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 THE FOLLOWING LETTER WAS RECEIVED; READER RESPONSE IS ENCOURAGED;

"...Also, I would like to express my displeasure with the manner in which you handle postal diplomacy. I learned about your publication from the listings that Rod Walkers maintains, but I have noticed that you do not really publish a postal gaming 'zine, but actually an informal newsletter for your club. That is fine, but why advertise for subscribers that are not part of this club?

Second, you have made many errors in reporting each game, and as a GM myself, I find the number of mistakes made by you unacceptable. It has been my fortune that the errors that have been made have not had much effect on my position or that I have been alert enough to catch the errors that are obvious and adjust my orders accordingly.

In conclusion, I must point out why I decided to voice my opinion at this point in time. When I first became disturbed by the practices discussed above, I decided to finish this game and forget about the Connecticut Gamer's 'Zine. But I have become more involved with this hobby, and I feel a responsibility to it. If a newcomer were to receive a sample of your publication, he would be tempted to subscribe because you have a nice format, and on the surface it would seem that you run an orderly game. He would then be left with a bad experience as mistakes are made with his game, the other players don't write (as they obviously see each other on a regular basis), and he is generally alienated. Unfortunately, he might very well quit the hobby, unaware that he could have signed up with many of the other publications available and have a good, fun game. I write you now as I support this hobby. I do not condemn you for what you are doing, but I suggest that you do not misrepresent this hobby by listing nationally for players. Try to make less mistakes and for goodness sake, don't announce temporary standbys by last name only - give us not clubbers a chance by publishing an address with a last name. Oh, and why don't you consider the use of standbys - we all know that anybody can beat a country that doesn't order any moves."

### Le Gossipe Parisienne

The King has formally expressed complete confidence in his government and has extended the term of office for each of his ministers by six months.

**DUBOIS CONVICTED:** The trial of M. Dubois was held at the beginning of the season and after very little testimony Count Van Rijn pronounced Dubois guilty and decreed that all of his property was forfeit including his horses and his clothes. M. Dubois was forced to return to his regiment afoot and in his underwear, a shameful situation for a member of a dragoon regiment. Count Van Rijn's remarks read in part "...a base character such as yourself, with a history of poltroonery, is a millstone around the neck of the glorious Grand Duke Maxamillion Dragoons Regiment. No doubt many a junior officer would make a far more admirable example of martial virtue to look up to than a traitor such as the likes of you. It would do everyone a favor if you died honorably on the field, but no one would be surprised if you got shot in the back. No doubt the foeman who did it would deserve our gratitude..." As the Count left the courtroom a rather large, overful pouch dropped from his belt and several double sovereigns scattered about the floor. The Count recovered the purse but neglected to retrieve the money which was quickly gathered up by the spectators in the room.

In the field the French Army and the Italian Army exchanged fortresses in fierce fighting during the season. The collapse of the Cavalry Division allowed the Italians to storm a key citidal along the border but the 1st Division, and most particularly the Gascon Regiment, drove the enemy from one of their heavily fortified positions. Unfortunately, despite an admirable showing by the Royal Foot Guards, the Guards Brigade, and as a result the first Division were crushed in a major assault and the Grande Armee finished the summer in a slightly worse position than they were in before the campaign.

Meanwhile, back in Paris, the former Commissioner of Public Safety, M. LeFleur was appointed Minister of Justice and received the title of Marquis. Other titles bestowed this season were Baron to M. deLampalle and Knight to Messrs. Petitpois and Jardin. Promotions this season included M. Lafayette to full Lt. General and Brevet General, Messrs. Bic and Dolokhov to Brevet Brigadier Generals and the ill clothed and dismounted Dubois to Colonel of the Grand 'Duke Max' Dragoons.

Don't forget that military appointments will be made at the beginning of the Fall season.

- IN EUROPE

M. ROXY LaRUE got a little closer to returning to Africa to look for interesting speciens by raising another \$200 this turn.

PROFESSOR HUMBERT HUMBERT returns to Geneva after an extended holiday in Lisbon. Humbert's claims that the minor indiscretion in his past was with the wife of the petty Portuguese governmental official, who refused his Portuguese citizenship. Humbert raised \$100 this turn by giving a lecture on the "rock strata of central Africa" at "der Blaue Angel".

- IN AFRICA

PROFESSOR O'FORAN hires another guide from the Ania tribe. He gives the chief his other 10 gifts to remain and studies the tribe this turn. The good professor feels that it is safe to mingle with the village women with the presence of Doctor Hypo Guy Cemia to treat him, if he were to get sick.

DOCTOR HYPO GUY CEMIA offers the chief of the Ania tribe 16 gifts to gain the right to treat the natives of the Ania tribe. The good doctor successfully treats minor cases, receiving 1 VP, but both the chief and the witch doctor both attempt to poison him. The good doctor survives both attempts. The good doctor seems to avoid professor O'Foran, but does throw a bon-bon or two the professor's way.

ORTE'GO DE DAGO decides that the only way to deal with the high priest is to challenge him to a duel of magic and faith. Using gunpowder, a magnet and magnifying lens, Dago challenges the high priest. It seems that the old priest must have some hypnotic powers and the duel ends in a draw with Dago thrown back in prison. He must attempt to escape next turn.
