This variant is basically a seven player, world conflict game using DIPLOMACYTM type rules for conflict resolution, but taking place beginning in Spring 2101. Two additional units are included - planes, and "nukes". The powers include AUS(Commonwealth of Australia), BRA(United States of Brazil), CHI(People's Republic of China), PAL(Pan-Arab League), RUS(Soviet Union), SAF(South Africa), and USA(United States of America)

LaFLEUR ACQUITTED...MEDIocre RESULTS FOR ARMY...POOR MAN'S PARTY DOMINANT...BEZUKHOV BECOMES CHANCELLOR OF EXCHEQUER(GP): After an impassioned speech before the court the notorious "Lucrece" LaFleur left her fate in the hands of "Lady Justice". The Minister of Justice, wiping a tear from his eye and stuffing a rather large envelope in his pocket pronounced the accused innocent saying "how could such a delicate flower have committed the terrible crime of which she is accused?". LaFleur immediately announced that she would turn her entire fortune over to the state treasury and retire to her father's estate in the suburbs. As she left she was seen to have slipped something into the hand of General Lafayette as she gave him a rather passionate kiss, presumably for having testified in her behalf at the trial. Unfortunately that kiss came back to haunt the General the following month when his mistress, Mlle. Katherine threw him out shouting, "You get kisses from that hussy but you never have time for me, only for that blasted sword!". The Marquis did manage to convince her that his heart was indeed true and was reinstated in her affection but she was reported to have told him, "If I don't see you at least twice a month you will find my heart closed to you forever."

Baron Bezukhov seems to have had an exceptional summer, winning not one but two mistresses, each from a member of the Dragoon Guards who were forced to follow their regiment on campaign to which it had been volunteered by the colonel commanding the unit. Both Messrs. LeMoyné and Santini have received Dear Jean letters from their mistresses each mentioning Baron Bezukhov prominently. The Baron was also appointed Chancellor of the Exchequer when several prominent Parisians supported him for the office.

At the front the Army had some disappointing results but some of the local favorites did well. M. Bic was again promoted to Field Marshall and both M. LeMoyné and Fr. Santini received promotions. In a surprise move the outgoing Field Marshall, General Lafayette, appointed himself Army Commander, considering "no other candidates to be suitable for the honor". He also appointed a surprised Fr. Santini to be Aide to the Field Marshall for the coming year. M. LeMoyné was not so fortunate, being rejected in his quest to become Army Adjutant. The latter apparently had trouble sleeping this summer as he was rumored to have been haunted by the spirit of M. Frontenac which drifted about his tent moaning, "Where's my 5000 crowns?" In addition M. LeMoyné was knighted for his daring exploits. M. Poisson, who was severely wounded in the battle did receive mention in dispatches. A brilliant victory was achieved by newcomer Pierre St Robes of the Gascon Regiment who, after a rousing revolutionary speech to his men, proceeded to charge the enemy beheading several of them with his sword.

Newcomer in town Maurice Melchior Croque-Mitaine was caught attempting to liberate the LaFleur fortune early in the season and spent the entire summer in the Bastille awaiting his trial which has been set for the first week in September.

Etienne Gerard returned to Paris this season and spent most of his time practicing with his sabre. One would have thought he would have had enough of that having been on campaign for so long.

Frontenac's Last Letter to His Father: Cher Papa - Well LaFleur is back as Minister of State, His Majesty's government could not be in worse hands if my mistress were running it. The delightful Lucrece, by the by, is nowhere to be seen, and I have been reduced to swilling cognac at Bothwell's alone. My love to Mama and ask her to send her recipe for Lobster Frontenac. - Bo

LaFleur's Oration at her Trial - "Friends, Parisiennes, Countrymen, lend me your ears! I come to bury LaFleur not to praise him. The evil he has done will outlive him; the good may be interred with his bones. We know he had done evil - for Frontenac had said so, and Frontenac was an honorable man. So are you all, all honorable men. Could it have been anything but evil for a woman, a mere female, to make her way among you worldly men? And she had taken honors - had filled your offices and served your King - Oh evil indeed! The wounds she bore were testimony to her wickedness, but I forget, I have not come to praise her. You say she had done murder, and 'tis

true - what a villany - to kill a man who wished her dead, AND PLANNED HER DEATH - unpardonable! And so she does retire, creep away, truly - this is the heart of it - in the very shame of her sex! Disdaining now your honors, your glory and your society - her courage unwanted, her patriotism scorned, her character despised. But these she takes away with her; contempt for you whom she fooled, devotion for the King she loved."

...and the King wept.

In a very controversial move, Bishop Laud has been named Chancellor of Oxford University. The bishop allegedly plans a large-scale purge of Puritan faculty members. Non-conformist students rioted in protest, and the local militia had to be called out.

GUIDO VITTORIO SCONZINESE is reported to have arrived in Zanzibar. No reports as to the type of expedition he is raising have been received, but rumors have it that he is looking for bearers who are willing to be taught to walk on water.

LADY CAROLINE NELSON, flush from victory, pays no attention to Dago and moves down river. Following the river, she moves into hex 615, which is desert and then into 602 which is also desert hex. The river turns into hex 590. Hunters provide the expedition with one ration each.

ALFRED H. MCGUFFIN sits, under Capricorn, hoping to catch a thief before he move on. Thinking of the paradine case occupies his mind for the entire turn and he does not move.

DR. NOTS G. NIVIL decides it would be a good move in direction 4 into hex 360. He discovers that hex 360 is a mountain hex with the highest peak being 14,000 ft. Excited upon encountering 16 warriors of the Timmena tribe, a great chance to tell them about his discovery in Europe, he says the wrong thing and is attacked. In the brief battle, his bearer, saying, "what do you mean, 'we', white man?" turns on him also. Nivil escapes with his life and 9 rations.

DR. HYPO GUY CEMIA finally gets his act together. One more Askaris and one more bearer die, but two bearers recover and he moves on. He heads in direction 1, into hex 135, which he claims is desert like the rest of Africa. After sinking waist deep into this strange wet wasteland he decides to retreat back to hex 160. He knows that he will find desert soon, once he gets out of

these boundary lands. His hunters provides the expedition with 2 rations each.

ORTE'GO DE DAGO proceeds up the Cuene river into hex 616, which is a mountain hex with the highest peak being 11,200 ft. He must halt his expedition to negotiate with 15 warriors of the Basundi tribe. He also discovers a river source, which he concludes is the source of the Cuene. He must stay and study the tribe. His hunters do not provide any rations this turn.

ROBERT FROMAGE IV has not been heard from. There has been no report of his location this turn. He must be lost and presumed dead.

MADemoiselle ROXY LARUE picks up her beetle and heads up the Vaal into hex 577, which is a mountain hex, with peaks of 12,400. The river flows out of hex 576. She discovers nothing of interest. She provides herself with food this turn.

PROFESSOR HUMBERT HUMBERT, in a show of macho courage, returns to his cache, picks up a musket and heads back up the Rufigi river. He finishes his turn in hex 471, a veldt hex with the river flowing out of hex 470. He provides rations for himself and his companion.
