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DIPLOMACY GAME 5 IS NOW OPEN. INDIVIDUALS INTERESTED IN SIGNING UP FOR THIS GAME MAY DO SO BY REMITTING THE \$8 FEE, plus Subscription fee(as desired) TO: THE GAMEMASTER, 27 MARK STREET, MILFORD, CT., 06460. SIX PLAYERS HAVE SIGNED UP FOR THIS GAME SO FAR.

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DIPLOMACY GAME 6 WILL BE OPENED AND RESERVED FOR NGAP(NORTHEAST GAMING ASSOCIATION PLAYOFF CLUBS. THIS WILL BE AN INTERCLUB EVENT DESIGNED TO STIMULATE AND DEVELOP MORE INTERCLUB GAMING. SPECIAL RULES WILL APPLY. THIS GAME, UNLIKE OTHER PBM GAMES RUN IN THIS ZINE WILL HAVE A MONTHLY TURN, NOT A TWICE A MONTH TURN TO PERMIT CLUB MEETINGS TO BE USED TO DETERMINE THE MOVES TO BE SUBMITTED. EACH CLUB MUST DESIGNATE ONE CORRESPONDING SECRETARY TO SUBMIT MOVES ON BEHALF OF THE CLUB. ONLY THAT PERSON MAY SUBMIT MOVES, BUT MULTIPLE SIGNATURES OF CLUB OFFICERS IS ENCOURAGED TO AUTHENTICATE THE MOVES. EACH CLUB IS ENCOURAGE TO DESIGNATE ONE DIPLOMAT TO CORRESPOND WITH EACH OTHER CLUB, FOR EXAMPLE, IF A CLUB IS PLAYING RUSSIA, SIX PERSONS SHOULD BE APPOINTED AS DIPLOMATS, ONE TO ENGLAND, ONE TO TURKEY, ONE TO GERMANY, ONE TO AUSTRIA-HUNGARY, ONE TO FRANCE AND ONE TO ITALY. ALL MANNER OF INTRIGUE IS ENCOURAGED AS WELL AS FACE-TO-FACE MEETINGS BETWEEN DIPLOMATS AND EVEN ENTIRE ENVOYS (WITH OTHER PTF GAMES BEING PLAYED DURING THE NEGOTIATIONS NO DOUBT - WHY WASTE A GOOD MEETING?)

IN ALL OTHER RESPECTS; THE GAME WILL BE RUN THE SAME AS ANY OTHER PBM DIPLOMACY GAME WITH RESULTS PUBLISHED MONTHLY IN THE GAMER'S 'ZINE.

THE FEE FOR THE GAME IS \$8 PER CLUB. ALSO, AT LEAST ONE MEMBER OF THE CLUB SHOULD SUBSCRIBE TO THE ZINE(SEE THE RATES ON PAGE ONE), BUT MULTIPLE SUBSCRIPTIONS ARE ENCOURAGED - EACH DIPLOMAT MAY WANT HIS OWN COPY:

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REFUND POLICY - THE GAMER'S 'ZINE will refund the prorata unused portion of any subscription upon request. If you are dissatisfied for any reason, or if you find that a subscription is not in your best interest, you may discontinue your subscription and receive a refund for the asking. A

written request is required, a postcard will do. Note that refunds apply to subscriptions only. Games fees are not refundable.

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THE GAMEMASTER RESPONDS: Last issue, a letter was published which contained several points:  
1) THE GAMERS ZINE IS NOT A POSTAL GAMING ZINE, BUT AN INFORMAL NEWSLETTER FOR THE CONNECTICUT GAME CLUB.

2) MANY ERRORS HAVE BEEN MADE IN REPORTING EACH GAME

3) NEWCOMERS TO THE HOBBY, SAMPLING THE ZINE AND SEEING A NICE FORMAT, MAY SUBSCRIBE, ONLY TO BE DISAPPOINTED AND TURNED OFF TO THE HOBBY

4) NEWCOMERS COULD SUBSCRIBE TO OTHER ZINES AND HAVE A GOOD FUN GAME (INFERENTIALLY, THE GAMES IN THIS ZINE ARE NOT)

5) THIS ZINE IS MISREPRESENTING THE HOBBY BY LISTING NATIONALLY FOR PLAYERS, AND SHOULD DISCONTINUE DOING SO.

6) THIS ZINE SHOULD CONSIDER THE USE OF STANDBYS (ANYBODY CAN BEAT A COUNTRY THAT DOESN'T ORDER ANY MOVES)

1) THE GAMER'S 'ZINE IS A PLAY-BY-MAIL HOBBY ZINE, WHICH ENCOURAGES ALL PLAY-BY-MAIL GAMING, OF WHICH DIPLOMACY IS JUST ONE SUCH GAME. THIS IS A RELATIVELY NEW ZINE, STARTED BY THE CONNECTICUT GAME CLUB, BUT NOT NOW SUPPORTED BY THE CLUB. IT IS NOT INTENDED TO BE A CLUB NEWSLETTER. THE CONNECTICUT GAME CLUB IS A SUBSIDIARY OF THE AWA (AMERICAN WARGAMERS ASSOCIATION, AND, AS SUCH, PUBLISHES ITS NEWS IN "THE AMERICAN WARGAMER", THE AWA'S MONTHLY NEWSLETTER.

2) I AGREE. MANY, FAR TOO MANY ERRORS HAVE OCCURED IN THE REPORTING OF THE GAMES. TO THIS END, I CAN ONLY DO SO MUCH, BUT ADDITIONAL PROCEDURE WILL BE DEVELOPED TO FIND WAYS TO REDUCE ERRORS TO THE EXTEND POSSIBLE. SINCE I AM NOT PARTICULARLY ADEPT AT LOCATING MY OWN ERRORS, AND SINCE I DO NOT HAVE THE LUXURY OF ADDITIONAL TIME TO HAVE SOMEONE ELSE PROOFREAD MY MATERIAL, I WILL JUST HAVE TO FIND NEW WAYS TO REDUCE THIS INEVITABLE MALADY OF HUMAN NATURE.

3) THAT IS AN OPINION, WITH WHICH I DO NOT HAPPEN TO AGREE. HOWEVER, I HAVE NOT HAD ANY OTHER READER RESPONSE TO SUPPORT OR REFUTE SUCH AN OPINION.

4) THE GAMEMASTER REGRETS THAT THE WRITER FEELS UNHAPPY REGARDING HIS EXPERIENCES WITH HIS GAME.

5) THE GAMERS ZINE EMPHATICALLY DENIES ANY ATTEMPT TO MISREPRESENT ITSELF IN ANY FASHION, OR TO MISREPRESENT THE HOBBY. THE GAMERS ZINE IS A PART OF THE HOBBY, AS SUCH ITS EXISTENCE HELPS TO DEFINE THE HOBBY! DESPITE THE ARROGANT AND SELF-RIGHTEOUS NATURE OF THIS STATEMENT (I WOULD HAVE EXPECTED A MORE DIPLOMATIC TONE FROM A DIPLOMACY PLAYER), THE GAMERS ZINE WILL ACCEPT IT AS A STATEMENT OF CONCERN THAT SOME PLAYERS MAY NOT UNDERSTAND THAT THE GAMES RUN WITHIN THE ZINE TEND TO BE 'LOCAL' IN NATURE. THE ZINE WILL DO TWO THINGS IN THIS REGARD, ONE, NEW PLAYERS WILL BE ADVISED OF THE NATURE OF ANY GAME, AND CERTAIN FUTURE GAMES WILL BE RESERVED FOR NATIONAL GAMES IN WHICH NO MORE THAN TWO PLAYERS FROM ANY ONE AREA-CODE WILL BE PERMITTED TO PARTICIPATE

6) IN THE FIRST SEVERAL GAMES, THE USE OF STANDBYS WAS REJECTED BECAUSE THE GAMES WERE DELIBERATELY 'LOCAL', WHEN THE MOVE WAS MADE TO OPEN THE GAMES TO NON-MEMBERS, THIS POLICY WAS CARRIED FORWARD. IN RETHINKING THIS POLICY, I HAVE REACHED THE CONCLUSION THAT FOR NON-LOCAL GAMES, THE USE OF STANDBYS IS JUSTIFIED. IN FUTURE GAMES, THE GAMER'S 'ZINE WILL USE STANDBYS.

IN CONCLUSION, THE WRITER HAS SEVERAL VALID POINTS WHICH THE GAMERS ZINE WILL ATTEMPT TO RESPOND TO IN A POSITIVE MANNER. THE GAMERS ZINE THANKS THE WRITER FOR TAKING THE TIME AND ENERGY TO WRITE HIS OPINION. IT SHOWS THAT HE CARES ENOUGH TO DO SO.

- IN EUROPE

A local Paris police official gave M. ROXY LaRUE \$100 this turn and told her that this should be enough to go to Africa. "We would rather see you gathering interesting specimens in Aftica than picking up specimens in the streets of Paris" she was told.

CORNELLIUS COX, the famous rowing personality, was hired by the Viana-do-Castelo Church of Astrology's Barge Club to introduce the civilized sport of rowing to Africa. He will preach rowing techniques to the natives and plans to recruit the fastest crew in Africa. Dr. Cox has a PhD in Physical Education and will challenge any explorer or native tribe to a canoe race and will wager gifts, rations or just personal fame for the winner.

- IN AFRICA

Bemoaning the lack of adequate interest in rock strata found among the habitues of "Der Blaue Angel"(even the after dinner discussion of tropical nymphets didn't hold their attention!), Prof. HUMBERT buys a ticket to Kilwa. Rumor has it that he plans to walk across Africa.

It seems that DOCTOR HYPO GUY CEMIA and PROFESSOR O'FORAN are both heading in direction 5 into hex 119, after leaving the Ania tribe. They travel independently, but keep an eye on each other. Hex 119 is more desert. They acknowledge the presence of each other at the oasis where both stop for water. Finding nothing of interest, each explorer moves West into hex 118, which is a Lake hex. Finding no natives, they both must retreat to hex 119. Doctor Cemia's hunters fail to obtain rations this turn. The silence between Cemia and O'Foran even chills the desert air.

A very strange story is being told about ORTE'GO DE DAGO and the discovery of a lost civilization. Rumors abound of a crazed explorer, carrying a musket, wandering down the Ogoue River moving from hex 140 to 166 this turn.

ALFRED H. MCGUFFIN, finding that mountains are not as dangerous as he was told, decides to remain in hex 414 for another turn. Finding game plentiful, he manages to keep his expedition fed.

GUIDO VITTORIO SCONZINESE continues to wander down the river he discovered. He heads into hex 275, which is a mountain hex. He manages to climb up the 19,000 ft. peak. While standing at the base of a 180 ft. cataract, he manages to avoid the scout of a slaving party heading inland. He does not hunt this turn to make sure he is not discovered. He thinks about following the river in direction 6, into hex 251, next turn.
