treated in a friendly manner by the natives. They discover that bearers hire on for 4 gifts, as do askaris and that guides only want 2 gifts to hire on. One gift will buy 5 rations from this tribe. The good doctor may negotiate with the tribe, or anyone else who may appear, next time.

ORTE'GO DE DAGO did manage to pack his entire expedition in a single canoe without dismissing anyone. His single canoe moves farther up what he believes to be the Ogoue river. He follows the river into hex 140 which is a jungle hex. He finds nothing of interest and moves on. Following the river in direction 4, into hex 165, which is a mist covered lake, he attempts to cross the lake. Getting part way across he discovers and island with what appear to be an ancient Greek city on it. He is greeted by 34 warriors wearing bronze armor and carrying bronze weapons. He approaches the city in a friendly manner, hoping to communicate in classical Greek. He is led before the warrior-king, Anthonis, and received as a guest of the city. Told that he must remain here for the rest of his life, he attempts to escape but is caught and thrown into prison. All membes of his expedition are killed. He may attempt to escape next time or challenge the high priest ina duel of magic and faith.

THE RIGHT REVEREND TWOMBLY decides that the stars are right to head west. The fact that both the chief and the witch doctor of the Wadahalo tribe both tried to kill him has little to do with his departure. Before leaving, he buys a canoe for 3 gifts and 33 rations with 11 gifts. He moves due west into hex 534, which is a jungle hex with a river flowing out of the hex in direction 3, into hex 550. The reverend must now decide whether to follow the river or head west. He spends a sleepless night studying the stars to find out what to do.

We have finally reached the mountains. Nothing suspicious so far, other than one of my askari dragging a crudely carved tree, which vaguely resembles a coffin. If he would only speak, I might get a good story on bizarre native rituals. - McGUFFIN

GUIDO VITTORIO SCONZINESE still believing that a river source lays inland, heads due west into hex 298. He discovers that hex 298 is a desert hex with a river flowing into direction 6 into hex 274. The river enters the hex from direction 3. Buried in the sand, he finds a canteen with the name "Bonebury" on it. While attempting to put his canoes into the river, he spots 6 scouts from a slaver's party. He attacks the scouts and kills them. He now sets upon the main party of slavers heading inland. The party consists of 10 slavers. He attacks the main party but in a bloody battle, he is defeated. Guido does manage to escape without food and without weapons.
